Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings any time throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

Pastoral Care of the Sick

Please call the rectory and let us know when a member of your family is in the hospital so a priest can arrange to visit them. Make sure you contact the Pastoral Care Office in the hospital so the Chaplain can bring you communion daily. **In the event of an emergency please call 908 392-7962 anytime of the day or night.**

Marriages

Please call the office to meet with the Pastor as soon as you become engaged and before any preparations are made. Arrangements should be made one year in advance. Couples preparing for marriage must attend required Pre-Cana sessions within the Diocese along with F.O.C.C.U.S. and sessions with your Parish Priest or Deacon.

A SALESIAN REFLECTION ON THE SUNDAY GOSPEL

BY AN OBLATE OF ST. FRANCIS DE SALES

Today we begin the cycle of ordinary Sundays of the year - a time when the Church once again focuses our attention on the reality of God’s kingdom present among us in the life and ministry of Jesus.

In the gospel passage we just heard, John the Baptist identifies Jesus as “God’s Chosen One,” the servant spoken about by the prophet Isaiah. He is the One who is “a light to the nations” so that the salvation planned by our God may reach the ends of the earth.

Through our baptism, you and I have been incorporated into God’s saving plan. As St. Paul tells us, we are “called to be a holy people, consecrated in Christ Jesus.” We are members of his Church and therefore part of Jesus’ continuing presence in the world. We share in his prophetic mission to be “a light to the nations,” announcing the good news of salvation to the ends of the earth.

It’s very easy to forget that you and I have an obligation to be light to the nations, even though most of us have little contact with “the ends of the earth.” We have to remind ourselves frequently that we are essential parts of the body of Christ. While we may not be able to reach very far physically, we can give strength to those who do. The power of our prayer for those who minister the good news and for their people is invaluable. How often our brother Oblates who minister in Africa or South America or India have thanked us for our prayers which give them the strength they need to carry on their efforts for the Church.

Today might be a good time to renew our efforts of prayer on their behalf. We might even take a few minutes this week to write to one of them, reminding him (and ourselves) of our prayer for him and his people. As we prepare to celebrate the feast of Francis de Sales this week, we might offer a day of fidelity in our practice of the Directory for our brother Oblates who serve the Church far from home. In this way, we can stir up in our own hearts a sense of connection with the mission of the Church and, in the process, assist others in coming to know Jesus as God’s Chosen One.

Una reflexión Salesiana sobre el evangelio dominical por un Oblato de San Francisco de Sales

En el Evangelio de hoy, el testimonio que ofrece Juan Bautista declara que Jesús, el Hijo de Dios, viene a erradicar el pecado del mundo. San Francisco de Sales ofrece las siguientes palabras al respecto:

Juan Bautista aceptó y proclamó a Jesús como el Hijo de Dios. Hubo personas que se negaron a reconocer a Jesús como el Salvador. Juan Bautista fue un hombre de gran humildad. El primer paso para alcanzar la humildad es que no pretendamos que se nos estime, o se nos idealice, por lo que no somos. Juan Bautista rechazó todos los honores y títulos que se le ofrecieron. El pudo haber enfocado la atención en sí mismo, pero por el contrario, reconoció a Jesús como el Redentor, y se encargó de encaminar a los demás hacia El.

Ahora bien, el éxito puede ser algo excelente: si lo disfrutamos y nos regocijamos en él porque glorifica a Dios,

quien es el autor de todos nuestros logros. Aún así, el éxito y la ambición, ambos tienen la capacidad de seducir el corazón humano. Desafortunadamente nuestra naturaleza siempre se muestra demasiado ansiosa por atraer todo aquello que le represente un beneficio. Las personas siempre buscan erigir ídolos e imágenes las cuales consideran dioses ¿Cuántos de nosotros nos dejamos deslumbrar por cosas mundanas como la elegancia, el prestigio, la superioridad y la celebridad? En ese sentido nuestra forma de actuar es completamente diferente a la de Juan Bautista. Su espíritu sobrepasaba el espíritu de nuestro tiempo. Caminando por la senda de la humildad, Juan Bautista aceptó la grandeza de Nuestro Señor, y reconoció su dependencia en el Hijo de Dios como su guía.

Juan Bautista se rehusó a dejarse llevar por la vanidad. Padeció el martirio como verdadero amante de la verdad que era. Aún cuando nosotros no hemos sido llamados a ser mártires, debemos tener coraje para sufrir y pelear sobre todo en aquellos momentos en que las pequeñas tentaciones nos asechan. Si deseamos hacerle frente al mal, primero debemos armarnos con suficiente humildad para reconocer nuestra dependencia en la grandeza y la bondad de Dios. Si deseamos madurar en el amor divino, primero comencemos por imitar a Juan Bautista, aceptando al Amo de la verdad y la bondad en nuestros corazones. Una vez hayamos logrado esto, entonces podremos guiar a los demás en dirección a Nuestro Salvador: La luz de todas las naciones.
