

## LITURGY OF THE WORD

### First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. Raise your eyes and look about; they all gather and come to you: your sons come from afar, and your daughters in the arms of their nurses.

Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow, for the riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you, the wealth of nations shall be brought to you. Caravans of camels shall fill you, dromedaries from Midian and Ephah; all from Sheba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the LORD.

### Second Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6

Brothers and sisters: You have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit, namely, that the mystery was made known to me by revelation. It was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

### Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: *And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel.*"

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

## Profession of Faith - The Nicene Creed



**Children and Youth Programs:** A second collection was taken at all the Christmas Masses to help support this important effort in the Diocese of Pittsburgh. The proceeds of the collection are also counted toward the Parish Share Program assessment for Christ the King Parish in 2021. It is not too late to make a contribution by using the special envelope that is in your parish packet. Please be as generous as your means will allow.

**2022 Parish Calendar:** Thanks to the generosity of Worrell Funeral Home in Sharpsburg, Smith Funeral Home in Blawnox, and Weddell-Ajak Funeral Home in Aspinwall, we have the new calendars for 2022 which are available for distribution in the vestibule of our churches. Please take one for your home or for a neighbor, parishioner or friend who is unable to get to church.

**Madonna of Jerusalem Church:** A limited amount of scaffolding was built at the corner of the church to catch any additional brick and mortar that may fall from the building. The scaffolding cannot be built to the full height necessary to repair the damaged part of the church building until Duquesne Light moves the electrical power lines that are too close to the church. The process is slow because we are waiting for Duquesne Light to do their work. They have not yet given us a date when that project may be completed. Patience, patience, patience!

**Saint Edward School Building:** Officials from the Department of Property and Planning in the Diocese of Pittsburgh are seeking bids to determine the cost of replacing the roof on the building as well as what it would cost to remove asbestos and demolish the building. This is a topic that is under discussion. No decision has been made. Christ

the King Parish needs to consider carefully the most responsible way to utilize resources in the management and use of our many buildings.

### The Three Wise Men

We sing songs, give gifts, and move three mysterious men into our manger scenes. There's a rich heritage in the Catholic Church of celebrating the magi, but their origins are steeped in mystery. The original Greek calls these men magoi. The word is translated elsewhere in Scripture to mean "magician," but a similar word was used in ancient history to describe an entirely different set of people altogether. In what is now modern-day Iran, the ruling empire had a wealthy priestly caste known as the Magi. At the time of Christ, the Magi formed one of the ruling councils of the Parthian Empire. These priests interpreted dreams and read the stars to anticipate major events that could affect the fortunes of the empire.

We're not exactly sure where the magi of the Gospels traveled from. Matthew simply says "the east." History tells us that the ancient regions of Persia, Assyria, and Babylon all had a magi priesthood at the time of Christ. Whichever region they hailed from, they likely traveled over one thousand miles over the course of several months to arrive at the Holy Family. Unfortunately for the classic song, there is no concrete evidence these men were themselves kings, though they did bear gifts "from afar" at the prompting of their astronomical calculations. ©LPi

and all who inhabit it.**





### “You are only as sick as your secrets”

I remember growing up that my one aunt kept everything that happened in the family a secret. She would never let one of her kids know if one of their brothers or sisters needed help or were in trouble; she would handle it. Those secrets, over the years, became walls, driving her kids apart. They really never knew each other! They never shared their truths.

This “secret” world is often the world where the alcoholic/addict chooses to live. This world of secrets can be very toxic because as long as we live in the shadow of truth and transparency, we remain strangers to ourselves. We rob ourselves of our truth. Our addiction, which nourishes our shame, is fed by lies and secrets. And this just feeds into denial, which feeds the great lie – that I am just fine!

One of the great tragedies about these secrets is that not just the addict, but also those who love them, also feed into this abyss of lies and shame, which only feed denial! For the sufferer, who has been living with secrets, honesty, transparency and truth are totally unknown. And recovery, in order to be real, must be built on truth!

Living and knowing your truth is liberating. It takes time. It takes the support of others. It takes courage and honesty. But to let go of the lie and live the truth is essential on the road to recovery. As step four and five say, “Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves, and admitted to God and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.”

This call to radical honesty and humility opens up the path to recovery, challenging the sufferer to live their truth, embrace their reality, and place their trust in God.


