Happy Easter! I begin by thanking all who worked hard to make our Triduum and Easter Sunday Masses and Services a blessed time of worship. I am grateful for all their efforts. Your hours

This weekend, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. We pay particular attention to the Image of Christ on the cross with blood and water flowing from his pierced side; that is mercy flowing from the Temple of God, the Christ. It is a day of thankfulness. On the Octave of Easter, the Church traditionally treats Easter Sunday through the Second Sunday of Easter as one liturgical Day, concluding with our hearts filled with gratitude and greater understanding of God's Divine Mercy.

One of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water. He who saw it has borne witness—his testimony is true, and he knows that he tells the truth—that you also may believe. (Jn 19:34)

Today the church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday. In 2000, at the canonization Mass of Saint Faustina, Pope John Paul II declared that the second of Easter should be observed as the Divine Mercy Sunday. This feast is closely associated with the lives of the Polish nun, St. Faustina. She

received private visions from Jesus. In that Vision, Jesus appeared to her wearing white garments with rays of white and red coming from his heart. Jesus asked Sr. Faustina to venerate this image on the following Sunday of Easter. The following are the words of Jesus to Sr. Faustina, "I want the Image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter, and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it... My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, especially for poor sinners. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy."

Please picture that image in your mind that was revealed to Sr. Faustina. Jesus wears white garments with two rays of white and red coming from His side. What comes to our minds when we see those beams of white and red? Isn't remind us of the water and blood that comes forth from Jesus' side on the Cross? In His vision to Faustina, Jesus calls himself the fount of mercy. Last week, we remembered Jesus' sacrificial death on the cross. We celebrated the love that Jesus has for you and me. A love that is stronger than death. A love that enabled Jesus to embrace the cross for our sins. Jesus once again reveals to Sr. Faustina how much He cares for sinners, the lost sheep. Red and white beams are nothing but the sacraments of the Eucharist and Baptism. While he was asleep on the cross, the waters and blood that comes forth from Jesus' side are nothing but Church, His bride. By shedding blood on the cross, Jesus showed us how much He loved His bride.

How did God create the first woman, the bride of Adam in the first creation? God put Adam to sleep and took the rib from his side and created the first

woman, Eve. (Gen 2:21). So, the first bride comes from Adam's side. However, the first man sinned against God. But in the new creation, the new Adam, Jesus accepted God's plan. How did God create the bride (the church) in the new creation? It was while the New Adam, Jesus asleep on the cross. So, the water and blood that flows from Jesus' side are nothing but the Church and her Sacraments.

Dear friends, Jesus humbly accepted the cross because He loved His bride, the Church. Pope John Paul II says, "Divine Mercy reaches human beings through the heart of Christ crucified." So, the feast of Divine Mercy reminds us of the abundant love that Jesus has for us. How do you go to express your love for Him this week? It may be by making a good confession or spending time with the Lord throughout this Week. Please do join us for the Night Light coming Wednesday at 6:00 PM, St. Agnes. Confession will be available and the Divine Mercy Chaplet will be prayed at 7:00 PM.

The Easter Season

Easter isn't just a day, it's a whole season that stretches all the way to the feast of Pentecost, May 28th.

At Masses all through the Easter season, our usual practice of reading from the Old Testament is replaced by reading from the Acts of the Apostles. These readings tell the story of the Church's earliest days, and the beginnings of our faith's spreading throughout the ancient world. These stories of heroism, controversies, persecutions, and miracles all testify to the continued presence of the Risen Christ in the world, through the lives of his disciples, and the actions of the Holy Spirit.

All of this should be an encouragement and a sign of hope for us today. Despite war, violence, personal struggle, and illness, God has not abandoned us, nor left us to our own devices. The Risen Savior is still with us. These 50 days of Easter ask us to reflect on His presence, and - even in the face of danger or fear — to live with joy.
