### First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14



Likewise a Levite came to the place, and when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper with the instruction, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.' Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."




## Appalachia 2022

# A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

My dear parishioners,

The time is now. With one fewer priest to serve Christ the King Parish it is necessary to change the weekend and weekday Mass schedule in our churches. As indicated in last week's bulletin letter, I sought input from parish staff and members of the Finance and Pastoral councils. Based on their suggestions and in discussion with Father Bill Siple, I presented the following new Mass schedule to Father Phil Farrell, the Episcopal Vicar for the Northern Vicariate in the Diocese of Pittsburgh. He reviewed the schedule and gave his approval. Therefore, this new schedule will go into effect next weekend, July 16-17.

## Weekend Mass Schedule

### Saturday Vigil Masses:

4:00 pm Saint Joseph Church  
5:00 pm Saint Scholastica Church

### Sunday Masses:

8:00 am Saint Edward Church  
9:00 am Saint Joseph Church  
9:30 am Saint Scholastica Church  
11:00 am Saint Joseph Church  
11:30 am Saint Mary Church

The decision was made to keep an early morning Mass as well as a later Mass. Note that the 8:00 o'clock Sunday morning Mass in Saint Francis of Assisi Church is transferred to the larger church of Saint Edward and the 10:00 o'clock Mass there is removed from the schedule. The 12:00 Noon Mass in Saint Scholastica Church is also removed from the schedule since it is the least attended. Therefore, those who prefer a later time for Mass may attend the 11:30 Mass at Saint Mary Church in Sharpsburg.

With this schedule, the number of weekend Masses is reduced from 10 to 7. The 3 Masses removed from the schedule are the previous 4:30 Saturday vigil Mass in Madonna of Jerusalem Church, the 10:00 on Sunday morning in Saint Edward Church, and the 12:00 Noon in Saint Scholastica Church.

Moving forward, Saint Francis of Assisi Church will no longer have a Sunday Mass. However, Father Mike Decewicz will continue to offer daily Mass in Saint Francis Church at 12:00 Noon on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. Madonna of Jerusalem will also not have a weekend Mass, but when the exterior repair work on the building is completed, Mass will be offered in Madonna Church on Tuesday and Thursday morning at 9:00 o'clock.

# NEWS and ANNOUNCEMENTS

**Madonna of Jerusalem Church:** The repair work on the exterior of the building will begin on Monday, July 11<sup>TH</sup>. The temporary scaffolding will be taken down and Mariani & Richards, Inc. will begin the assembly of their own scaffolding on both the left and right front of the church. The contract calls for the work to be completed within 60 days. Hopefully it will take less time than that. When all is completed and the doors of Madonna Church are open again for worship, we will resume with weekday Mass on Tuesdays and Thursdays at 9:00 am.

This has been a long and anxious time of waiting for many parishioners. It will be a joyful day when we can again worship in Madonna of Jerusalem Church.

**Roe v. Wade:** A Supreme Court decision in 1973 rankled the nation as to the legality and/or constitutionality of a woman's right to abort a child in her womb. Ever since, countless words have been written in support of the decision and others in opposition. While an annual March for Life was initiated to raise a collective voice on behalf of the unborn, simultaneously demonstrations gave voice to those who argued for choice and freedom in the matter of life. The argument has continued unabated.

On June 24, 2022 the Supreme Court of the United States made a decision reversing that of 1973. It has been received with utmost gratitude by those who name themselves as pro-life and harsh criticism by those who demand the right to choose.

In the argumentation of 50 years, the Catholic Church has stood steadfast on the side of life from the moment of conception to the time of natural death. It is a place where we must continue to stand and remain earnest in our defense of human life, both that which grows in the womb and that life which walks the face of the earth.

May charity be the foundation upon which we stand in the face of criticism and disagreement when faced with those whose views are different than ours. May courage underpin our willingness to be identified as PRO-LIFE.

**From Father Michael:** I read this book entitled, "Courage to Change," for part of my daily meditation. I want to share with you this reflection in the book from June 30.

While walking through the woods one day, I was surprised to hear a child's voice. I followed the sound, trying in vain to understand the child's words. When I spotted a boy perched on a rock, I realized why his words had made no sense; he was repeating the alphabet. "Why are you saying your ABCs so many times?" I asked him. The child replied, "I am saying my prayers." I couldn't help but laugh. "Prayers?" All I hear is the alphabet." Patiently the child explained, "Well, I don't know all the words, so I give God the letters. God knows what I'm trying to say."

Years ago, when my grandmother told me this story, it meant little to me, but the spiritual life I've found in Al-Anon has given it new meaning. Today the story reminds me that prayer is for me, not for God, who knows what I'm going through without explanation. With prayer I say I am willing to be helped. The meaning behind my prayers comes from my heart, not from my words.

I found this reflection to be comforting and insightful. I hope it brings you a sense of trust, intimacy, and comfort.

**Have you ever wondered** why the title “Lord” is sometimes printed in small capital letters in your missalette or Bible? When “LORD” is printed this way, it represents the Divine Name that was revealed to Moses in Exodus 3. This name has four letters in Hebrew, transliterated into English as YHWH. It is sometimes called the Tetragrammaton (from the Greek for “four letters.”) Out of reverence, this name was not pronounced in later Jewish tradition. Instead, the title “Adonai” or “my Lord” was substituted. Later translations of the Hebrew Bible into Greek or Latin used the corresponding words “Kyrios” and “Dominus,” respectively. Most Bible translations in English (including the New American Bible from which our Mass readings are taken) follow this tradition. They use the small capitals version to indicate that the Hebrew text has the divine name.

One more note: in 2008, the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship issued a letter instructing that the Divine Name (usually pronounced as “Yahweh”) should not be pronounced in Catholic liturgies, including readings, songs, and prayers. Some familiar songs have had their lyrics changed to meet the requirement. This tradition of respect for God’s name helps to remind us of the majesty and transcendence of our God, who nevertheless comes close to each of us in love and mercy!
