Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings anytime throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

SUNDAY MASS READING 6/29

First Reading: Acts 12: 1-11

King Herod began to harass some of the members of the Church. James, brother of John, was beheaded. Peter was arrested and imprisoned. Through the power of an angel, light shown in the cell and Peter's chains fell from his wrists. Peter followed the angel to safety and was convinced that the angel was sent by God to save him from Herod.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith," Timothy writes. We hear in this reading the longing for the day of God's reign and how salvation is near. God will continue to rescue us and keep us from harm.

Gospel: Matthew 16:13-19

When Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter exclaims, "You are the Messiah!" Christ then declares that Peter is the "Rock upon which he will build his Church" promising Peter the power "to bind" and "to loose."

JUNE IS DEDICATED TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

**Solemnity of Saints Peter & Paul, Apostles
Fathers of the Roman Church**
By The Marian Fathers of the Immaculate Conception

“The Church can testify that God's grace was not ineffective in Paul, or in Peter. Let us ask their intercession that we, too, may be fruitful, faithful coworkers in the vineyard of the Lord.

We commemorate the two great fathers in the faith of the Roman Church together for a reason.

Saints Peter and Paul share a feast day, **June 29**, as they shared the same faith and the same priesthood with and to Christ the Lord. They labored to found the Church of Rome, and both remain there to this day, Peter buried beneath the main altar in St. Peter's Basilica and St. Paul's tomb is beneath the Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls.

Both are patron saints of the Marian Congregation.

Crucial differences

But there are crucial differences between these two men, these two servants and friends of Christ the Lord. Peter, who had once been Simon the fisherman, a sinful man telling the Lord to depart from his boat (see Lk 5:8), was the Rock.

“Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah. For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father.

And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it.

I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.” - Mt 16:17-19

Paul, who had once been Saul, the Pharisee and persecutor of Jesus in His Body, the Church, was now the Apostle to the Gentiles:

“For I handed on to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accord-

ance with the scriptures; that he was buried; that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve.

After that, he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at once, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. After that he appeared to James, then to all the apostles.

Last of all, as to one born abnormally, he appeared to me. For I am the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.

But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me has not been ineffective. - 1 Cor 15:3-10

The Church can testify that God's grace was not ineffective in Paul, or in Peter. Now, these millennia later, we look back and celebrate the blessed memory of the fathers in the faith of the Church of Christ in Rome, obedient servants of Jesus Christ and sons of the eternal Father, willing collaborators in the workings of the Holy Spirit. Let us ask their intercession that we, too, may be fruitful, faithful coworkers in the vineyard of the Lord.
Saints Peter and Paul, pray for us!

Primera Lectura: Hechos 12:1-11

Una reflexión Salesiana sobre el evangelio dominical por un oblato de San Francisco de Sales

Hoy la Iglesia rompe el ciclo del Tiempo Ordinario para celebrar a los dos grandes apóstoles, Pedro y Pablo. Cada uno de ellos fue enviado por Jesús para establecer su Iglesia sobre fundamentos seguros: Pedro para la comunidad judía y Pablo para los gentiles.

El evangelio de hoy relata la profesión de fe de Pedro en Jesús como "el Cristo, el Hijo del Dios vivo". Jesús aprovecha esa oportunidad para llamar a Pedro "la roca" sobre la que edificará su Iglesia. Jesús le da autoridad para enseñar y tomar decisiones para su nueva comunidad. Jesús conocía bien a Pedro. Pedro podía manifestar una gran fe y amor; También podía ser impulsivo e incluso negarlo. Pero Jesús conocía la humildad y el coraje de Pedro que serían necesarios para nutrir el crecimiento de esta comunidad.

Jesús se reveló a Pablo más tarde en su vida en el camino a Emaús. La conversión de Pablo de un fariseo celoso a un ardiente discípulo de Jesús es una obra espe-


cial de gracia. Pablo finalmente entendió que debía predicar las buenas nuevas al mundo gentil con toda la fuerza que el Señor le dio.

Pedro y Pablo se destacan como hombres de fe y valentía, guiados por el Espíritu Santo. Tú y yo somos parte de la Iglesia cuyos comienzos se nutrieron de sus vidas y ministerios. Celebrar sus fiestas nos da la oportunidad de reflexionar sobre sus vidas y aprender algo más sobre cómo debemos vivir nuestra vida y responder al llamado del Señor al ministerio en nuestra vida diaria.

*La adoración eucarística es un momento de **encuentro personal con Jesús Sacramentado**, donde se fortalece la fe, se recibe paz y se experimenta el amor de Dios. Es una práctica que ayuda a profundizar la relación con Cristo, a crecer en santidad y a recibir gracias para la vida diaria.*

La necesidad absoluta de la Eucaristía se declara en estas palabras de Jesús: “En verdad, en verdad les digo: si ustedes no comen la carne del Hijo del hombre, y no beben su sangre, no tienen vida en ustedes” (Jn 6,53), que el mismo Jesús explica con una comparación: “Yo soy la vid, ustedes los sarmientos... separados de mí no pueden hacer nada” (Jn 15,5), obviamente, porque no tienen vida. De aquí, como una ulterior profundización del Espíritu de la verdad, se desarrolló la adoración eucarística, como hemos dicho.

Respecto de la espiritualidad eucarística, podemos afirmar que no hay ningún santo que no deba su **santificación a la Eucaristía y que no haya hecho de ella el centro de su vida**. No puede ser de otro modo, porque los santos, que no están esclavizados por las pasiones, experimentan con mucha fuerza la presencia y la acción de Cristo en la Eucaristía. Y ellos anhelan, por sobre todo, a Cristo. Dejemos que lo diga San Pablo en representación de todos: “Para mí la vida es Cristo, y la muerte, una ganancia... deseo partir y estar con Cristo, lo cual es, lejos, lo mejor...” (Fil 1,21.23).
