





Dogs even used to come and lick his sores. When the poor man died, he was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried, and from the netherworld, where he was in torment, he raised his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he cried out, 'Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am suffering torment in these flames.' Abraham replied, 'My child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented. Moreover, between us and you a great chasm is established to prevent anyone from crossing who might wish to go from our side to yours or from your side to ours.' A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Amos the prophet did not go easy on those who trampled on the needy and destroyed the poor of the land. He did not hold back from accusing them of lying, cheating and stealing in order to get from the poor what they wanted. And he concluded his warning by placing these words on the lips of God: "Never will I forget a thing they have done!" (Amos 8: 4-7).

That was last Sunday's first scripture reading. In today's first reading, Amos continues with more of the same. "Thus says the Lord, the God of hosts: Woe to the complacent in Zion! Lying upon beds of ivory, stretched comfortably on their couches, they eat lambs taken from the flock, and calves from the stall! Improvising to the music of the harp, like David, they devise their own accompaniment. They drink wine from bowls and anoint themselves with the best oils; yet they are not made ill by the collapse of Joseph! Therefore, now they shall be the first to go into exile, and their wanton revelry shall he done away with" (Amos 6: 1, 4-7).

Today's Gospel parable reinforces the sin of complacency. Jesus tells the story of a rich man who could not have cared less about the desperate hunger of poor Lazarus lying at his door. All he cared about was himself and satisfying his own pursuits and pleasure. But the parable ended badly for him. It was indifference that was his undoing, resulting in punishment. He ignored a poor person at the peril of his very soul.

The message is abundantly clear for us. In our time we must keep a watchful eye and open heart in response to the poor who are in our midst. We cannot risk complacency or indifference. A lack of concern for those who suffer is contrary to the Christian way that Jesus came to teach.

Locally, Christ the King Parish is certainly responsive to those who are in need. We have an active Saint Vincent de Paul Society to which parishioners donate generously. We have many volunteers who participate in the work of the food pantry that operates out of Saint Mary's Church. There are those who provide monthly meals for the Men's and Women's Shelters. Non-perishable food items are regularly brought to our churches and placed in the boxes and bins. There is even a parish garden providing fresh and home-grown produce.

All this is a testament of our outreach to the poor and hungry. No doubt, there are many more examples of people doing for people unknown, anonymous, without fanfare. Jesus said to keep your deeds of mercy secret.

My brothers and sisters, I hope that the indictment of Amos and the parable of Jesus will stir our hearts and prick

our conscience. While the Word of God is intended to make us think, it must also prompt us to act.



Mass Intention Request Form for 2026 will be printed in the bulletin during the four weekends of October. You are encouraged to return that completed form to the parish office as soon as possible, keeping in mind that the intentions are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis. The actual scheduling of Masses will begin in November. Please understand the limitation of Masses available and the large number of people who make a request. That is why you may only ask for one Mass on the weekend and two Masses on a weekday.

Annual October Count: Every year the Diocese of Pittsburgh asks that a count of the number of people in attendance at the weekend Masses be taken. It is a way to look at trends and to see where there might be increases or decreases of people who are going to Mass. The ushers at the seven weekend Masses in the churches of Christ the King Parish will undertake the "October Count" on each of the four weekends in October. Those numbers will be printed in the bulletin in November when the count is concluded.

Here's a fantasy! What would those numbers look like if every registered member of Christ the King Parish attended Mass every week in obedience to the Third Commandment of God to keep holy the sabbath? It would be standing-room-only crowds in all of our churches!




