Baptisms

It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.


If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

SUNDAY MASS READING 9/28

First Reading: Amos 6:1a, 4-7

Amos denounces the selfish attitude of those who surround themselves with luxuries with no concern for others. He goes on to warn that because these people lacked interest in the state of their society, they would be the first to be exiled.

Second Reading: 1 Timothy 6:11-16

Paul tells Timothy to seek integrity, faith and love. Paul urges him to attain everlasting life by maintaining strong faith in Jesus and in God until Jesus returns.

Gospel: Luke 16:19-31

Jesus tells of a rich man who feasted daily, while a beggar named Lazarus went hungry outside his gates. When both men died, Lazarus was taken to Abraham, but the rich man was in torment. SUNDAY'S GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today's readings remind us that we must continually be open to God's love and persevere in the love we owe God. St. Francis de Sales remarks:

Las lecturas de hoy nos recuerdan que continuamente debemos abrirnos a recibir el amor de Dios, y trabajar por ese amor que aún Le debemos. San Francisco de Sales observa lo siguiente:

Ricos y pobres por igual son llamados a cumplir con el servicio que se le debe a Dios. En el Evangelio de hoy vemos como Lázaro, a través del sufrimiento, persevera en su fiel amor a Dios y muere feliz. Mientras que el rico se aferró con tal fuerza a su riqueza que la convirtió en su dios.

Al igual que el rico, nosotros podemos llegar a obsesionarnos con nuestras posesiones. Cuando eso ocurre, oramos para que Dios haga nuestra voluntad, en lugar de orar para nosotros cumplir con la voluntad de Dios. En otras palabras, tratamos de utilizar a Dios como un medio para nuestros fines, lo cual es una ilusión. Dios mismo es nuestro fin verdadero.

La avaricia no es la única inclinación desordenada que podemos llegar a experimentar. Existen otras, que incluyen el egoísmo, la ira, el orgullo o la envidia. Pero si nos abrimos a recibir el amor de Dios, ni nuestro temperamento, ni nuestras inclinaciones, van a entorpecer nuestros continuos esfuerzos por lograr llevar una vida santa. Aun así, no importa cuán abundante sea una fuente de agua, la potencia con que esta agua regará las plantas del jardín es directamente proporcional al tamaño de la canal que la transporta. El Espíritu Santo es como una fuente de agua viva que fluye dentro de nuestros corazones intentando empaparlos con su gracia, siempre y cuando nosotros accedamos a ello. La gracia jamás nos fallará, por el contrario, somos nosotros quienes faltamos a la gracia. El amor vivificante de Dios jamás resulta deficiente, siempre y cuando nosotros tengamos la voluntad de recibirlo.

Después de su conversión San Pablo, quien por naturaleza era astuto, descortés y severo, se abrió completamente a recibir la gracia de Dios. - Saber a Quien en recibe y acercarse al altar con devoción.

"Por la actitud corporal (gestos, vestido) se manifiesta el respeto, la solemnidad, el gozo de ese momento en que Cristo se hace Nuestro huésped". (Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica 1387)
