## Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings any-time throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

## Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.

## Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

## Pastoral Care of the Sick

Please call the rectory and let us know when a member of your family is in the hospital so a priest can arrange to visit them. Make sure you contact the Pastoral Care Office in the hospital so the Chaplain can bring you communion daily. **In the event of an emergency please call 908 392-7962 anytime of the day or night.**

## Marriages

Please call the office to meet with the Pastor as soon as you become engaged and before any preparations are made. Arrangements should be made one year in advance. Couples preparing for marriage must attend required Pre-Cana sessions within the Diocese along with F.O.C.C.U.S. and sessions with your Parish Priest or Deacon.

## Feast of the Holy Family

Celebrated on the Sunday after Christ’s Nativity, the Feast of the Holy Family invites us to turn our gaze from the Christmas crib to the household. Mary, Joseph, and Jesus, living together an ordinary human life under extraordinary grace. Nazareth was small and unnoticed, yet it held the life of the world. The Holy Family knew fatigue and fear, uncertainty and silence. The Gospels speak of journeys and displacements, of misunderstanding and anxiety, of work and waiting. Joseph rises in the night to flee to Egypt. Mary searches anxiously for her lost Son. Jesus grows “in wisdom and stature” through the slow rhythm of years. Yet they lived these things together, under God’s promise. Their home at Nazareth became holy not because it was spared suffering, but because love, obedience, and trust in God were practiced there day by day. At the heart of the Holy Family stands Jesus. Mary and Joseph do not fully “understand” Him, yet they treasure what they do not grasp.

Every Christian family, in its own way, is asked to do the same: when prayer is offered, forgiveness practiced, and sacrifices accepted for love’s sake, Christ dwells in the home. The Feast of the Holy Family reminds us that family life is God’s chosen school of love. It is there that we first learn patience, obedience, gratitude, and mercy. It is there that our selfishness is gently, and sometimes painfully, exposed and healed. In an age that often treats family as optional or fragile, the Church proclaims it as a vocation—a path by which ordinary people are formed for holiness. As we celebrate this feast, we might ask whether our homes are open to God. Do we make room for prayer? Do we bear one another’s burdens? Do we allow love to grow through service and sacrifice? May the Holy Family bless our homes with peace, strengthen them in trials, and teach us to discover God’s grace in the ordinary rhythms of love and life.

### Sunday Mass Readings

#### THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY AND JOSEPH

##### First Reading: Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

This passage from Sirach details the duties children owe to father and mother. Their life-long devotion will not be forgotten and “will take lasting root.”

##### Second Reading: Colossians 3:12-21

Paul urges Christians particularly in the setting of the family, to “clothe” themselves with kindness, patience, humility, and mercy; to forgive; and, above all, to love!

##### Gospel: Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

An angel of the Lord, appearing in a dream to Joseph, urges him to flee with Jesus and Mary to Egypt to escape the murderous schemes of Herod. Later, in another dream, an angel tells Joseph to go with Jesus and Mary to a town called Nazareth in the region of Galilee, thus fulfilling the Scriptures: “He shall be called a Nazarean.”

## A Catholic Guide to the Traditional 40 Days of Christmas

...In the new liturgical calendar, the Christmas season ends with the Baptism of Our Lord, which is either the Sunday or Monday after the Epiphany of the Lord. This year it falls on Jan. [4, a Sunday]. This nominal ending, however, does not exclude Catholics from continuing the traditional pious practices of the Church, for even with the change from liturgical white to liturgical green, there is one more feast to come connected to Our Lord's nativity. This feast falls on Feb. 2, and its traditional name is Candlemas Day, the day on which candles are blessed for the year. In the new Church calendar, it is called the Presentation of Our Lord; in the traditional calendar, it is called the Purification of the Blessed Virgin. This last Christmas feast is found in Scripture, in Luke 2:22-38, which explains how the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph follow the Mosaic Law... the Blessed Mother, who as sinless does not need to be purified, participating in the purification of the world. In her obedience to the law, "she serves the fulfillment of the promises." These days between the naming of her son and her purification are sacred days we have to spend with the heart of the Blessed Mother. We can have our prayer times with the Blessed Mother and Mother Church, complete with loving adoration, praise and thanksgiving. 

