Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings any time throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

Pastoral Care of the Sick

Please call the rectory and let us know when a member of your family is in the hospital so a priest can arrange to visit them. Make sure you contact the Pastoral Care Office in the hospital so the Chaplain can bring you communion daily. **In the event of an emergency please call 908 392-7962 anytime of the day or night.**

Marriages

Please call the office to meet with the Pastor as soon as you become engaged and before any preparations are made. Arrangements should be made one year in advance. Couples preparing for marriage must attend required Pre-Cana sessions within the Diocese along with F.O.C.C.U.S. and sessions with your Parish Priest or Deacon.

SUNDAY MASS READING 8/17

First Reading: Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

Jeremiah urged the people of Jerusalem to surrender to the enemy. This angered the princes, who then requested that Jeremiah be put to death. The king allowed the princes to leave him in a cistern without food or water. But after Ebed Melech pleaded for Jeremiah's life, the king decided to free him.

Second Reading: Hebrews 12:1-4

This letter to the Hebrews inspires all Christians to persevere, in spite of the trials they may face. Jesus endured much suffering and was rewarded by God. Despite our struggles, we must remember Jesus' ability to endure and maintain strong faith in him.

Gospel: Luke 12:49-53

Jesus tells his disciples that his message will not bring peace to the earth. Instead, even families will become sharply divided because some members will embrace him, while others condemn him.

AUGUST IS DEDICATED TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY

**A SALESIAN REFLECTION ON THE SUNDAY GOSPEL
BY AN OBLATE OF ST. FRANCIS DE SALES**

Today's readings remind us of some of the trials we must endure to be sharers in the Lord's Kingdom. St. Francis de Sales tells us not to be afraid of trials. Our faith in the truth of God's word will give us victory over our enemies:

All human good arises from persevering in the truth, rather than abandoning it. Our entire good consists in accepting the truth of God's word, and persevering in it. We may have to suffer to be sharers in the Lord's Kingdom. Yet, when we are armed with the shield of truth and of faith, we will courageously overcome our enemies because our strength is in God and not ourselves.

Fear is the first enemy that comes to us who are resolved to serve God. We think that holiness demands too much of us and we say, "O God, what perfection is needed to live a holy life! It is too high for me. I cannot attain it. I shall never be able to do it." Let us not entertain the vain hope of wishing to be saints in three months! Think of how fainthearted Peter was at the Crucifixion. Let us keep clearly in mind that everyone is tempted. Let us fear neither the temptation nor the tempter. They will have no power whatsoever over us, if we make use of the shield of faith and the armor of truth. It is our faith in the truth of God's word that causes us to succeed in our firm and steadfast resolution to serve God as generously and as perfectly as possible in this life.

Do not fear that you are unable to accomplish what God has called you to do. You are armed with God's truth. God's Word will strengthen you to persevere and to do what is required for your greater welfare and happiness, providing you walk simply in faithful observance. How happy you are who are armed with the truth of God, for it will be your shield against the arrows of your enemies and will make you victorious!

El oficio divino (Liturgia de las Horas) es el conjunto de oraciones (salmos, antífonas, himnos, oraciones, lecturas bíblicas y otras) que la Iglesia ha organizado para ser rezadas en determinadas horas de cada día.

El oficio divino es parte de la liturgia y, como tal, constituye, con la Santa Misa, la plegaria pública y oficial de la Iglesia. Su fin es consagrar las horas al Señor, extendiendo la comunión con Cristo efectuada en el Sacrificio de la Misa. Quien reza el oficio hace un paro en las labores para rezar con la Iglesia aunque se encuentre físicamente solo. Aunque sin duda es necesaria la oración privada, también es necesario que recemos formalmente unidos como Iglesia.

¿Cuáles son estos momentos de oración de la Iglesia en las diferentes Horas del Oficio Divino? Estos momentos son siete:

- Las Laudes (a las 6:00 a.m.)
- La hora intermedia tercia (a las 9:00 a.m.)
- La hora intermedia sexta (a las 12:00 m.)
- La hora intermedia nona (a las 3:00 p.m.)
- Las Vísperas (a las 6:00 p.m.)
- Las Completas (antes del descanso nocturno) y
- El Oficio de Lectura.

La división del día en siete partes tiene su origen en el salmo, que dice: "Siete veces al día te alabo por tus justos juicios". Sal 118, 164
