Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings anytime throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

SUNDAY MASS READING 6/8

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

The disciples were celebrating Pentecost together when "tongues of fire appeared which parted, then came to rest on each of them." The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in foreign tongues. Visitors from many different countries were amazed that each guest could hear his or her native language being spoken as the disciples proclaimed God's glory.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

Each person has received different manifestations of the same spirit to contribute to the common good of all. All members of the church have been baptized into one body because of our belief in the Holy Spirit, who was sent to us by God.

Gospel: John 20:19-23

Jesus appeared to the disciples even though they had locked the doors in fear. Jesus then showed the disciples his hands and his side; and they rejoiced at his presence. He breathed on them saying "Receive the Holy Spirit." He then gave the disciples the power to forgive others or hold them accountable for their sins.

Receive Power From on High

"When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit." - Acts of the Apostles 2:1-4

When we meditate on the Descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, we are meditating on the birthday of the Church. Pentecost was when the Apostles received the Spirit of Jesus within themselves (see Acts 1:8). Then they were able to preach like Jesus, do the same miracles as Jesus, and spread the good news of the kingdom to all generations. We see the Catholic (or "universal") Church emerge at Pentecost because that was the first time the message of the Gospel spread to the nations (see Acts 2:5-11; 37-41). We're all called to evangelize in our own way, but we can only do that in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Why were the Apostles so bold after Pentecost when they'd been so afraid before? The Holy Spirit makes the difference. That's one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit: He takes away fear and gives us holy courage, holy boldness, and the grace to speak the good news of the Gospel, even if it means opposition (see Acts 4:29-31).

That's why, when the Holy Spirit descended, He appeared as tongues of fire. That fire removed any fear the Apostles had of the authorities (see Acts 5:27-32). They were scourged immediately after proclaiming the Gospel and still went out and evangelized (see Acts 5:40-42). So the person with the Holy Spirit is able to overcome even the worst threats and fears through the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit has sanctifying and charismatic gifts that He distributes as He wills for the building up of the kingdom of God. No one person has all the gifts - we must rely on each other for some talents and skills (see 1 Cor 12-14). The power of the Holy Spirit is a divine power,


which we don't have except by God's generosity. We must ask for that power from on high to be able to preach God's message, to love, and to sacrifice ourselves for others. On the human level, it doesn't make sense. It takes divine grace to die to ourselves, to reach out to a person who's in need.

Let us ask the Holy Spirit to work with power in our lives and the lives of all our neighbors for conversion, sanctification, grace, healing, and peace. Let us ask God to show us what gifts He has given us to build up the Church, and for the prudence and fortitude to use them wisely and lovingly in His service.

Apostolic Vicariate of San Jose del Amazonas Peru, South America



The Rev. Pablo Jareño López-Cuervo went to the seminary because of a call from the Holy Spirit. He has served in Latin America and now is in the Amazon announcing the gospel to the poorest of the world. Here he feels in touch with Christ.

Fr Pablo will be speaking at the Masses at St Joseph **June 7 and 8** for the **Apostolic Vicariate of San Jose del Amazonas** as part of the Missionary Cooperation Plan for the Diocese of Metuchen.

The Vicariate of San Jose del Amazonas is located in the northeast part of the Peruvian rainforest on the Amazon River and its tributaries. We minister to 680 distant villages where the rivers are our only means of travel. Our main goal is to take the gospel of Jesus Christ to the remote indigenous Amazon communities. We count on lay missionaries, religious sisters, and a few priests to travel to these outposts, to provide education, medical care, religious formation and the sacraments.

The support of the St Joseph congregation through the Missionary Cooperation Plan appeal will help ensure that these missionaries are able to follow the call to serve the people in this remote and very poor area - a real sign of hope for the people who witness the care provided as a reflection of God's love. Join us in Christ's call to go out to the nations by your PRAYERS and your monetary assistance this weekend.

Our missionaries

10 lay persons, 38 religious women, 1 brother, 2 deacons, 10 priests, 1 bishop attend to the needs of 16 mission sites and 680 communities:
 338 in the Amazon River basin (372 miles)
 210 along the Napo River (385 mi)
 82 on the Putumayo River (758 mi)
 50 on the Yavarí River (445 mi)

The challenges are many

- * Great distances
- * Shortage of pastoral ministers
- * Lack of Amazonian pastoral ministers for the indigenous communities
- * Main means of survival are fishing, hunting and basic agriculture.
- * The border: migrants, drug trafficking, human trafficking
- * Family violence, low quality education
- * Care of the natural world




**We are few

Perspectiva Salesiana

Sin importar el hecho de que ellos hablaban a diferentes personas con diferentes lenguajes y diferentes culturas, los apóstoles eran entendidos por todas las personas que los escuchaban cuando proclamaban las maravillas que Dios había logrado.

Cómo era esto posible?

Encendidos por el amor del Espíritu Santo, los apóstoles podían hablar el lenguaje del corazón. Ellos estaban hablando con entusiasmo. Ellos estaban hablando con gratitud. Ellos estaban alabando y dando gracias. Ellos estaban hablando desde el fondo de su ser. Ellos estaban hablando desde su alma.

En resumen, ellos estaban hablando el lenguaje universal – el lenguaje del corazón.

Nosotros somos muy humanos – somos muy divinos – cuando hablamos el lenguaje del corazón, cuando hablamos el lenguaje del amor, cuando hablamos y escuchamos con el alma, cuando estamos basados en la Palabra-Hecha-Carne.

Como sabemos muy bien, por experiencia propia, la comunicación es más que el encuentro de los ojos... o de la lengua o el oído. Comunicarse es algo más fácil de decir que de hacer. Frecuentemente malinterpretamos.

Frecuentemente presumimos que sabemos lo que otras personas están pensando o sintiendo. Frecuentemente usamos las mismas palabras aún cuando tienen diferentes significados. Frecuentemente tenemos formas distintas de decir la misma cosa. Frecuentemente oímos, pero frecuentemente fracasamos al escuchar. Deja que la miel de la devoción, y de esas cosas divinas que son imperceptibles al oído de una y otra persona, fluyan cuanto más puedan. Ora en tu alma para complacer a Dios, y que él haga que este rocío bendito penetre en los corazones de aquellos que te escuchen. Es maravilloso como una propuesta dulce y amigable atrae los corazones de los oyentes.”


