Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings any time throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

Pastoral Care of the Sick

Please call the rectory and let us know when a member of your family is in the hospital so a priest can arrange to visit them. Make sure you contact the Pastoral Care Office in the hospital so the Chaplain can bring you communion daily. **In the event of an emergency please call 908 392-7962 anytime of the day or night.**


Marriages

What you should know about St. Augustine and the new Augustinian Pope

With the election of Pope Leo XIV, a professed Augustinian, going back to the profound legacy of St. Augustine, one of the Church's most influential thinkers, seems indispensable. Augustine's life and writings offer profound insights into the nature of forgiveness, memory, and selfhood—concepts that resonate deeply with the mission of a pope rooted in his legacy.

The scattered self and the call to unity

At the heart of Augustine's thought is a striking insight into the nature of the human self. In *Confessions*, Augustine famously reflects on the fragmented nature of his soul, describing himself as "scattered among times" he can't understand, and struggling to gather his disparate desires and thoughts into a coherent whole. This inner disarray is not simply a byproduct of sin but a feature of the human condition itself—a consequence of existing within time and constantly moving toward nonexistence. Augustine's concept of the self as both episodic (the self that changes over time) and persistent (the self we can recognize in our memories, even though we are "no longer" that person) captures this tension, suggesting that the true self is not simply a collection of past memories but a deeper, persistent core that remains even when everything else seems to change and, eventually, pass away.

This fragmented self finds unity through what Augustine calls *continentia*, a kind of spiritual containment that gathers the scattered pieces of the self into a single, integrated whole. This movement towards unity is both an inward and upward journey, reflecting Augustine's famous line from the *Confessions*: "You were more inward than my innermost self" (*interior intimo meo*).

Forgiveness as a radical "Now"

Central to Augustine's spiritual vision is the idea of forgiveness as a transformative, present moment—a "right now" that interrupts the monotonous sequence of "one tomorrow after another," *cras et cras*, in the original Latin. This understanding of forgiveness goes beyond the simple remission of sins to include a profound, existential re-collection of the self, a sudden gathering of the scattered parts into a unified whole. It is not merely about the erasure of past sins but about becoming a "new crea-

tion," a self that is freed from the chains of past wrongdoing.

Augustine's famous conversion scene captures this precisely. In a moment of intense inner conflict, Augustine describes feeling as if he is bound by the smallest of chains, unable to break free until the grace of conversion allows him to stand "upright" (*factus erectior*) and embrace a new, integrated self. This rebirth, this radical "now," is a central aspect of Augustine's understanding of forgiveness. It is an act of divine grace, yes, but also an act of self-appropriation—a reclaiming of one's true self, often hidden beneath layers of habit and memory.

Memory, identity, and forgiveness

For Augustine, memory is a powerful but double-edged gift. It is both the source of our identity and the site of our deepest struggles. While memory allows us to recall and integrate past experiences, it also confronts us with the limits of our understanding and the persistent shadows of past sins. This paradox is central to Augustine's concept of selfhood, where the episodic and persistent aspects of the self are constantly in dialogue.

Pope Leo XIV, drawing from this rich Augustinian heritage, may emphasize the importance of remembering not just our sins, but also the divine grace that constantly calls us to renewal and transformation. In a world often defined by its divisions and distractions, this focus on unity, self-possession, and radical forgiveness could shape his papacy in profound ways.

The challenge of an Augustinian Papacy

As the Church stands at a crossroads in a fractured world, an Augustinian pope has the unique challenge of calling the faithful to a deeper, more integrated life. This means encouraging a form of spiritual unity that transcends mere institutional reform and touches the very soul of the Church. Pope Leo XIV, like his namesake, will likely draw on this powerful legacy to remind us that true reform begins within, in the often hidden work of personal conversion and reconciliation.

In Augustine's words, "Our heart is restless until it rests in You." This restlessness, this constant striving for unity, is a challenge that the Church must confront anew in every generation—and one that an Augustinian pope is uniquely equipped to lead.

Reflexion Salesiana para el Quinto Domingo de Pascua



Una reflexión salesiana sobre el Evangelio dominical por un Oblato de San Francisco de Sales

"La morada de Dios esta con la raza humana... Dios siempre estará con ellos."

Perspectiva Salesiana

En la Parte II, Capitulo 2 de su Introducción a la Vida Devota, San Francisco de Sales escribió "Dios esta en todas las cosas y en todos los lugares. No hay lugar o cosa en este mundo donde Dios no esta verdaderamente presente. Así como donde quiera los pájaros vuelan ellos siempre encuentran aire, dondequiera que nosotros vamos o donde quiera que estamos, nosotros nos encontramos en presencia de Dios."

Es mas fácil decirlo que hacerlo.

La verdad es que, nosotros frecuentemente perdemos de vista la presencia amorosa, y desafiante de Dios. Cuando nosotros olvidamos esta verdad frecuentemente nos hallamos en problemas: "Los ciegos no pueden ver a un príncipe cuando él está presente en medio de ellos, y por eso ellos no le demuestran el respeto que le demostrará una vez que han sido informados de su presencia. Aun así, como ellos no lo ven se olvidan fácilmente de que él está ahí, y cuando lo han olvidado de nuevo, ellos olvidan también el respeto y la reverencia que se le debe... de la misma forma, nosotros sabemos verdaderamente que Dios esta presente en todas las cosas, pero como no reflexionamos en ese hecho actuamos como si no estuviéramos conscientes de ello." (Ibid)

Cuando nos olvidamos de la presencia de Dios estamos pecando: por que no le damos a Dios el respeto que Dios se merece. Cuando nos olvidamos de la presencia de Dios estamos pecando: por que no le damos a los demás el respeto que ellos se merecen. Nosotros podemos decir: "lejos de la vista, es lejos de la mente" cuando fallamos a la hora de ver a Dios tendemos a pensar, sentir y actuar en formas que están fuera de sincronización con quienes y como Dios nos ha llamado a ser.

La Buena Nueva es que recordar la presencia de Dios no solo provee una prescripción potente para evitar el pecado. Recordar la presencia de Dios también pone un tremendo poder, una tremenda posibilidad y un tremendo potencial a nuestra disposición. Hablando prácti-

camente, recordar la presencia de Dios nos permite comportarnos de la mejor forma posible, nos permite ser lo mejor que podemos ser, nos permite vivir vidas llenas de amor, nos permite hacer nuestra parte en lo que se refiere a ayudar a diseñar una familia, una iglesia y una comunidad en la que cada lagrima es secada, para crear lugares y relaciones en las que no hay mas muerte ni luto, ni sollozos ni dolor.

Así como es sugerido en una frase de un sermón, 'dale a Dios lo que es debido en vez de darle lo que te sobra.'

En resumen, al ver a un Dios que siempre está con nosotros nos pone en contacto con la habilidad (con la gracia de Dios), como escuchamos en el Libro de la Revelación, "para hacer todas las cosas nuevas. " Esto nos da la fortaleza para seguir la exhortación de San Francisco de Sales: "Dondequiera que estemos, nosotros podemos y debemos aspirar a vivir una vida perfecta." (Introducción a la Vida Devota, Parte I, Capitulo 3). Esto nos da la fortaleza para ser quienes somos, y para ser eso de Buena forma, en el servicio de Dios y de los demás.

Esta es una presencia y un poder que vale la pena recordar.
