Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings anytime throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

Pastoral Care of the Sick

Please call the rectory and let us know when a member of your family is in the hospital so a priest can arrange to visit them. Make sure you contact the Pastoral Care Office in the hospital so the Chaplain can bring you communion daily. **In the event of an emergency please call 908 392-7962 anytime of the day or night.**

Marriages

Please call the office to meet with the Pastor as soon as you become engaged and before any preparations are made. Arrangements should be made one year in advance. Couples preparing for marriage must attend required Pre-Cana sessions within the Diocese along with F.O.C.C.U.S. and sessions with your Parish Priest or Deacon.

SUNDAY MASS READING 6/15

First Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

God created Wisdom before he created the earth or the skies. This spirit stood beside God every day until the earth was complete, then "found delight in the people of the earth." This indicates that the spirit of wisdom was later personified by Jesus.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-5

Gospel: John 16:12-15



“ The mystery of the **Most Holy Trinity** is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in Himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the "hierarchy of the truths of faith" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 234).

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi, formally known as the

the Holy Eucharist—His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

While the Church has always believed in and celebrated the Eucharist as the source and summit of Christian life,

Corpus Christi is a relatively late addition to the liturgical calendar. The feast originated in the 13th century, largely through the efforts of St. Juliana of Liège, a Norbertine canoness in Belgium. St. Juliana had a deep devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and received visions in which Christ asked that a special feast be established to honor the Eucharist and deepen the faith of the people in His real presence.

Her efforts, supported by local clergy and eventually by Pope Urban IV, culminated in the establishment of Corpus Christi as a universal feast in 1264. The Pope commissioned the Dominican friar St. Thomas Aquinas to compose liturgical texts for the celebration. The hymns he wrote—*Pange Lingua*, *Tantum Ergo*, *Panis Angelicus*, and others—remain some of the most beautiful and enduring expressions of Eucharistic faith in the Church's tradition.

Corpus Christi is unique among solemnities in that it often includes a public Eucharistic procession, in which the consecrated Host is carried in a monstrance through the streets, accompanied by hymns, incense, and the faithful. This outward act of worship proclaims to the world what Catholics believe: that Jesus Christ is truly and substantially present in the Eucharist, not merely symbolically, but in reality.

The feast also invites Catholics to examine their own reverence and devotion toward the Blessed Sacrament. It reminds us that the Eucharist is not a private moment of piety, but a sacramental mystery that binds the Church together and nourishes it with divine life. It is the same Christ who walked the roads of Galilee, who died and rose again, who now comes to us under the appearance of bread and wine.

In a time when the reality of Christ's presence in the Eucharist is often misunderstood or forgotten, Corpus Christi stands as a joyful affirmation of the miracle at the heart of the Church. Let us come with faith and humility to adore the Lord who gives Himself to us in the Sacrament of the Altar—our true food, our strength, and our peace.



Reflexion Salesiana para La Santisima Trinidad



Una reflexión salesiana sobre el Evangelio dominical por un Oblato de San Francisco de Sales

"La Sabiduría de Dios proclama: "Yo estaba junto a Dios como su artesano; yo era el deleite de Dios día con día."

Perspectiva Salesiana

Dios se revela ante nosotros como un Padre creador y amoroso, un Hijo que nos nutre y nos redime, y un Espíritu que nos desafía y nos inspira. Nuestra creación es la imagen y la semejanza de la Trinidad; nuestro llamado a vivir los unos con los otros en esta tierra es a la imagen y semejanza de la Trinidad; el hecho de que estamos destinados para la gloria del cielo es a la imagen y semejanza de la Trinidad.

La Trinidad nos habla de la plenitud creativa; la Trinidad nos habla de la abundancia sanadora; la trinidad nos habla de la generosidad que inspira.

El Espíritu Santo, la Sabiduría de Dios, es la fuente de los regalos que necesitamos para poder experimentar y personificar a este Dios Trino en nuestras vidas diarias. San Francisco de Sales escribió en su Tratado del Amor de Dios: "Nosotros necesitamos **templanza** para aplacar las inclinaciones rebeldes de la sensualidad; **justicia**, para hacer lo que es correcto en relación con Dios, con nuestros vecinos y con nosotros mismos; **fortaleza**, para que podamos permanecer fieles a nuestro compromiso de hacer lo que esta bien y para poder evitar hacer lo que esta mal; **prudencia**, para descubrir las formas mas apropiadas para que podamos buscar el bien y para practicar la virtud; **conocimiento**, para que podamos conocer el verdadero bien al que debemos aspirar, al igual que el verdadero mal, que debemos rechazar; **entendimiento**, para penetrar en los primeros y los mas importantes fundamentos o principios de la belleza y la excelencia de la virtud, y; a la final, **sabiduría**, para contemplar la naturaleza divina, la primera fuente de todo lo que es bueno." (Tratado del Amor de Dios, Libro 11, Capítulo 15)

Suena familiar? Debería: nosotros conocemos esto como los "siete regalos" del Espíritu Santo.

El amor que viene de este Dios trino, este amor que es una parte fundamental de quienes somos, contiene todos estos regalos. Francisco de Sales describió este amor como "una azucena esplendida que tiene seis pétalos mas blancos que la nieve, y en cuyo centro se hallan los pequeños y hermosos martillitos dorados de la sabiduría que traen a nuestros corazones el sabor amoroso de la bondad del Padre, nuestro Creador, la misericordia del Hijo, nuestro Redentor, y la dulzura del Espíritu Santo, nuestro Santificador." (Ibid)

Tan misteriosa como es la Trinidad, hay dos cosas que son realmente claras: (1) nosotros estamos llamados a personificar la plenitud creativa de Dios, la abundancia sanadora de Dios, y la generosidad inspiradora de Dios, y; (2) nosotros hemos sido otorgados los regalos necesarios para hacer ese llamado una realidad.

El Dios Trino- Padre, Hijo, Espíritu nos ayuda a reflejar – clara y convincentemente – su imagen en nuestras mentes, nuestros corazones, nuestras actitudes y nuestras acciones. Danos la gracia para ser el deleite en las vidas de los demás día a día.
