Baptisms

Baptisms are usually held on Saturday mornings any time throughout the year (**with the exception of the Lenten Season**). Parents must be registered parishioners and complete a Baptismal Preparation class. It is required that godparents are no less than 16 years of age and have completed the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. If the godparents are a married couple, they need to have been married by the Catholic Church. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the class and the date of Baptism.

Sponsor Certificates

Sponsors (Godparents) for Baptism and Confirmation are required to verify their eligibility. They must be fully initiated Catholic who actively practice their faith and are in good standing with the Church. For more information please contact the Parish Office.

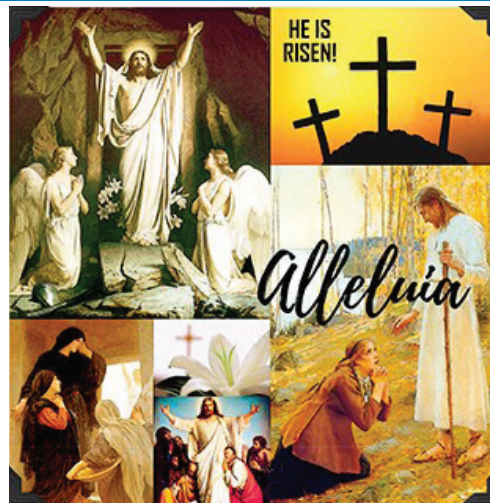
If you are considering becoming Catholic, or desire to complete your sacraments, please contact the Parish Office for more information about RCIA.

Marriages

Please call the office to meet with the Pastor as soon as you become engaged and before any preparations are made. Arrangements should be made one year in advance. Couples preparing for marriage must attend required Pre-Cana sessions within the Diocese along with F.O.C.C.U.S. and sessions with your Parish Priest or Deacon.

SUNDAY MASS READING

“ **Keep me, O God, for in you I take refuge; I say to the LORD, "My Lord are you." O LORD, my allotted portion and my cup, you it is who hold fast my lot. (Psalm 16 9-10, 11)**

First Reading: Acts 2:14, 22-33

After the Holy Spirit descends upon the apostles, Peter preaches with great enthusiasm to both Jews and Christians. He recalls for them in vivid terms the miracles and wonders that Jesus performed.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1:17-21

Peter makes reference to the Passover, when the Jews escaped from Egypt because the blood of the paschal lamb was shed. Now they are being saved from sin by the blood of Christ, the Lamb of the New Testament.

Gospel: Luke 24:13-35

Jesus reveals Himself to two disciples on the way to Emmaus. After explaining to them the passages in Scripture which referred to Him, Christ “took bread, broke it, and distributed it to them.” Then they recognized Christ and their “hearts burned within them.”

A SALESIAN REFLECTION ON THE SUNDAY GOSPEL
BY AN OBLATE OF ST. FRANCIS DE SALES

In today's Gospel Luke gives us a feel for the disciples' encounter with the risen Jesus. He also gives us the essentials for a Christian liturgy. Once the Scriptures have been opened and the bread has been broken and shared, the eyes of the disciples who have gathered are opened ever wider and once again Jesus is recognized among us. We are so moved in our faith by this encounter that we rush out to share the good news we have come to recognize more clearly as word and sacrament were celebrated.

Notice the disciples' remark: "Were not our hearts burning inside us as he talked to us on the road and explained the Scriptures to us?" Their words indicate an eagerness and an openness to listening to whatever Jesus was saying to them. That attitude of openness and eagerness to listening to Jesus' words allowed their hearts to be touched by what they heard.

We have to bring that same attitude of openness and eagerness to listen to our celebration. We have to be attentive to the Scriptures readings for they are the living word of God, meant to teach us about our lives and how God is working in them.

We also have to come to each celebration of Eucharist with an active faith, believing that Jesus is present, offering himself to the Father for our sins and feeding us with his Body and Blood to strengthen us on our journey.

It's very easy for all of us to come to Eucharist out of routine and forget that we encounter our God in the celebration. The more alive our faith is as we celebrate, the deeper the word of God can speak to us and the more fully we are nourished. We will be able to experience what the disciples on the road experienced - our hearts burning within us as Jesus speaks to us and nourishes us.