## REFLEXIÓN SALESIANA LA SAGRADA FAMILIA

### Una reflexión salesiana sobre el Evangelio dominical por un Oblato de San Francisco de Sales

“Honrad a tu madre y a tu padre.”

Perspectiva Salesiana

La selección del día de hoy del Libro de Sirach hace eco al Mandamiento que dice: “Honrad a tu padre y a tu madre.” Lo que la lectura nos está diciendo es que la verdadera religión implica obligaciones morales para con los demás, las cuales a su vez evolucionan de nuestras propias obligaciones morales para con nuestros padres. Nuestras relaciones con los demás, especialmente con aquellos con quienes compartimos tanto tiempo, con quienes estamos en contacto a diario, son la expresión primaria de la disposición de nuestros corazones, nuestras mentes, nuestros afectos y nuestras actitudes.

La selección de la Carta de los Colosios nos habla del regalo – y del reto- de crear ese “espacio” al que llamamos “familia,” un espacio en el que principalmente aprendamos algo de lo que significa ser los hijos y las hijas de Dios. Como los escogidos de Dios, santo y amado, debemos revestirnos con compasión, con bondad, con humildad, con docilidad y con paciencia. En la medida en que una vida santa no es lo mismo que una vida libre de estrés ni de problemas (sino observen por ejemplo la vida, especialmente los primeros años de vida, de Jesús, María y José), todos nosotros debemos practicar estas virtudes todo el tiempo y con la esperanza de que podamos establecer, mantener y fortalecer a la familia, especialmente – Dios no lo quiera- cuando reñimos, nos distraemos o nos decepcionamos los unos a los otros.

Francisco de Sales nos invita a vivir una vida llena de devoción de formas que encajen con las demandas y las responsabilidades acordes con el estado y etapa actual de nuestras vidas. Qué es una vida devota? Es una vida no más difícil (pero si mucho más exigente) que hacer lo que es correcto a los ojos de Dios, y en relación con los demás, cuidadosamente, frecuentemente y diligentemente. Es precisamente en la vocación en la que nos encontramos con nosotros mismos, especialmente en esos roles básicos como el de ser madre, padre, hermano, hermana, esposa, esposo, hijo o hija, que debemos practicar la vida devota.


Francisco de Sales nos dice que: “Las virtudes pequeñas, poco llamativas, aquellas en las cuales casi nunca

nos fijamos, que son requeridas de nosotros en nuestras casas, en nuestros trabajos, con nuestros amigos, con extraños, en todo momento y en todos los momentos, esas son las virtudes para nosotros.” (Introducción, Parte III, Capítulo 2). Por supuesto que lo más importante es la práctica del amor, ya que este no solo contribuye a la reconciliación sino que también a la purificación, y, me atrevo a decir, que contribuye a la glorificación de las relaciones humanas. Es solo cuando nos relacionamos entre nosotros que debemos practicar esas pequeñas virtudes, esas virtudes cotidianas, para así ayudar a crear una vida mejor aquí en la tierra, y también para proveernos una muestra de la vida eterna que nos ha sido prometida en el cielo.

Ahora que celebramos la festividad de la Sagrada Familia nos damos cuenta de que realmente es muy poco lo que sabemos sobre las interacciones cotidianas entre Jesús, María y José: la vida en familia es en cierta forma un talento. Pero si consideramos a fondo la fidelidad y la consistencia de Jesús en su lucha por la justicia, la paz, la reconciliación y la libertad, verdaderamente podemos llegar a intuir dónde fue que él adquirió, siendo un niño, muchos de los talentos que su ministerio le requirió al convertirse en adulto.

Después de todo, la caridad, la paz, la justicia, el perdón – como muchas otras cosas- comienzan en casa.
