Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings anytime throughout the year (with the exception of the Lenten Season). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.


If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

Please call the office to meet with the Pastor as soon as you become engaged and before any preparations are made. Arrangements should be made one year in advance. Couples preparing for marriage must attend required Pre-Cana sessions within the Diocese along with F.O.C.C.U.S. and sessions with your Parish Priest or Deacon.

JUNE IS DEDICATED TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS



Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus by Holy Mother Church.

Heart of Jesus, Symbol of Love

The Church, governed and taught by the Holy Ghost, has approved and recommended devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In our age of religious indifference, when fervor and charity have grown cold, Jesus exhibits to the world His Sacred Heart as the symbol of God's infinite love - the symbol of His own generous selfsacrificing love for men. Jesus shows His Divine Heart as a furnace whose burning rays of love are able to reanimate faith and rekindle love in hearts grown cold and ungrateful.

But why His Heart? Because in every language, in every age, the heart is regarded as the natural symbol of love and affection. What more natural and expressive symbol is there, then, of the excessive love of Jesus than His Sacred Heart? The direct and material object of devotion to the Sacred Heart is the real, physical Heart of Jesus - the Heart of flesh, the living and loving Heart of our Blessed Lord; the Heart that beat in His Divine breast at the moment of the Incarnation; the Heart that loved us during the life of Jesus on earth, that poured forth its blood to the last drop on Mount Calvary; the beatified Heart now glorious in Heaven and still dwelling among us in the Blessed Sacrament; the Heart ever united to the Person of the Divine Word, to whom is due supreme homage and adoration.

We the Christians are the true Israel which springs from Christ, for we are carved out of His heart as from a rock. St. Justin Martyr (d. 165)

Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. - Matthew 11:29

There is in the Sacred Heart the symbol and express imlove in return. – Pope Leo XIII

Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is devotion to Jesus Christ Himself, but in the particular ways of meditating on His interior life and on His threefold love – His divine love, His burning love that fed His human will, and His sensible love that affects His interior life. Pope Pius XII of blessed memory writes on this topic in his 1956 encyclical, Haurietis Aguas (On Devotion To The Sacred Heart). Below are a few excerpts which help explain the devotion:

54. ...the Heart of the Incarnate Word is deservedly and rightly considered the chief sign and symbol of that threefold love with which the divine Redeemer unceasingly loves His eternal Father and all mankind.

- 55. It is a symbol of that divine love which He shares with the Father and the Holy Spirit but which He, the Word made flesh, alone manifests through a weak and perishable body, since "in Him dwells the fullness of the Godhead bodily."
- 56. It is, besides, the symbol of that burning love which, infused into His soul, enriches the human will of Christ and enlightens and governs its acts by the most perfect knowledge derived both from the beatific vision and that which is directly infused.
- 57. And finally and this in a more natural and direct way - it is the symbol also of sensible love, since the body of Jesus Christ, formed by the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary, possesses full powers of feelings and perception, in fact, more so than any other human body.
- 58. Since, therefore, Sacred Scripture and the official teaching of the Catholic faith instruct us that all things find their complete harmony and order in the most holy soul of Jesus Christ and that He has manifestly directed His threefold love for the securing of our redemption, it unquestionably follows that we can contemplate and honor the Heart of the divine Redeemer as a symbolic image of His love and a witness of our redemption and, at the same time, as a sort of mystical ladder by which we mount to the embrace of "God our Savior."
- 59. Hence His words, actions, commands, miracles, and especially those works which manifest more clearly His love for us - such as the divine institution of the Eucharist, His most bitter sufferings and death, the loving gift of His holy Mother to us, the founding of the Church for us, and finally, the sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and upon us - all these, we say, ought to be looked upon as proofs of His threefold love.
- 60. Likewise we ought to meditate most lovingly on the beating of His Sacred Heart by which He seemed, as it were, to measure the time of His sojourn on earth until that final moment when, as the Evangelists testify, age of the infinite love of Jesus Christ which moves us to "crying out with a loud voice 'It is finished' and bowing His Head, He yielded up the ghost." Then it was that His heart ceased to beat and His sensible love was interrupted until the time when, triumphing over death, He rose from the tomb.
 - 61. But after His glorified body had been re-united to the soul of the divine Redeemer, conqueror of death, His most Sacred Heart never ceased, and never will cease, to beat with calm and imperturbable pulsations. Likewise, it will never cease to symbolize the threefold love with which He is bound to His heavenly Father and the entire human race, of which He has every claim to be the mystical Head.

