

First Reading: Wisdom 9:13-18b



I, Paul, an old man, and now also a prisoner for Christ Jesus, urge you on behalf of my child Onesimus, whose father I have become in my imprisonment; I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. 





A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR



Editor's Note: The completed 2025 Parish Pictorial Directory arrived on August 8, 2025. We have been distributing it every weekend since. There 509 individual photos in the directory; 405 of the directories have been picked up. Hopefully the remaining 104 will soon find their owners.

At our request, the company who assembled the

directory for Christ the King Parish (Universal Church Directories) did an overrun of 100 copies. You may get your directory in the vestibule of church after Mass or at the administrative office of the parish located at Saint Joseph Church.

The Pastor's Letter printed below is the one that appears on the first page of the directory.

My dear parishioners,

For many, the Lower Allegheny Valley grouping of parishes has a familiar sound to it. It first came into use in October of 2018 when the former parishes of Saint Joseph, Saint Juan Diego, Saint Scholastica, and Saint Padre Pio initiated a new way of being a Catholic faith community.

Then, following many meetings, careful consultation, prayerful discernment, and the decree of Bishop David A. Zubik, we came together on July 1, 2021 as **Christ the King Parish**. Today we worship in the churches of Saint Scholastica in Aspinwall, Saint Edward in Blawnox, Saint Joseph in O'Hara, Madonna of Jerusalem and Saint Mary in Sharpsburg.

It is an expansive territory with over 6,500 parishioners, identifying Christ the King Parish as their spiritual home, all committed to forever learning the message of Saint Paul to the Ephesian community: "I, then, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to live in a manner worthy of the call you have received, with all humility and

gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace: one body and one Spirit, as you were also called to the one hope of your call; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all" (Ephesians 4: 1

As the prayer on the back cover of this 2025 Parish Pictorial Directory informs us, we are a people striving to **REDISCOVER, RECONNECT and RECOMMIT** to all that is good and holy. While living in different places and praying in various churches, we are all daughters and sons of God, brothers and sisters in Christ, equally inspired and continually guided by the Holy Spirit.

Thus, fortified by faith, hope and love, we move into the future as the one people of God and the united members of Christ the King Parish. Now, as we "get-to-know-oneanother," I hope that it will be enhanced and hastened by this pictorial directory which will help us to attach names with familiar faces.

May God bless all that we do in the name of Jesus Christ our King.






Family Faith Formation registration for 2025-26 is open!

Around the Diocese . . .

"Welcoming the Stranger": The Cardinal's Great Hall at the Diocesan Pastoral Center was full on August 21 as Catholics from around the diocese gathered to review the insights of Catholic social doctrine on immigration and how those insights can be enacted in this time of mass deportation. Jacob Williamson, the new diocesan Director of Social Concerns, gave a quick overview of Catholic social teaching, with particular emphasis upon the obligation to uphold the dignity of the human person. He recalled five principles that the bishops of the United States and Mexico have outlined in relation to immigration: 1) the right of people to find opportunities in their homeland; 2) the right to migrate if such opportunities are lacking; 3) the right of a state to control its borders; 4) the duty to protect refugees and people seeking asylum; and 5) the duty to respect the human dignity and human rights of undocumented migrants. Jaime Martinez of Casa San José, a community resource center for Pittsburgh area Latinos founded by the Sisters of St. Joseph of Baden, spoke about the current deportation efforts and their effects on our communities. Martinez coordinates a Rapid Response Network. Hundreds of volunteers are being trained to join teams that witness and verify immigration enforcement, share facts and alert the community, and accompany and support the detained, whose human and legal rights are often violated. 


