Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings any time throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

Pastoral Care of the Sick

Please call the rectory and let us know when a member of your family is in the hospital so a priest can arrange to visit them. Make sure you contact the Pastoral Care Office in the hospital so the Chaplain can bring you communion daily. **In the event of an emergency please call 908 392-7962 anytime of the day or night.**

Marriages

Please call the office to meet with the Pastor as soon as you become engaged and before any preparations are made. Arrangements should be made one year in advance. Couples preparing for marriage must attend required Pre-Cana sessions within the Diocese along with F.O.C.C.U.S. and sessions with your Parish Priest or Deacon.

PALM SUNDAY MASS READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

In a tone of quiet sadness, Isaiah describes the buffets and insults given to the Suffering Servant. The passage ends on a note of hope.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

In exultant tones, Paul tells the Philippians to rejoice because Christ became man, died on the cross, rose from the dead, and sits triumphantly at the right hand of the Father.

Gospel: Matthew 26:14—27:66

This is the solemn narrative of the passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. Matthew recounts the treachery and betrayal of Judas and then describes the events of the Last Supper, culminating in the institution of the Eucharist. Jesus endures the Agony in the Garden; he is then brought before Caiaphas and Pilate and condemned to death. After His resurrection, the centurions shouted, "Clearly this was the Son of God!"

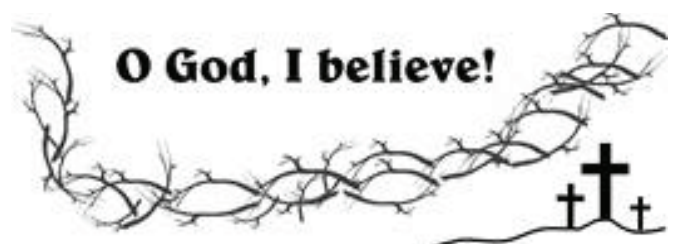

Bookends of the Spiritual Life: Palm Sunday and Good Friday

“They brought the ass and the colt and laid their cloaks over them, and He sat upon them. The very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and strewed them on the road. The crowds preceding Him and those following kept crying out and saying: “Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is He who comes in the Name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest.” And when He entered Jerusalem the whole city was shaken and asked, “Who is this?”

And the crowds replied, “This is Jesus the prophet, from Nazareth in Galilee.” - Mt 21:7-11

Palm Sunday and Good Friday are bookends of the spiritual life in a lot of ways. We welcome Christ as liberator, as Savior, as King of our lives and Lord of our hearts - when we think we're going to get what we want. When He begins to act as Lord and demands of us that which we don't wish to sacrifice, that obedience that runs contrary to our desires, our hopes, our fears, our plans, then suddenly He becomes a King crowned with thorns on a throne of pain, beckoning us to join Him on the wood. But without the Cross, there is no Resurrection.

Without putting our disordered desires to death, they shall never rise again filled with supernatural life, oriented toward the love at the heart of the Trinity, as God intends. Without accepting the pains of study and intellectual labor - our crown of thorns - our intellects will never be enlightened with the light of heaven and the radiance of the Three-in-One.

Without bending our backs to the yoke of the cross and patiently enduring the long labor of Calvary, our wills shall remain weak, unable to desire the good as God intends, with the ferocity and passion of the fire of the Holy Spirit.

This is Christianity: We must die to live; we must sacrifice to receive; we must surrender the natural in order to receive the natural made supernatural by grace.

Hosannas!

So as Holy Week begins, let us welcome our King, the Son of David, with hosannas. Let us lay our palms beneath the feet of His mount, and never forget that the palm is an ancient symbol of martyrdom. He comes, yes, this crucified and risen King in His glory, and mercies stream from His hands and side. He is radiant, yes, a light to the nations - but remember that this light searches all, sees all, calls us to repent of all sin, to struggle with every vice, to lay everything down in order to

receive Him, for when we receive Him, we receive all that is good along with Him.

Do not be afraid, for Christ is with us. The science of the Cross is the wisdom of God, and a path of life and light for us all, if only we have the love and humility to walk it. So sing hosanna to the King who comes in the Name of the Lord, and pray for the grace and strength to walk with Him all the way from joy to pain to death to resurrection and glory.

Ask His faithful Mother for her prayers and for a share in her love for Him, for it is only with a love like hers that we will be able to walk the long road of Christian discipleship, dying to self the entire way, until the day comes when all things are made new in Jesus Christ our Lord.

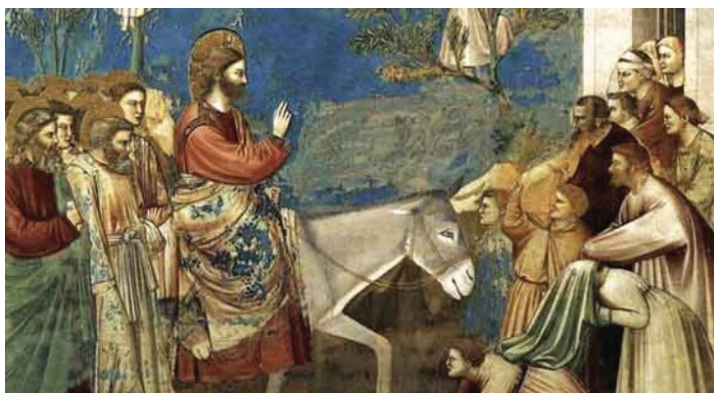

DOMINGO DE RAMOS

Hoy caminamos con Jesús rumbo al Monte Calvario. Con Su muerte en la Cruz, todos pudimos experimentar el amor abnegado que El siente por nosotros. Nosotros también hemos sido llamados a imitarle. San Francisco de Sales comenta:

Contraria a la sabiduría de la cultura, los verdaderos cristianos que buscan la santidad depositan toda su perfección en la locura de la Cruz. Todos los santos se hicieron sabios en su locura por seguir a Jesús. Ellos padecieron las humillaciones y el desprecio de los eruditos, los conocedores de la cultura. Aun así, ellos lavaron sus pies y sus manos en las aguas sagradas del perdón. Nosotros también debemos limpiar nuestras obras, y nuestros afectos, para poder glorificar a Dios.

Tal y como lo hicieron los Santos, debemos ir al Monte Calvario con nuestro Señor, pasar trabajos, y soportar persecuciones. Cuando los problemas externos e internos se apoderen de ustedes, tomen sus buenas resoluciones y, como lo haría una madre que rescata a su hijo del peligro, deposítenlas sobre las heridas de nuestro Señor y pídanle que los proteja, tanto a ustedes como a ellas. Como nos demuestra Jesús, el hecho de que podamos pecar no significa que tenemos poder, por el contrario, significa que hemos quedado indefensos. Incluso las persecuciones que Jesús tuvo que soportar a manos de sus enemigos, no fueron lo suficientemente poderosas como para destruir el amor constante e incomparablemente sólido que Nuestro Salvador siente por todos nosotros.