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

Reflexion Salesiana para La Ascencion del Señor



Una reflexión salesiana sobre el Evangelio dominical por un Oblato de San Francisco de Sales

"Vayan, hagan discípulos en todas las naciones."

Perspectiva Salesiana

Hablando del misterio de la Asunción de Nuestro Señor, Francisco de Sales escribió: "Nosotros traicionamos nuestra vida humana para poder vivir una vida que está por encima de nosotros. Escondemos esta nueva vida en Dios con Jesús Cristo quien es el único que puede verla, la conoce y la otorga. Nuestra nueva vida es el amor celestial, que aviva y anima nuestra alma y este amor está completamente escondido en Dios y en las cosas de Dios con Jesús Cristo. Como las palabras sagradas del Evangelio dicen, después que Jesús se había mostrado por un tiempo ante sus discípulos, él ascendió al cielo, y una nube lo rodeó, lo tomó y lo escondió de sus ojos. Jesucristo entonces, está oculto en el cielo, en Dios. Jesús Cristo es nuestro amor, y nuestro amor es la vida de nuestra alma. Por consiguiente nuestra vida está oculta en Dios con Jesús Cristo, y cuando Jesús que es nuestro amor y nuestra vida espiritual, aparezca en el Día del Juicio, nosotros también apareceremos junto con el en la gloria. Esto significa que, Jesús Cristo, nuestro amor, nos glorificara comunicándonos su propia dicha y esplendor." (Tratado del birán el Espíritu Santo para fortalecerlos en su trabajo. Amor de Dios, Libro VII, Capitulo 6)

Nuestra vida está ciertamente oculta en Dios. La realidad más profunda de quienes somos sólo es conocida por Dios. Aún así, para Francisco de Sales, vivir una vida escondida en Dios no es lo mismo que mantener esa vida en secreto: se trata de dar testimonio de nuestra verdad más profunda, de quienes somos – y quien es Dios – a través de la calidad de nuestras relaciones con los demás. Por lo tanto es apropiado que Francisco de Sales nos llame a practicar las virtudes ocultas, "esas virtudes pequeñas y humildes que crecen como flores al pie de la cruz: ayudar al pobre, visitar a los enfermos, cuidar de tu familia, desempeñando todas las tareas que esto incluye, y con esa diligencia que no te permitirá distraerte." (Introducción a la Vida Devota, Parte III, Capitulo 35)

A través de la Asunción, Jesús ha sido removido de nuestra vista: más bien, del alcance de nuestra vista a nivel físico. Aún así, la misma autoridad que Jesús reclamó del

Padre ha sido otorgada a nosotros en virtud de nuestra creación y confirmada en nuestro bautismo. Nosotros estamos llamados a continuar el trabajo que Jesús comenzó, esto es, a hacer discípulos – seguidores, creyentes – de todas las naciones. Nosotros estamos llamados a ser símbolos del reto continuo de redención de Dios, pero en las obras simples y ordinarias de cada día.

Paradójicamente, mientras nos mantengamos fieles a la practica de las pequeñas y ocultas virtudes que crecen "al pie de la cruz" Jesús ya no estará oculto: él se hará visible en nuestro amor, nuestra preocupación, nuestra lucha en nombre de la justicia, nuestra promoción de la paz, nuestro deseo de perdonar, nuestros intentos para sanar. Cuál es la forma más poderosa - y convincente- de ganar discípulos en todas las naciones?

O, al menos, que aquellas personas con quienes interactuamos cada día en nuestros pequeños rincones del mundo, se hagan discípulos?
