Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings any time throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

Pastoral Care of the Sick

Please call the rectory and let us know when a member of your family is in the hospital so a priest can arrange to visit them. Make sure you contact the Pastoral Care Office in the hospital so the Chaplain can bring you communion daily. **In the event of an emergency please call 908 392-7962 anytime of the day or night.**

Marriages

Please call the office to meet with the Pastor as soon as you become engaged and before any preparations are made. Arrangements should be made one year in advance. Couples preparing for marriage must attend required Pre-Cana sessions within the Diocese along with F.O.C.C.U.S. and sessions with your Parish Priest or Deacon.

SUNDAY MASS READING 8/10

First Reading: Wisdom 18:6-9

In this excerpt, the Israelites are reminded that they were warned before God sent an angel to slay the first born of the Egyptians. God called on them to have courage, and then rewarded them by punishing their enemies and leading them from captivity.

Second Reading: Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19

Faith is described as true belief even toward things we cannot see. Abram's faith in God was so deep that he wandered through a foreign land, convinced God's promise of a homeland was sincere. God honored his promise to give Abram many descendants, and was proud of the deep faith Abram and his people possessed.

Gospel: Luke 12:32-48

Jesus encourages us to be prepared for his return at all times, for he will come when we least expect him. He tells of a master who entrusts his home to his servants, and fully expects them to be awaiting his return. In the same manner, Jesus can arrive at any moment and expects us to be prepared for his return

**A SALESIAN REFLECTION ON THE SUNDAY GOSPEL
BY AN OBLATE OF ST. FRANCIS DE SALES**

Jesus has desired from all eternity to meet us here at this sacred meal.

He invites us to sit down with him and listen as he tells us about our Father's love for us and what our Father desires for us. He will also tell us how we can respond to our Father's loving care for us.

Jesus offers us the example of Abraham and Sarah, our ancestors in the faith, in today's reading from the Letter to the Hebrews. He tells us that we have faith when we accept our God's word as the truth, confident that what God says will become a reality.

Both Abraham and Sarah did just that: They left their homeland for a new land that God promised. They accepted God's word that they would have a child even though they were old. They were willing to sacrifice their son Isaac who was the only evidence they had of God's promise of many descendants. And God gave Isaac back to them as a sign of the truth of God's word to them and as a witness to their confident hope.

Jesus offers their example to us as a reminder. He tells us not to be afraid. Our Father is pleased to give us the kingdom. He invites us to place our trust in our Father's promise, to make our heart's only desire the treasure we have been promised and given.

The sign of our confident hope will be our willingness to be prepared each day: prepared to seek our Father's will for us each day and do it lovingly; prepared to live with Jesus at our side each day, talking with him about our day and listening as he talks to us, often through the people and events of our day; prepared to care gently for each person we will meet today.

Jesus tells us: much will be expected of the person entrusted with much. You and I have been given much by our God. Let us be worthy of the trust our God puts in us as his beloved children.

Let us take what Jesus tells us at this meal and live it out today – and every day. He is here to strengthen us to do just that - for he gives us his Body to eat and his Blood to drink.

WHAT HAPPENED IN THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY?

CCC 966 “Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death” (Pope Pius XII, *Munificentissimus Deus*). The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians:

In giving birth you kept your virginity; in your Dormition you did not leave the world, O Mother of God, but were joined to the source of Life. You conceived the living God and, by your prayers, will deliver our souls from death (Byzantine Liturgy, Troparion, Feast of the Dormition).

WHAT DOES THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY TEACH US?

In a homily for the Assumption, Pope St. John Paul II said, “Taken up into Heaven, Mary shows us the way to God, the way to Heaven, the way to life. She shows it to her children baptized in Christ and to all people of good will. She opens this way especially to the little ones and to the poor, those who are dear to divine mercy. The Queen of the world reveals to individuals and to nations the power of the love of God...”

Una reflexión Salesiana sobre el evangelio dominical por un Oblato de San Francisco de Sales

Las lecturas de hoy nos exhortan a ser siervos fieles de Nuestro Señor. Este es un tema recurrente en los escritos de San Francisco de Sales:

Las Escrituras nos dicen que debemos aferrarnos fuertemente a lo que tememos. Aún así, nosotros somos como los corales que fácilmente se doblan por el movimiento de las corrientes marinas. Como aún habitamos en el mar de este mundo, somos propensos a doblarnos por lado y lado – de un lado por el amor divino, y del otro lado cediendo ante la tentación que representan los Bienes que, aunque vacíos, aparentan ser benéficos.

Estos supuestos Bienes son como zorros que se encargan de destruir Nuestro viñedo; mientras que el amor divino nos urge a que hagamos de Nuestro corazón un lugar fértil, por medio de las buenas obras. Por consiguiente debemos emplear nuestra mente en la práctica del amor Sagrado, para que esos supuestos Bienes no ejerzan su influencia sobre nosotros. La voluntad de Dios no es protegernos de los falsos Bienes. Por el contrario, EL desea que practiquemos el amor Sagrado más plenamente, resistiendo la tentación que estos representan. Lo que EL desea es que combatiendo obtengamos una Victoria, y que por medio de una Victoria obtengamos un triunfo.

Siempre habrá Bienes falsos, como la riqueza y los honores, que despiertan la avaricia en nosotros. Si mantenemos nuestra fe enfocada en la Palabra de Dios podremos, ella distinguirá entre los Bienes Verdaderos por los cuales debemos trabajar, y los falsos que debemos rechazar. Nuestra fe hará que se encienda en nosotros una alarma ante la aparición de un bien falso, por más atractivo que este parezca. Inmediatamente el amor divino rechazará esa falsedad, ya que nuestra fe nos permite ver aquellas cosas que son realmente eternas.

Continuemos perteneciendo a Dios, aún en medio de las múltiples ocupaciones que implican la diversidad de cosas terrenales con las que hemos de lidiar. ¿Qué mayor oportunidad para ofrecer testimonio de nuestra fidelidad, que en los momentos en que todo nos sale mal? Las dificultades nos dan la oportunidad de poner en práctica nuestras virtudes y nuestra confianza en Dios quien desea asistirnos si tan solo solicitamos su ayuda. ¡Qué Felices seremos si viajamos por la vida, y dejamos los brazos de Nuestro Señor solo para caminar, y para hacer todo lo posible por poner en práctica las virtudes y las buenas obras, siempre tomados de la mano de Nuestro Salvador!
