A MESSAGE FROM FR. MARC





Fr. Marc Bishop - Pastor St. Agnes and St. Camillus

Dear Faith Family,

You may have noticed that the Collaborative Lenten Theme is "I thirst." I chose this theme inspired by Saint Mother Teresa and the Missionaries of Charity (MC). Mother Teresa required that the words "I thirst" be dis-

played next to the crucifix in each Chapel of the MC's. She did this to personalize the words of Christ from the Cross. Jesus is not speaking generally or abstractly. He was pleading spiritually. Commonly we think of these words abstractly: "Jesus' thirst for souls." This is true but allows us to keep Christ and His Cross distant. I think a better way for us to hear these words is "Marc, I thirst for you." (Insert your name.)

Mother Teresa said: "We have these words in every chapel of the MCs to remind us what an MC is here for: to quench the thirst of Jesus for souls, for love, for kindness, for compassion, for delicate love." Is this solely the work of the MCs? I think not.

We who hear God's words from the Cross have a personal role in satiating the thirst of Christ. We may not be called to the radical and profound witness of the MC's. (Some of us may be.) However, we are called in accord with our own state in life to be actively quenching the thirst of Christ, embracing: "kindness, compassion, and delicate love."

In a time when many think it is appropriate to be incendiary, our campaign of conversion and holiness is rightly focused on quenching. Not to be inflamed by the destructive motives of this world but be led by the hope of satiation (completeness) in the world to come.

From where do we find this path? In prayer, especially Eucharistic Adoration. Adoring the Crucified and Risen Lord in the tabernacle. It is from that intimate moment from which one hears Christ say to them "I thirst for you" that one can truly unite their will to God's and become an instrument of His purpose, to be an instrument to help others hear those same words.

To do that requires understanding that Christ thirsts for each of us individually. Say this next line aloud placing the name of one you love and one you know needs your kindness/compassion/ delicate love. (Insert name), I thirst for you. Hear God's words and respond.

March 27th through March 29th, at 6:30 PM in St. Camillus Church, we have an opportunity to connect to the words of Christ. Our community will gather centered on the Eucharist and move forward in His mission. Please, join me and your fellow parishioners at our collaborative Lenten Mission.

"I Thirst"

A MEDITATION ATTRIBUTED TO SAINT MOTHER TERESA

Begin by getting into a comfortable position, breathing deeply, letting your entire body relax. Let the worries

and cares you've been carrying fade into the background.

I THIRST FOR YOU.

Yes, that is the only way to even begin to describe My love for you:

I THIRST FOR YOU.

I thirst to love you And to be loved by you that is how precious you are to Me. I THIRST FOR YOU.

Come to Me,

And I will fill your heart and heal your wounds. I will make you a new creation, and give you peace, even in all your trials.

I THIRST FOR YOU.

You must never doubt My mercy, My acceptance of you, My desire to forgive, My longing to bless you and live My life in you. I THIRST FOR YOU.

If you feel unimportant in the eyes of the world, that matters not at all. For Me, there is no one more important in the entire world than you. I THIRST FOR YOU.

Open to Me, come to Me, thirst for Me, give Me your life — and I will prove to you how important you are to My heart.

Pause to think about what you want most from God, right now, in this time and space. Don't you realize that My Father already has a perfect plan to transform your life, beginning from this moment?

Trust in Me.

Ask Me every day to enter and take charge of your life — and I will. I promise you before My Father in heaven that I will work miracles in your life. Why would I do this? Because I THIRST FOR YOU. All I ask of you is that you entrust yourself to Me completely. I will do all the rest.

Even now, I behold the place My Father has prepared for you in My Kingdom. Remember that you are a pilgrim in this life, on a journey home. Sin can never satisfy you or bring the peace you seek. All that you have sought outside of Me has only left you more empty, so do not cling to the things of this life. Above all, do not run from Me when you fall. Come to Me without delay. When you give Me your sins, you give Me the joy of being your Savior. There is nothing I cannot forgive and heal, so come now and unburden your soul.

No matter how far you may wander, no matter how often you forget Me, no matter how many crosses you may bear in this life, there is one thing I want you to always remember, one thing that will never change:

I THIRST FOR YOU -

just as you are.

You don't need to change to believe in My love, for it will be your belief in My love that will change you.

You forget Me,

and yet I am seeking you every moment of the day standing at the door of your heart, and knocking.

Pause and ask yourself: Do you ever doubt God's love for you? Listen to Jesus . . . and believe.

When we think of fasting during Lent, most often we think of cutting back our food consumption. Fasting as a spiritual benefit challenges us to look deeply at our desires and temptations, making a conscious decision to prune behaviors that separate us fro an intimacy with God. It is an exercise in humility.

