Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings any time throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

Pastoral Care of the Sick

Please call the rectory and let us know when a member of your family is in the hospital so a priest can arrange to visit them. Make sure you contact the Pastoral Care Office in the hospital so the Chaplain can bring you communion daily. **In the event of an emergency please call 908 392-7962 anytime of the day or night.**

Marriages

Please call the office to meet with the Pastor as soon as you become engaged and before any preparations are made. Arrangements should be made one year in advance. Couples preparing for marriage must attend required Pre-Cana sessions within the Diocese along with F.O.C.C.U.S. and sessions with your Parish Priest or Deacon.

SUNDAY MASS READING 6/22

First Reading: Genesis 14:18-20

Melchizedek, a priest of God, prayed that Abram would be blessed by God. He also praised God for delivering Abram's foes into his hands.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Paul describes Jesus' actions during the last supper. Jesus broke bread and said it was his body given for us, asking that we do the same in remembrance of him. He then passed the cup and called it his blood. Jesus then asked us to break bread in this manner to remember his death until he returns.

Gospel: Luke 9:11b-17

Jesus spoke to a large crowd when his disciples asked that he dismiss the people to give them a chance to find food and lodging. Jesus asked the disciples to give the crowd something to eat, but they had only five loaves of bread and two fish. Jesus then blessed and distributed the food, which fed about 5,000 people. Twelve baskets were then collected from what was left over.

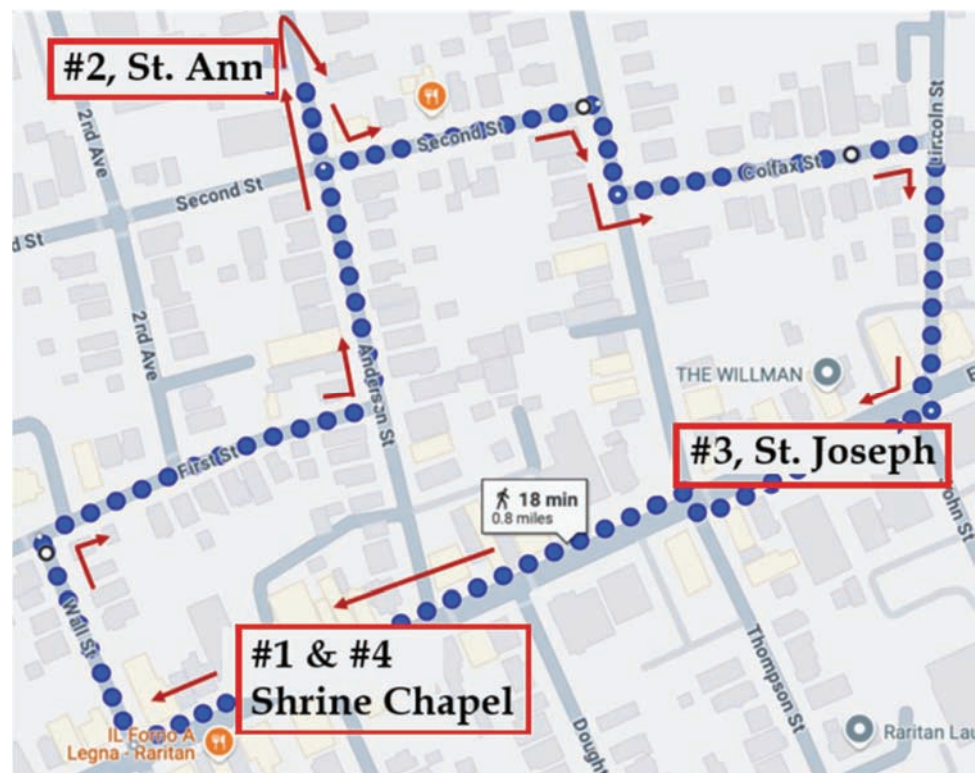

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Friday, June 27, 2025

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is celebrated on the Friday following the second Sunday after Pentecost. This feast, one of the most beloved in the Roman Catholic calendar, honors the physical Heart of Jesus Christ as the visible sign and enduring symbol of His boundless and self-sacrificing love for humanity. The devotion to the Sacred Heart has its roots in Scripture. The Gospel of John recounts how, after Jesus had died on the Cross, a soldier pierced His side with a lance, and from it flowed blood and water (John 19:34). This moment, deeply significant in the theology of the Church, has long been seen as the outpouring of divine love and the birth of the sacraments, particularly the Eucharist and Baptism.

