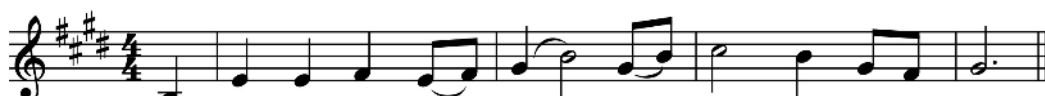
LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13

In those days, Amalek came and waged war against Israel. Moses, therefore, said to Joshua, “Pick out certain men, and tomorrow go out and engage Amalek in battle. I will be standing on top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand.” So Joshua did as Moses told him: he engaged Amalek in battle after Moses had climbed to the top of the hill with Aaron and Hur. As long as Moses kept his hands raised up, Israel had the better of the fight, but when he let his hands rest, Amalek had the better of the fight. Moses’ hands, however, grew tired; so they put a rock in place for him to sit on. Meanwhile Aaron and Hur supported his hands, one on one side and one on the other, so that his hands remained steady till sunset. And Joshua mowed down Amalek and his people with the edge of the sword.

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary. He said, “There was a judge in a certain town who neither feared God nor respected any human being. And a widow in that town used to come to him and say, ‘Render a just decision for me against my adversary.’ For a long time the judge was unwilling, but eventually he thought, ‘While it is true that I neither fear God nor respect any human being, because this widow keeps bothering me I shall deliver a just decision for her lest she finally come and strike me.’” The Lord said, “Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says. Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them? I tell you, he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?”

A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

How well I remember my years of study for the priesthood. I was privileged to receive my education and formation, beginning at the former Saint Fidelis College Seminary in Herman, PA and continuing in Washington, D.C., under the guidance of the Capuchin Franciscans. These humble friars have always been men of mission, going where called to preach the Good News of Jesus Christ. Since the 1930's the Capuchins of the Province of Saint Augustine, with headquarters in Lawrenceville, have supported missions in Puerto Rico and for the past 70 years in Papua New Guinea.

As young Capuchins in studies, we were regularly encouraged to prayerfully consider missionary work. Truthfully, I never received the call, but I had great respect for my peers who did and went off as missionaries to Puerto Rico or Papua New Guinea.

Men and women in every age of the Church have heard the mission call: priests, members of religious congregations, and the laity. They have embraced different cultures, learned new languages, adapted to the local foods, accepted separation from family, and endured hardships and challenges. Many even suffered the ultimate sacrifice of martyrdom.

World Mission Sunday is a vital reminder of who we are as Church, the people of God. Jesus Christ, the Son of God, was not content to make a few disciples, but many. Thus, his ministry included forming and preparing others to go beyond the comfort of home to preach the Gospel where it needed to be heard. And so, the missionary nature of the Church is without end.

Dear brothers and sisters, I hope you will show generosity when the basket is passed a second time at today's Mass. Our financial support of missions and missionaries is critically needed to continue the work of Jesus Christ. According to this year's theme, we must be **Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples**.

All Souls Day November 2ND

The Catholic Church has always kept its focus on praying for those who have died. Remembrance of them is offered in the Eucharistic Prayer of every Mass, particular names are spoken as an intention during the General Intercessions, the names of deceased are written in the Book of Remembrance, and candles are lit in their memory.

On All Souls Day individual vigil candles will burn at the altar in each of the churches of Christ the King Parish with the name and date of death of a parishioner who was buried from Saint Edward Church, Saint Joseph Church, Madonna Church, Saint Mary Church or Saint Scholastica Church between October 1ST of last year and September 30TH of this year.

An additional special remembrance will be offered on Sunday afternoon, November 2ND, beginning at 3:00 pm in Saint Mary's Church in Sharpsburg. A Choral Vespers Service will be led by the Music Ministry of Christ the King Parish. The prayer will conclude with Benediction. Page 11 of this bulletin has additional information and how you can remember your loved ones who have died. Please invite family and friends to join us for this time of prayerful remembrance.

Turn Your Taxes Into Tuition

The Diocese of Pittsburgh is making it easier than ever for individuals and businesses to transform their Pennsylvania state tax dollars into tuition assistance for Catholic school students, at no additional cost.

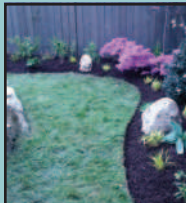

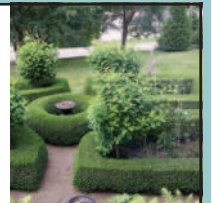