Some ways you can fast are:

- From perfection and control
- From unchaste thoughts, words, and actions
- From the extra helping during dinner
- From wanting what I don't have
- From neglecting your spouse, friendships, and/or yourself
- From road rage
- From (excessive) social media usage

SAINT PATRICK



(Friday) is the Feast of St. Patrick, the great missionary to Ireland and the patron saint of the Archdiocese of Boston. We should reflect on his many virtues and try to imitate him.

As a teenager living in Britain, Patrick, who was then not particularly religious, was kidnapped by Irish pirates and taken to Ireland as a slave. He developed his relationship with God when spending long nights in prayer while tending sheep. After six years in slavery, he trusted in God and escaped and travelled two hundred miles to the Irish coast where he was able to negotiate passage back to Britain.

While back home, he had a dream in which the people of Ireland said to him, "We appeal to you, holy youth, to come and walk among us." Patrick took this as a message from God and he acted on it. He studied for the priesthood and was later made bishop at a fairly young age. He was then sent back to Ireland to attempt to convert the pagan Irish people to the Catholic faith. Although he had not received as much training and education as most bishops, he was quite qualified for the job because of his zeal and because he knew the Irish language and culture from his time as a slave.

St. Patrick took to heart the words of Jesus. He did not go to Ireland "to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." Unlike the rich man in today's gospel, he was not oblivious to the needs of others. He was courageous and risked his life numerous times in his clashes with the Irish druids and in his attempts to convert the heathen Irish people to the one true faith. He spent his life in service to the people of Ireland and was overwhelmingly successful in their conversion to Catholicism.

Do we spend time in prayer like St. Patrick? Do we trust in God, like he did? Are we trying our best to follow God's will in our lives? Do we have at least a small portion of St. Patrick's zeal and daring missionary spirit? Like him, are we concerned about others' eternal souls? Have we invited them to attend Mass or to more actively participate in the life of the Church? With St. Patrick in mind, have we considered that, if we bring just one person back to the Catholic faith, we could be affecting multiple generations?

MUSIC NOTES from Roger

Have you ever thought about getting more involved and taking a more active role in the presentation of our Masses here in the Arlington Catholic Collaborative? There are many ways in which you can take part through the many different liturgical ministries: ushers, lectors,

altar servers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion; even simply greeting folks as they come in for Mass. Are you being called to serve in any of these ministries? This season of Lent is a great time to reflect in your prayer life and ask yourself if the Holy Spirit is calling you to serve. I encourage you to pray about it during this time of penitence and reflection. There will be a series of Liturgical Workshops soon after Easter where you can come together for a presentation and talk with folks who are currently doing some of these ministries. Watch the bulletin for future dates and times for these opportunities.

During Lent, we sing the Chant Mass settings for the sung portions of the Mass which include *Lord Have Mercy*, *Holy Holy*, *Memorial Acclamation*, *Amen* and *Lamb of God*.

Our liturgies are intentionally quieter and more prayerful in spirit as we journey through these 40 days with our Lord. At the conclusion of the Mass, rather than the usual closing or recessional hymn, we sing the Marian Antiphon, *Ave Regina Caelorum*.

Here is a shorter translation of the antiphon that would make a lovely devotion in your prayers: Hail, Queen of heaven, hail Lady of the angels, Hail root and gate from which the Light of the world was born. Rejoice glorious Virgin, fairest of all. Fare thee well, most beautiful, and pray for us to Christ.

Why do we pray? St. Thomas Aquinas in the Summa Theologia noted: "We need to pray to God, not in order to make known to him our needs or desires but that we ourselves may be reminded of the necessity of having recourse to God's help in these matters." In other words, we pray as a way of turning ourselves to God and in remembrance that only Jesus saves. The continued act of turning our hearts and minds to God in prayer creates within us a habitual disposition of humility. Additionally, as a conversation with God and a way to silence our minds and hearts, we grow in our ability discern to the movements of the Holy Spirit and hear His words in the "gentle wind" (cf. 1 Kings 19:10-12). Some ways you can grow and deepen your prayer life are:

- Dedicate 10 more minutes more of prayer time to your day. Perhaps begin your day with a morning offering and end it with an examination.
- Read the Sunday readings before Mass to prepare your heart for the Word of God.
- Listen to a Bible in a Year Podcast.
- Explore different ways to pray: lectio divina, contemplative prayer, imaginative prayer, and many others.
- Learn to pray the Rosary. Join others at 7:30 AM, Monday Saturday at St. Agnes.
- Sit in Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament, offered Wednesday, March 29th (third night of our collaborative mission) or daily at 6:00 AM at St. Agnes.