While devotion to the wounded Heart of Christ existed from the early centuries of the Church, it gained particular prominence in the seventeenth century through the private revelations of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French Visitation nun. Between 1673 and 1675, St. Margaret Mary experienced a series of visions in which Christ revealed His Sacred Heart as a source of burning love, wounded by the indifference and ingratitude of sinners. In these revelations, Jesus expressed a desire that the Friday after the octave of Corpus Christi be set apart as a special feast in reparation for the offenses against His Heart.

The devotion spread rapidly throughout Europe, aided by the support of theologians, religious orders, and eventually, papal approval. Pope Pius IX extended the feast to the universal Church in 1856. In 1899, Pope Leo XIII consecrated the entire human race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, an act he called “the greatest act of my pontificate.”

The feast is not only a celebration of God’s love, but a summons to respond to that love with greater fidelity. The image of the Sacred Heart—often depicted as pierced, surrounded by thorns, aflame with love, and surmounted by a cross—calls the faithful to contemplate both the suffering and the mercy of Christ. It invites us to make acts of reparation, to trust in His divine mercy, and to imitate His love in our daily lives.

In a world often marked by coldness and estrangement, the Sacred Heart remains a powerful reminder that God’s love is not abstract or distant. It is tender, personal, and sacrificial. Let us draw near to this Heart that has so loved us—and offer ours in return.

¿Qué se celebra en la Solemnidad de Corpus Christi?



Conocida como **Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo**, esta fiesta honra a Jesucristo, verdadera y realmente presente substancialmente bajo las apariencias del pan y del vino. Esa Presencia ocurre gracias a un cambio que la Iglesia llama transustanciación

(cambio de sustancia), en el momento en que el sacerdote, durante la Consagración en la Misa, dice las palabras que el mismo Cristo pronunció sobre el pan y el vino: “Este es Mi Cuerpo”, “Esta es Mi Sangre”, “Hagan esto en memoria Mía”.

¿Por qué es importante la Solemnidad de Corpus Christi?

La Eucaristía es la “fuente y culmen de la vida cristiana” (Concilio Vaticano II, *Lumen gentium*, 11). En la Eucaristía, Jesús mismo vuelve a presentar Su Sacrificio en el Calvario (Lc 22,19-20; 1 Cor 11,26-29) para beneficio nuestro y se nos da en la Santa Comunión (Ex 16,4; Jn 6,1-14, 48-51), y se queda con nosotros hasta el fin de los tiempos (Lc 24,13-35; Mt 28,18-20). Viene a nosotros en esta humilde forma, haciéndose vulnerable por amor a cada uno de nosotros. Sin embargo, es Dios Mismo, y por tanto el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo merecen nuestro mayor respeto y amor, y también adoración. En el himno “Tantum Ergo” de Santo Tomás de Aquino, rezamos:

Veneremos, pues, inclinados, tan grande Sacramento; y la antigua figura ceda el puesto al nuevo rito; la fe supla la incapacidad de los sentidos.

Para que un católico reciba la comunión, se requiere:

- Estar en estado de Gracia, es decir, libre de cualquier pecado mortal no confesado.
- Abstenerse durante al menos una hora antes de la Sagrada Comunión de cualquier alimento o bebida, a excepción de agua y medicinas.
- Saber a Quien en recibe y acercarse al altar con devoción.

“Por la actitud corporal (gestos, vestido) se manifiesta el respeto, la solemnidad, el gozo de ese momento en que Cristo se hace Nuestro huésped”.
(Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica 1387)
