Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings anytime throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

Pastoral Care of the Sick

Please call the rectory and let us know when a member of your family is in the hospital so a priest can arrange to visit them. Make sure you contact the Pastoral Care Office in the hospital so the Chaplain can bring you communion daily. **In the event of an emergency please call 908 392-7962 anytime of the day or night.**

Marriages

Please call the office to meet with the Pastor as soon as you become engaged and before any preparations are made. Arrangements should be made one year in advance. Couples preparing for marriage must attend required Pre-Cana sessions within the Diocese along with F.O.C.C.U.S. and sessions with your Parish Priest or Deacon.

SUNDAY MASS READING 11/9

First Reading: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

This reading from the Prophet Ezekiel tells of the streaming, healing waters that flow from the temple. These waters restore life to the river's inhabitants as well as the fruit bearing trees along its banks. It is believed that the water signifies blessings, whereas the lack of signifies trouble, hardship.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:9c-11, 16-17

Paul compares us to a building whose foundation has been laid by Jesus. As the people of God, we can only be solid if we are grounded in Christ.

Gospel: John 2:13-22

Near the time of Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem and saw the temple had become a marketplace. He became angry and proceeded to drive out the vendors and livestock. Jesus spoke of destroying the temple and rebuilding it in three days. The Jews did not know Jesus was speaking of his body, but when his resurrection from the dead came to pass, his disciples remembered what Jesus had said and came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.

A SALESIAN REFLECTION ON THE SUNDAY GOSPEL

BY AN OBLATE OF ST. FRANCIS DE SALES

To construct a building is one thing, but to maintain it is another. Prudent builders/owners not only allot resources for the actual construction of whatever it is they build, but they will also earmark resources for the ongoing upkeep of the building.

In a letter to Madame de Chantal (February 11, 1607), Francis de Sales observed:

“It is not necessary to be always and at every moment attentive to all the virtues in order to practice them; that would twist and encumber your thoughts and feelings too much. Humility and charity are the master beams - all the others are attached to them. We need only hold on to these two: one is at the very bottom and the other at the very top. The preservation of the whole building depends on two things: its foundation and its roof. We do not encounter much difficulty in practicing other virtues if we keep our heart bound to the practice of these two...” (LSD, pp. 148-149)

God – the Master Builder – has constructed each of us in his image and likeness. Celebrate the building-of-God that you are! Maintain the gift of your divinely-built edifice with the spiritual foundation and roof most readily available for your good - humility and charity!

You Are Called to a Work of Mercy.

There are souls in need, and you can help.

November is the month of remembrance for Holy Souls in Purgatory. The basis for this special month of remembrance is that many souls, on departing from the body, are not perfectly cleansed from venial sins, or have not fully atoned for past wrongdoing. To quote the Catholic Encyclopedia, they "are debarred from the Beatific Vision," that is, from heaven, until their souls become purified in purgatory.

But here's the thing: We can help them, by our prayers, our almsdeeds and especially by the sacrifice of the Holy Mass. And that's what this special month serves to remind us of: We are called to deepen our commitment to the suffering faithful whose souls are being purified in purgatory, whether they are loved ones or strangers.

Talk about a work of mercy!

To begin this month of special prayers, we can recite the words of St. Faustina: "O Jesus, my love extends beyond the world, to the souls suffering in purgatory, and I want to exercise mercy toward them by means of indulgenced prayers. ... O Jesus, make my heart sensitive to all the sufferings of my neighbor, whether of body or of soul" (Diary of St. Faustina, 692).

We can also offer at least one Chaplet of The Divine Mercy for a soul each day of this month. And if you have the time, attend Mass during the week for the souls of members of your family, parish or diocese...

