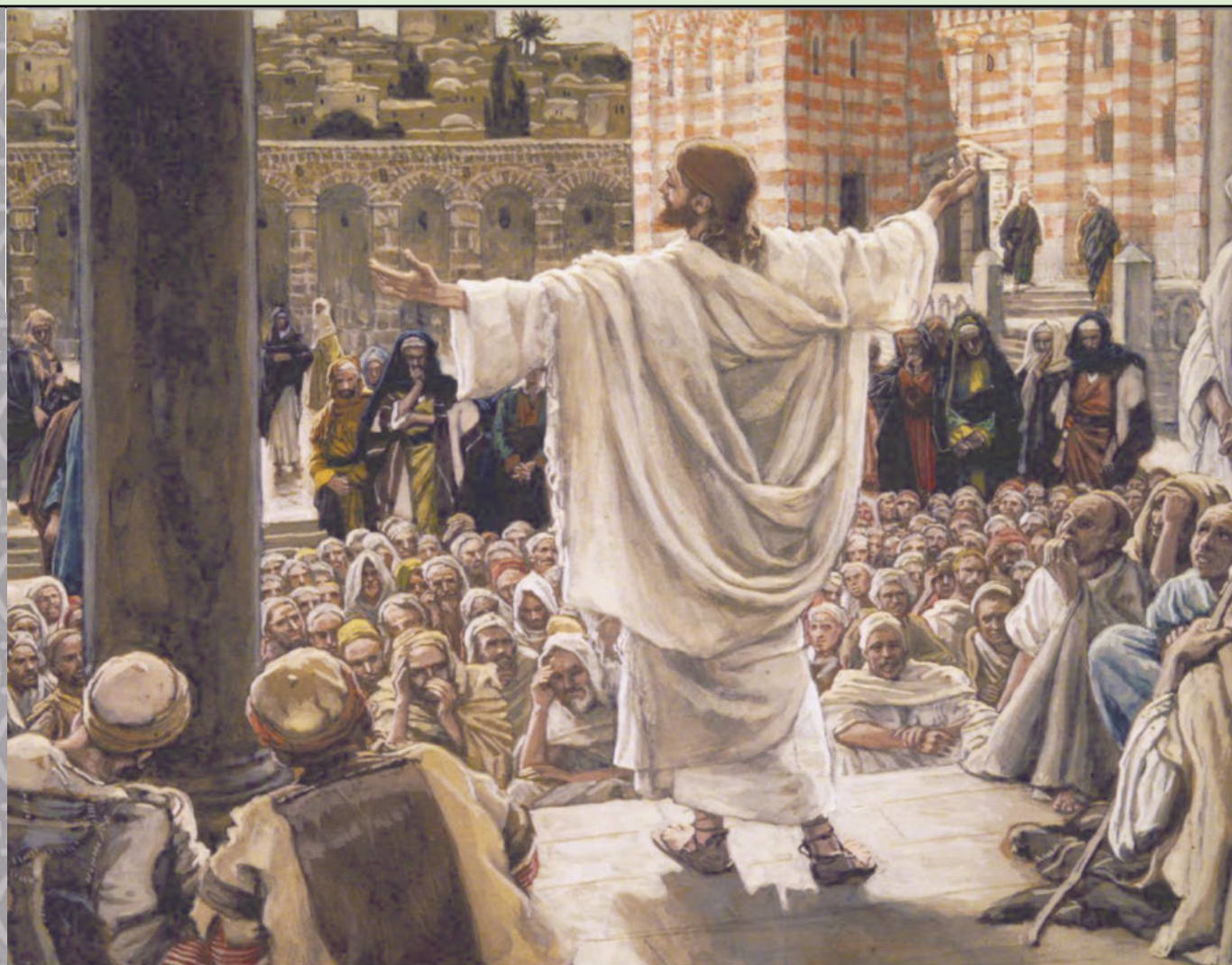

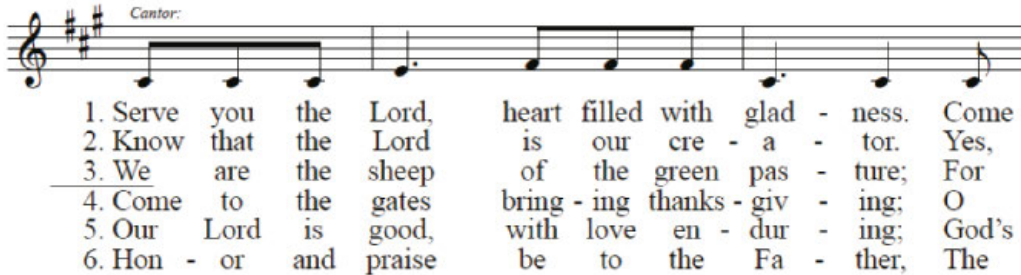

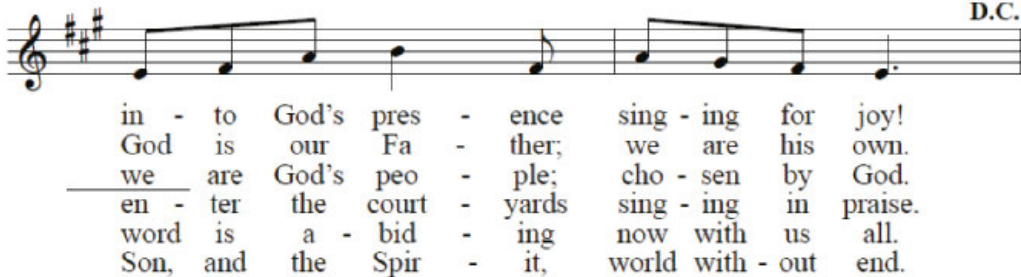

### LITURGY OF THE WORD

#### First Reading: Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

In those days, the princes said to the king: "Jeremiah ought to be put to death; he is demoralizing the

soldiers who are left in this city, and all the people, by speaking such things to them; he is not interested in the welfare of our people, but in their ruin." King Zedekiah answered: "He is in your power"; for the king could do nothing with them. And so they took Jeremiah and threw him into the cistern of Prince Malchiah, which was in the quarters of the guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the cistern, only mud, and Jeremiah sank into the mud.

Ebed-melech, a court official, went there from the palace and said to him: "My lord king, these men have been at fault in all they have done to the prophet Jeremiah, casting him into the cistern. He will die of famine on the spot, for there is no more food in the city." Then the king ordered Ebed-melech the Cushite to take three men along with him, and draw the prophet Jeremiah out of the cistern before he should die.

## The Nicene Creed

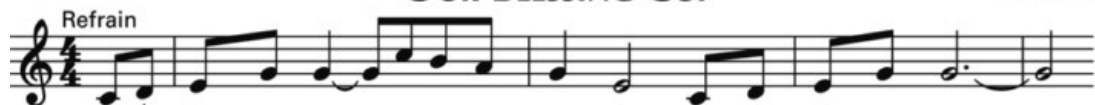

**Missionary Co-op Visit:** Father John Callan, a member of the religious congregation known as the Pierist Fathers, will visit Christ the King Parish this weekend, August 16-17. The Order of Pious Schools, known as the Pierists, was founded in the 16<sup>TH</sup> century in Spain by Saint Joseph Calasantz (1557-1648).



**Pilgrimage to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC:** Interested parishioners are invited to share in this one-day trip on Saturday, September 13, 2025. The day will include a tour of the basilica, Holy Hour, opportunity

for Confession, and Mass with Bishop Emeritus David Zubik.
