A MESSAGE FROM FR MARC





Fr. Marc Bishop - Pastor St. Agnes and St. Camillus

Dear Faith Family,

"Rooted in tradition.
Focused on the future."
These two simple sentences have become our slogan for our 150th Anniversary Year.
This year of celebrations reminds us of the hard work and dedication of our faith-

parents who built our churches, schools, and community center. Blessed with a tradition of generosity that inspires, we are called to action.

Action that not only maintains our buildings but action that grows our community. We want for our children and grandchildren what our parents and grandparents assured us; a community where we worship in safety and educate our children in the faith to have godly character.

I am inspired by the hard work of our school administrators who labor to provide a faith-filled environment for our young people. I am inspired by parents who sacrifice to send their children to our catholic school. I often say: "Our school deals with all the issues that other schools face, we just handle them differently." I am inspired by the numerous volunteers who quietly and confidentially serve the poor, both monetarily and spiritually. There are days that seem we cannot meet all the needs of those who present themselves to us. Each time God provides. He provides the expertise, skill, and/or treasure to meet those needs.


I am continually surprised by God and His generosity. Time and time again we are confronted by the needs of a family that are unable to provide for their child or children. It could be food, clothes, or tuition. When I have the courage to trust and take the chance, God never ceases to provide. When we see a need we are called to act. We are called to serve from

our own lack.

"Sometime ago a man (came) to our house and he said, 'Mother, there is a family, a Hindu family, that has eight children. They have not eaten for a long time. Do something for them.' So I took some rice and I went. When I arrived at their house I could see the hunger in the children's eyes. Their eyes were shining with hunger. I gave the rice to the mother, and she took the rice. She divided it into two, and then she went out. When she came back, I asked her, 'Where did you go?' She said, 'They are hungry also.' Next door neighbors, they were hungry. What struck me most, was not that she gave the rice but she knew they were hungry. And because she knew, she shared. And this is what we have to come to know... Love, to be true, has to hurt and this woman who was hungry - she knew that her neighbor was also hungry, and that family happened to be a Muslim family. So it was touching, so real." When we see a need let us act. Let us not be concerned that we cannot, on our own, fix the problem. We can offer the little we have and God will multiply it. Be the inspiration for the next generation. That is our tradition and the hope for our future.

The Corporal Works of Mercy Jesus asks for water from the Samaritan woman - St. Camillus

For this week's reflection, we have this beautiful stainedglass window- Jesus asks for water from the Samaritan Woman (Jn 4:5-42). Jesus sets out on a journey from

Jerusalem to his native town Galilee. On this journey, Jesus had to pass through Samaria where he encountered the Samaritan woman. John says it was about noon when this woman came to the well. She came alone may be because of her immoral life, and she had lived with five men. She might have thought that she was an outcast and did not want to mingle with others. Jesus was on a journey, and he was thirsty as well. And so, He asked for a cup of water to quench his thirst. Since Jews and the Samaritans would not get along in those days, the woman was afraid to give water to Jesus.

Despite his tiredness, Jesus builds the conversation with that woman and talks about thirst and the living water that God provides. At first, the woman was perplexed that Jesus was talking about ordinary water, and then she gradually understands that He was talking about more than the water in the well. Jesus reveals to her that He is the long-awaited Messiah whom they were looking for. As soon as she heard this, she left the bucket and hurried to the town and called his people to come and see Jesus. Then, Jesus stayed in Samaria for two days.

The woman was hostile and prejudiced at first but her encounter with Jesus transforms her life. When Jesus asked for a cup of water she refused to give and remain distant. At first, she thought that she was unwanted and unwelcome because of her immoral life but, in the end, she became so close to God and brought many other to believe in Jesus. Mother Teresa beautifully said, "The greatest disease in the world today is not TB or leprosy; it is being unwanted, unloved, and uncared for. We can cure physical diseases with medicine, but the only cure for loneliness, despair, and hopelessness is love." We were like that Samaritan woman at our birth - we were in the state of original sin and distanced from God, but through the waters of Baptism, we all became the children of God.

Dear friends, as a follower of Christ, all our words and action should bring the love of Christ to others. It could be a simple smile and say hi to someone when you walk on the roadside. In our conversations, we need to avoid discrimination, prejudices, and being judgmental. Let us spread the love of Christ, and may Christ's love permeate the world.






Lk 12: 13-21




