



Vanity of vanities, says Qoheleth, vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!





# A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

#### **TODAY'S FIRST READING**

**Ecclesiastes 1: 2; 2: 21-23** 

In Ecclesiastes, the speaker is called Qoheleth, which is a rare Hebrew term that likely describes the role of one who calls together the community of God's people. This individual studied many fields and topics so as to gain vast knowledge and understanding of the things of this world. Accordingly, we regard the text associated with him as wisdom literature and "Qoheleth" a wisdom figure.

Qoheleth's aim seems to lie in highlighting our tendency to forge undue attachment to worldly things. Having worked at length to gain great knowledge and understanding in many areas, Qoheleth can remind his audience that the things of this world are wonderful *and* passing. Therefore, our attachments to them call for tempering. Our sense of the meaning and value of worldly things must recognize that their merits are best framed relative to an eternal horizon—a horizon of infinite meaning.

#### **TODAY'S GOSPEL**

Luke 12: 13-21

The Gospel recounts Jesus' response to a request for him to adjudicate an inheritance dispute and focuses on how the Lord wants us to negotiate our attachments to the things of this world.

After the nameless plaintiff makes the request from the crowd, Jesus asks a sharp rhetorical question: "Who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?" With this, he silences the request. We know that, as the ultimate judge of the universe, Jesus *can* judge the matter. But he does not because of the deeper lesson that he wants to teach the crowd: life is not comprised of possessions, no matter how abundant they might be.

Jesus' parable presents that lesson in story form. A rich man's sudden windfall of a bountiful harvest does not turn the man's attention to God and heavenly things. Rather, he becomes a greedy hoarder. He fixates on his earthly wealth. In fact, his undue attachment to his new wealth is so severe that he even destroys the barns he already has for a future he imagines to be his. But it is a future over which he has no control. He mistakenly thinks that he and his wealth will endure. He will, the very night of his windfall, be called out of this life to the next. And sadly, his harvest

has no place to go. It will be lost along with his life.

Like Qoheleth, Jesus emphasizes that things of this world are passing while things of heaven endure eternally. Accordingly, we do well to be *rich* with respect to matters pertaining to God.
