Dear Faith Family, This weekend we celebrate the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time referring to the numbered weeks in our Liturgical Calendar not a qualitative statement. The Christmas Season

ended on January 8th with the close of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. All of this to say, next weekend we celebrate the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, the Sunday of the Word of God. At all Masses next Weekend (Vigil and Sunday) we will bless Bibles. Families and individuals are encouraged to bring their family Bible or personal devotional Bible to be blessed at Mass. The Word of God contained in the Bible is a place of comfort and clarity for me. I pray that it will be for all of us. So, next Sunday bring your own Bible to Mass (BYOB).

As our nation commemorates Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, we are all called to pray and reflect upon the harm that racial bias has caused in our communities. It is an opportunity for honest reflection and a commitment to honor and respect all people. On January 18th, the Week for Christian Unity begins. We can mark this week by praying to God to unite His people, that all may worship truly and faithfully.

I have received preliminary data on the results of our Increased Offertory Campaign. The results have astonished me. Over the three months since the campaign began St. Camillus has experienced a 40% increase in offertory. This is an average offertory of \$5,210.00 per week. In the same period, St. Agnes has realized a 66% increase with an average weekly offering of \$17,035.00. We can now address some deferred improvements to our facilities that have been a long time in coming. For example, we are addressing issues with rotten trees on the St. Camillus Campus. Nothing is done overnight but we will be persistent to improve. More importantly, your generosity stabilized our finances and allowed us to properly focus on mission outreach. We will be placing more of our resources in outreach.

We have many outreach priorities. We have recognized that bereavement and funeral ministry must be at the top of our priorities list. In the coming months there will be more opportunities for those to minister and be ministered to regarding bereavement and funeral ministry. If you have an interest in learning more about this ministry, please contact Mary Wessel.

Our Arlington Catholic High School will soon be sending acceptance letters to students for the 2024-2025 academic year. This year, we have had more applications than in past years. We do limit our class size to ensure a personalized academic experience where the student can grow spiritually, academically, emotionally, and physically. The Saint Agnes Elementary School enrollment period is ongoing. Again, there are a limited number of seats per grade. There is a priority placed on in-parish applications when received promptly. WHAT IS ORDINARY TIME?


The end of the Christmas season was marked by the Baptism of the Lord, and we have now moved into the season of Ordinary Time.

Despite its name, there is nothing inherently "ordinary" about this season of the year. The term ordinary is just used because the weeks are numbered in an ordinary way—the Third Week in Ordinary Time, The Fourth Week in Ordinary Time, and so on.



Ordinary Time is broken into two blocks, before and after the Lent and Easter seasons. Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, is a 40-day season of repentance and renewal before the celebration of the Easter season, which lasts even longer than Lent (about 50 days). The Easter Season goes from the Easter Vigil to the celebration of Pentecost. The timing of the Lent and Easter seasons is based on the cycles of the moon.


During Ordinary Time, we honor the mystery of Christ, especially on Sundays, though we do not focus on just one aspect of the mystery during the No . 1167). In addition to participating in the Eucharistic liturgy, in Ordinary Time, Sundays remain days that should be set aside for prayer, reflection, rest, and time with family. (usccb.org)

season. It is a time to reflect on Jesus' life, teachings, and parables.

Liturgical calendars were not always structured this way. In the earliest days of the Church, every Sunday was treated as an Easter Sunday — there was no distinction in the season for Christmas, Lent, and Easter. While we no longer treat every Sunday as Easter Sunday, "Sunday is the preeminent day for the liturgical assembly" (CCC
