

Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town."

The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name." Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. 
The Nicene Creed



A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

YESTERDAY . . . TOMORROW . . . TODAY.

There are two days in every week that we should not worry about. Two days that should be kept free from fear and apprehension.

One is YESTERDAY, with its mistakes and cares, its faults and blunders, its aches and pains. Yesterday has passed forever beyond our control. All the money in the world cannot bring back yesterday. We cannot undo a single act we performed. Nor can we erase a single word we've said. Yesterday is gone.


Lent is a period for preparing for Holy Weed and Easter.

Creation Care Corner



Many Catholics are unaware of the deep and rich tradition of Catholic teaching on social issues. Care for Creation is one of the main themes of Catholic social teaching. The website of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) says: "We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. . . . We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship

with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored."

As this bulletin goes to press, the U.S. Senate is still engaged in the reconciliation process over HR1, the large budget and tax bill. Recognizing that care for God's creation includes advocacy for policies that encourage sustainable economic growth, the USCCB website includes the following message, which our Creation Care Team asks you to consider:

In 2022, Congress signed into law the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), an ambitious bill that made historic investments in clean energy and jobs, air and water that has made clean energy more affordable and accessible to middle- and lower-income families and created more than 400,000 jobs. The USCCB supported the environmental provisions of the IRA, and opposed the elimination of more than \$500 billion in environmental programs in HR 1, the "The One Big Beautiful Bill" that passed the House of Representatives last month. As the Senate engages in the budget reconciliation process, please urge your Senators to oppose cuts to climate and environmental justice investments that help families, communities, Catholic dioceses, and businesses to adopt and afford clean energy and energy efficiency and create climate resilient and healthy communities.

Ouestion:

I've seen people hang rosaries over the rear-view mirrors in their cars and a few of them wear them around

their necks. Is it OK to do that?

Answer: The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?

One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.

Villa Maria Education & Spirituality Center in Villa Maria, PA will host its 12th annual Nostra Aetate Lecture on Thursday, July 10, 2025 at 7:00 pm. This year's presenter is Rabbi Efraim Palvanov who will speak on The Noahide Laws: God's Commandment to the World. Nostra aetate (from Latin: "In our time") is the Declaration on the Relation of the Church with Non-Christian Religions of the Second Vatican Council. Passed by a vote of 2,221 to 88 of the assembled bishops, this declaration was promulgated on 28 October 1965 by Pope Paul VI. It is the shortest of the 16 final documents of the Council and "the first in Catholic history to focus on the relationship that Catholics have with Jews." It "reveres the work of God in all the major faith traditions." It begins by stating its purpose of reflecting on what humankind has in common in these times when people are being drawn closer together.