INAUGURACION DE LA BASILICA LATERANA EN ROMA**Primera Lectura: Ezequiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12**

En esta lectura es el profeta Ezequiel quien cuenta del chorro de aguas curativas que corren del templo. Una reflexión Salesiana sobre el evangelio dominical por un Oblato de San Francisco de Sales

Hoy le prestamos una atención especial a la dedicación de la Archibasílica de San Juan de Letrán en Roma, también conocida como la Basílica Lateranense, que es la sede oficial del Santo Padre, Obispo de Roma. La iglesia fue construida por Constantino, el emperador romano (274-337 AD) que se convirtió al cristianismo. Desde el siglo XII, hemos celebrado la dedicación de la Basílica Lateranense para demostrar nuestra unión con Roma.

Las lecturas de hoy destacan la manera en que una iglesia debe ser dedicada en servicio a Dios. San Francisco de Sales observa lo siguiente:

Aunque Dios está en todas partes todo el tiempo, ¿por qué no habría de querer, en algunas ocasiones, que se algunos lugares sean consagrados para honrar a Nuestro Salvador? Un lugar reservado para el Cuerpo de Cristo, donde en realidad podamos decir, “Verdaderamente, nuestro Señor está aquí”.

Como pueblo de Dios, nosotros somos “piedras vivientes” que construyen la Iglesia y a la vez somos el “edificio de Dios”. Nosotros somos templos de Dios y Su espíritu vive en nosotros. Nuestras buenas obras tienen un gran valor porque provienen del Espíritu Santo. A través del amor divino, el Espíritu realiza estas obras en

nosotros, por nosotros y con nosotros. Nosotros trabajamos conjuntamente con el Espíritu. Las obras y los buenos cristianos tienen un valor tan grande que en recompensa se les otorga el cielo.

Trabajemos en la preparación de Su Iglesia sobre la tierra para Su gloria celestial. El fervor del amor sagrado entre nosotros es el vínculo que nos une en la “Casa de Dios”. Todo lo que no proviene de Dios debilita el espíritu humano y se convierte en un obstáculo para que podamos dedicar nuestros corazones a Dios con la santidad de nuestras vidas. La Iglesia es un hogar colmada de flores de mártires y de santos, cuya constancia y amor son invencibles.

Al igual que estos cristianos que vivieron antes que nosotros, dediquemos nuestros corazones al servicio de Dios para que el Espíritu pueda obrar dentro y a través nuestro, y nos convierta en “piedras vivientes” de la obra de Dios sobre la tierra.

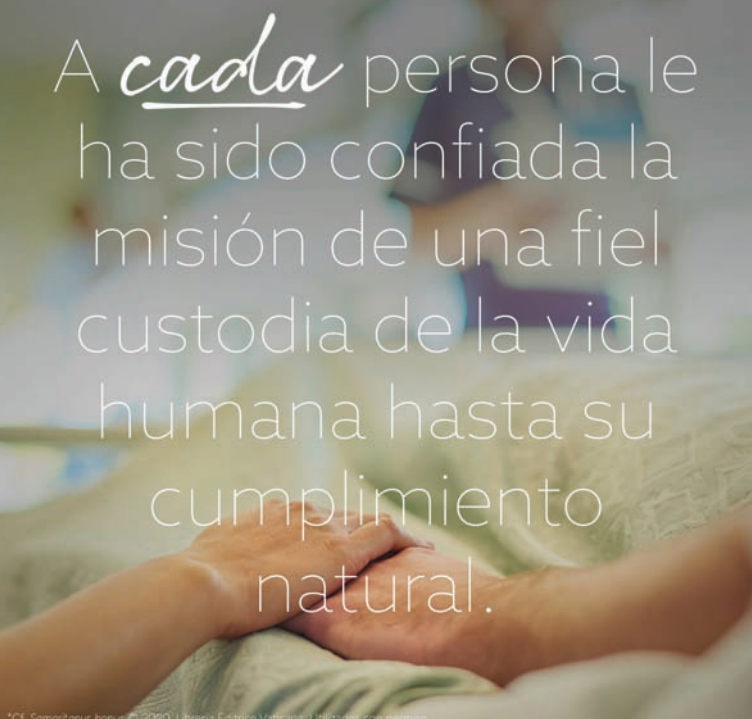