Perhaps, then, we will feel a greater urgency to share the good news we have experienced in faith-filled, Jesus-filled living.

Domingos Salesiano Una reflexión Salesiana sobre el evangelio dominical por un oblato de San Francisco de Sales!

Por los Padres Marianos de la Inmaculada Concepción

Hoy los discípulos de Jesús experimentan el amanecer de la fe en Jesús resucitado, cuando lo encuentran en el camino a Emaús. San Francisco de Sales hace la siguiente observación:

Jesús, vestido como un peregrino, se encuentra con dos de Sus discípulos en el camino a Emaús. El les hace preguntas relacionadas a las conversaciones que han sostenido sobre Su resurrección, pero ellos no lo reconocen. Después de confesar las dudas que están experimentando en lo concerniente a Su resurrección, Jesús los instruye y los ilumina con Sus palabras. Entonces, en el momento en que Jesús se dispone a compartir el pan con ellos, finalmente reconocen al Salvador resucitado y creen en El.

Cuando una persona escucha con gusto la divina palabra, esto es una muy buena señal. Nosotros estamos en comunicación constante con Dios, quien nunca deja de hablar a nuestros corazones por medio de las inspiraciones y de los movimientos sagrados. Dios nos otorga a cada uno de nosotros las inspiraciones necesarias para vivir, trabajar, y mantener nuestras vidas en el espíritu.

Cuando Dios nos da la fe, El entra en nuestras almas, y con simpatía nos plantea que debemos creer a través de la inspiración. Pero nuestra alma, sumida en la oscuridad y la penumbra, sólo atisba un destello de esas verdades. Es como la tierra cuando está cubierta de niebla. No podemos ver el sol, pero alcanzamos a vislumbrar algo de su luz. Esta luz oscura de la fe entra en nuestro espíritu, y paso a paso nos lleva a amar la belleza de la verdad de Dios personificada en Jesucristo, y a creer en ella.

La fe es la mejor amiga de nuestro espíritu humano. La fe nos afirma la bondad infinita de Dios, y por lo tanto nos otorga suficientes razones para amarlo con todo nuestro poder. Permitan, con alegría, que las

palabras de Nuestro Salvador alimenten sus corazones cual si fuesen un valioso unguento sanador colmado de esperanza.

Indulgencia de San Francisco

El 10 de enero de 2026, Su Santidad el Papa León XIV declaró un Año Jubilar especial de San Francisco con motivo del 800.º aniversario de la muerte de San Francisco de Asís. Este jubileo invita a todo cristiano fiel, siguiendo el ejemplo del Santo de Asís, a “convertirse en un modelo de santidad de vida y un testigo constante de paz”. La Penitenciaría Apostólica, conforme a la voluntad del Santo Padre, concedió una indulgencia plenaria en esta ocasión durante el período comprendido entre el 10 de enero de 2026 y el 10 de enero de 2027.



La indulgencia puede obtenerse bajo las condiciones ordinarias y realizando una peregrinación a cualquier iglesia conventual franciscana o a un lugar de culto dedicado a San Francisco de Asís (por ejemplo, nuestra Catedral) o vinculado a él, y luego participar en celebraciones litúrgicas o dedicar al menos un tiempo razonable a la meditación piadosa y elevar oraciones a Dios.

LECTURAS DEL DOMINGO

Primera Lectura: Hechos 2:14, 22-33

Luego de que el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre los apóstoles, Pedro predicó con gran entusiasmo tanto a los judíos como a los cristianos. Les recordó con gran detalle los milagros y maravillas que Jesús ha hecho.

Segunda Lectura: 1 Pedro 1:17-21

San Pedro hace referencia a las festividades de pascua, cuando los judíos escaparon de Egipto pues la sangre del cordero pascual había sido derramada. Ahora se salvarían del pecado por medio de la sangre de Cristo, el Cordero del Nuevo Testamento.

Evangelio: San Lucas 24:13-35

Jesús se muestra a dos discípulos en camino a Emaús. Luego de explicarles los pasajes de las Escritura que se refieren a El, Cristo “tomó el pan, lo partió, y se los dió.” Entonces ellos reconocieron a Cristo y “el corazón les ardía en el pecho”.

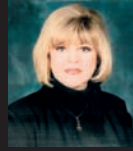
