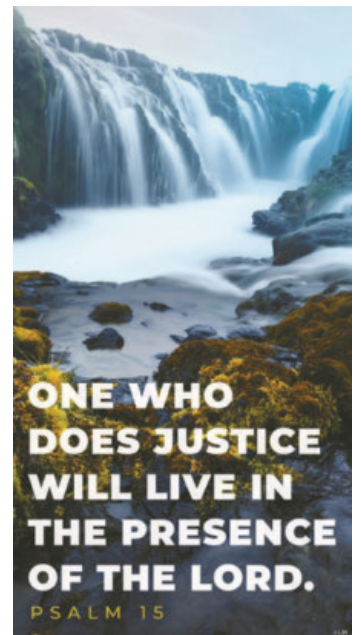

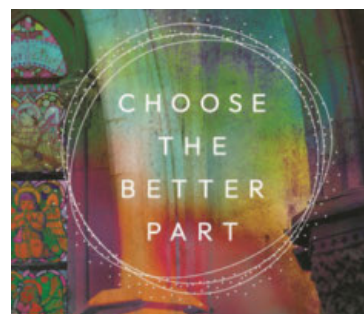

A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

You may remember from the March 30, 2025 parish bulletin that I shared with you a letter I sent to Bishop David Zubik. In compliance with the Priest Personnel Policy for the Diocese of Pittsburgh, I resigned my position as pastor of Christ the King Parish upon reaching my 75th birthday on June 26, 2025. In that same letter I requested to remain here as pastor until the completion of the 6-year canonical term to which I was appointed when Christ the King Parish was established on July 1, 2021.

There has been silence ever since, perhaps dictated by universal and local church events. Pope Francis died on April 21ST and on May 8TH Robert Francis Prevost was elected to succeed him as Pope Leo XIV. Bishop Zubik celebrated his 50TH anniversary as a priest on May 4TH and learned shortly thereafter that his resignation and retirement as the Bishop of Pittsburgh was accepted. On June 4TH it was announced that Auxiliary Bishop Mark A. Eckman was named as the 13TH Bishop of the Diocese of Pittsburgh. That's a whole lot of ecclesiastical activity. In the midst of it all my request may have been lost in the shuffle!

Curious, I sent a brief email on July 9TH to Father Michael Conway, the Vicar for Clergy and Consecrated Life. It reads: "*. . . since I never received a reply from Bishop Zubik regarding my letter of March 25, 2025 and the request to remain as pastor of Christ the King Parish for an additional two years beyond reaching 75 years old on June 26, 2025, am I to assume anything or is the decision in the hands of Bishop Eckman?*"

He replied the following day, brief and succinct: "*The plan is for you to remain at Christ the King Parish until your term expires. Once Bishop Eckman assumes office, we can get a letter out to you.*" I'll be sure to share that letter with you when I receive it.

There you have it. I will remain as the pastor of Christ the King Parish until the end of June in 2027, at which time I'll be 77 years old and may be ready for retirement. Please pray for me.

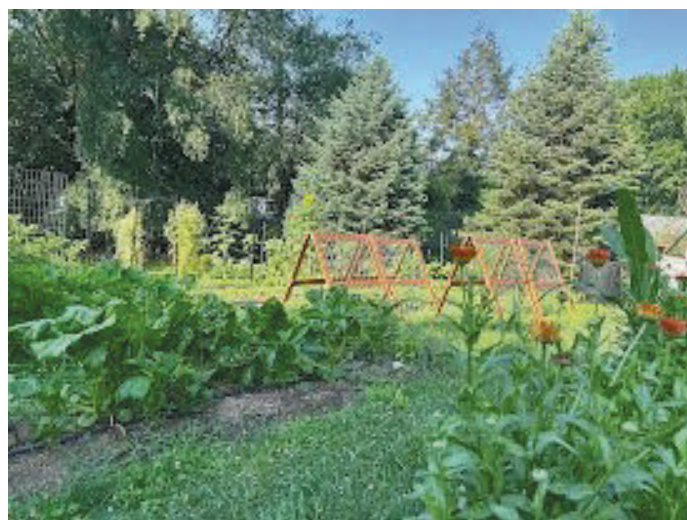

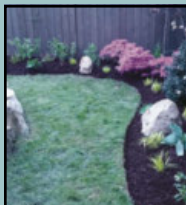

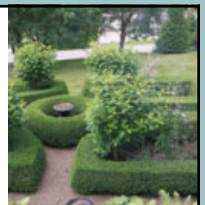
