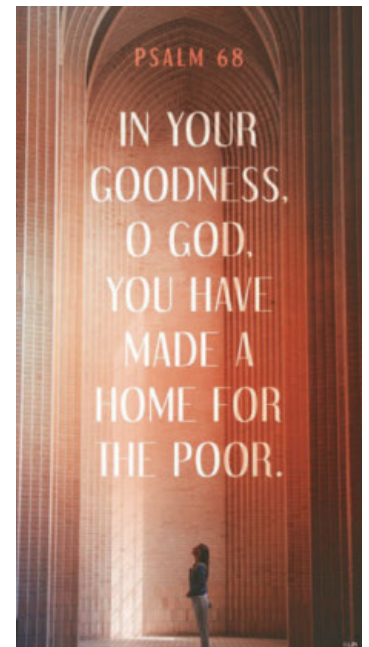

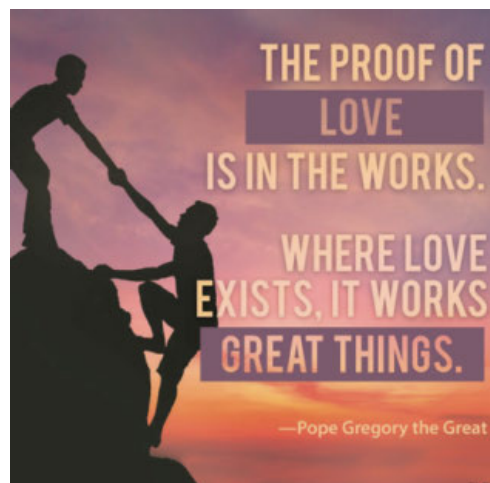

# A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Labor Day has its history. As a federal holiday it was established by President Grover Cleveland on June 28, 1894 and celebrated every year on the First Monday of September to honor the worker and the dignity of work. Laboring with the power of one's intellect, the sweat of one's brow, and the ache of one's back, work and the worker are intended to make a difference in the prospects of the human condition.

Labor may also be rightly seen as acting with God the Divine Worker. The Creator gave the creature the expectation of cooperation and the responsibility of helping to build a better world. Therefore, whether a person works with his hands, her head, or their heart, all is to be done in the name of God and on behalf of His created world.

Not all are free from work on Labor Day. Some must work their shift in the hospital, others must walk-the-beat to keep us safe, still others are called upon to put-out-the-fires. Whether working or not on Labor Day 2025, the words of the Rotarian Thomas Osborne Davis may prompt us to reflection:

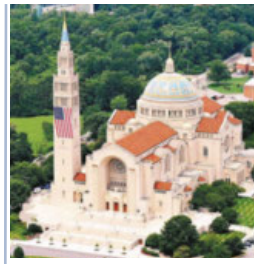

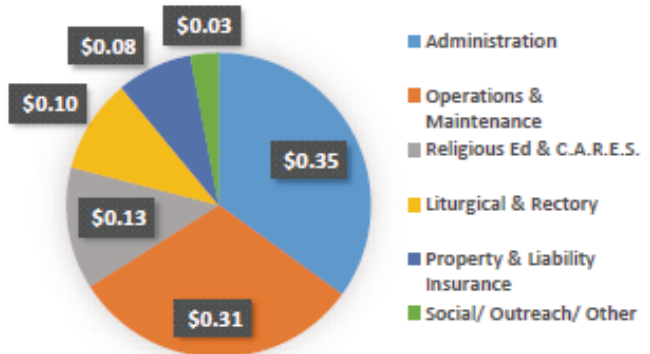

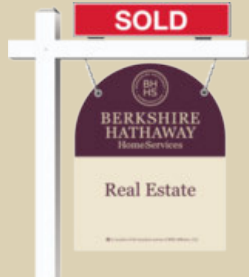
