




#### Second Reading: 1 Timothy 2:1-8

This is good and pleasing to God our savior, who wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth.

#### **Gospel: Luke 16:1-13**

Jesus said to his disciples, "A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward.' The steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me? I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg. I know what I shall do so that, when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes.' He called in his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' He replied, 'One hundred measures of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Here is your promissory note. Sit down and quickly write one for fifty.' Then to another the steward said, 'And you, how much do you owe?' He replied, 'One hundred kors of wheat.' The steward said to him, 'Here is your promissory note; write one for eighty.' And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently.





# A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

In his first of two pastoral letters, the apostle Peter gives advice and offers encouragement. His message is well worth hearing and heeding: "Now who is going to harm you if you are enthusiastic for what is good? But even if you should suffer because of righteousness, blessed are you. Do not be afraid or terrified with fear of them, but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who defame your good conduct in Christ may themselves be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that be the will of God, than for doing evil." (1 Peter 3: 13 - 17).

Peter teaches enthusiasm for what is good, while at the same time warning that one may suffer for doing good. That truth is the reality of faith formation. Named as disciples of Jesus Christ in baptism, we spend a lifetime learning and practicing what discipleship means. Thus, the foundation and importance of catechesis: to teach the faith . . . to learn the faith . . . to know the faith . . . to live the faith . . . to practice the faith. Children, teenagers, young adults, parents, and those others well along in life—all must be engaged in a lifetime of faith formation.

Catechetical Sunday begins every year on the third Sunday of September. This year's theme is taken from the words of Saint Peter: "Always be ready to give an explanation... for a reason for your hope." A few years ago, Christ the King Parish introduced the Family Faith Formation Program as a way of inviting the full and active participation of parents with their children and teenagers in learning and living the Catholic faith. It is a model whereby the parish catechists facilitate the monthly teaching, and the parents continue the same in the home, always with the hope of helping to give an explanation for what we believe and live as Catholics.

One of the key components of being, believing, and living as a Catholic is a full and active participation in the celebration of weekly Mass—to keep holy the Sabbath (the Third commandment of Ten given to us by God through Moses on Mount Sinai). Obedience to this commandment is a way in which we can live the mission statement of Christ the King Parish to rediscover, reconnect, and recommit to all that is good and holy. To that end, our weekly attendance at Mass must be of greatest importance. No excuses, no reason for missing.


As staff members of Christ the King Parish, **Donna Lew-Buechel**, the Director of Faith Formation, along with

St. Pio, best known as Padre Pio, was born Francesco Forgione in 1887 in Pietrelcina, Italy. As a young boy he suffered many illnesses including typhoid. He joined the Capuchin Franciscans at 15 and took the name of Pius or "Pio" in honor of Pope Pius I. He was ordained in 1910, and at this time he received the marks of stigmata, the wounds of Christ, but they eventually healed. Frequent

illnesses continued to plague him as a young man. In 1918 the stigmata appeared again, and this time remained until his death.

Many faithful came to see him at the friary, his days were long, beginning with Mass at 5 am then hearing confessions all day with breaks to bless the sick. He was a simple man, content to do God's will on earth and with the ardent desire to serve the sick and poor in whom he saw Christ.

Padre Pio died at the age of eighty-one in 1968 and was canonized in 2002



St. Vincent de Paul is much more than a patron saint of thrift shops! Young Vincent became a priest hoping to advance and rise above his modest upbringing. His early ambition amounted to little when he was assigned to a poor rural parish. Here he experienced a new joy in his vocation. Hearing the profound deathbed confession of a dying servant, Vincent became more convinced of the special attention that must be given to the poor.

In 1625, Vincent founded the Congregation of the Mission for the purpose of caring for the poor. Originally priests only, the mission expanded to include groups of laity who provided for spiritual and material needs of the poor in each parish. Nearly 400 hundred years later, his legacy lives on. © *LPi*


