

CHRISTMAS REFLECTION





Our Christmas traditions are those of Polish and Lithuanian origin. We celebrate Christmas on Christmas Eve. After the first star is seen in the night sky the family gathers around the dinner table. We recall the story of the birth of Jesus. This is also repre-Deacon Peter Bujwid sented in our twelve, yes twelve, course dinner (one for each apos-

tle). We do not eat meat that day, so each course is vegetarian.

The first course comprises an apple which is cut up into pieces and shared - so we may remember why it was that Jesus was born. Then wafers of bread are broken and shared with a loving embrace, to recall the living bread of life. Sometimes these wafers are mailed to family who cannot be together, so all may be joined as one at this time. Our firm family favorite though is 'Kisielius', an oatmeal pudding that has been fermented to give it a strong sour taste. A small bowl of oatmeal Kisielius is passed from one member of the family to another. A single spoon it taken and dipped in sweetened water and is then quickly consumed. This combination of the sour and the sweet represents life, both the sweetness and the bitterness. I recall my very young daughters holding their noses and making faces when eating oatmeal Kisielius. As the years have gone by, fermenting the oatmeal has become quite the culinary pursuit for one of them. The rest of the meal unfolds, and few make it to the last course. This is our family Christmas dinner; called Kucios in Lithuanian and Wigilia in Polish. As you celebrate Christmas this year may the bitterness of life be overcome by the sweetness which our Lord brings as he makes all things new (Rev. 21:5).

A PRAYER PROCESS

From Matthew Kelly, Dynamic Catholic

1. GRATITUDE

Begin by thanking God in a personal dialogue for whatever you are most grateful for today. Gratitude softens and opens our hearts.

2. AWARENESS

Revisit the times in the past twenty-four hours when you were and were not the best version of yourself. Talk to God about these situations and what you have learned from them.

3. SIGNIFICANT MOMENTS

Identify something you experienced today and explore what God might be trying to say to you through that event (or person).

4. PEACE

Ask God to forgive you for any wrong you have committed (against yourself, another person, or Him) and to fill you with a deep and abiding peace.

5. FREEDOM

Speak with God about how He is inviting you to change your life so that you experience the freedom to be the-best-version-of-vourself.

6. OTHERS

Lift up to God anyone you feel called to pray for today, asking God to bless and guide them.



Irreversible is not a word you want to hear from your Doctor but it's a common one if you've been diagnosed with Chemotherapy-Induced Peripheral Neuropathy or CIPN.

Elliott S. of Burlington survived testicular cancer only to be living life with constant pain. He felt as though he was walking on pins and needles, becoming weaker and weaker every day. "I was beginning to be worried that one day I would be wheelchair-bound."


