## LITURGY OF THE WORD

### First Reading: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

The angel brought me back to the entrance of the temple, and I saw water flowing out from beneath the threshold of the temple toward the east, for the façade of the temple was toward the east; the water flowed down from the southern side of the temple, south of the altar. He led me outside by the north gate, and around to the outer gate facing the east, where I saw water trickling from the southern side. He said to me, "This water flows into the eastern district down upon the Arabah, and empties into the sea, the salt waters, which it makes fresh. Wherever the river flows, every sort of living creature that can multiply shall live, and there shall be abundant fish, for wherever this water comes the sea shall be made fresh. Along both banks of the river, fruit trees of every kind shall grow; their leaves shall not fade, nor their fruit fail. Every month they shall bear fresh fruit, for they shall be watered by the flow from the sanctuary. Their fruit shall serve for food, and their leaves for medicine."

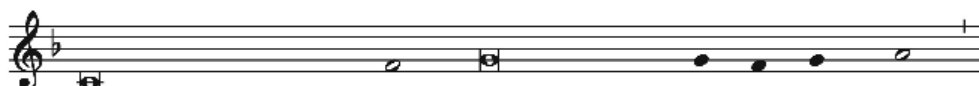

# A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

*"He who sings prays twice."* Words of Saint Augustine and applicable to the choir members of Christ the King Parish. In today's feast that celebrates the **Dedication of the Basilica of Saint John Lateran** in Rome (the cathedral church of the Diocese of Rome from which Pope Leo XIV presides), I am struck by the fact that our parish is blessed in the houses of worship that we have in the churches of Saint Edward, Saint Joseph, Madonna of Jerusalem, Saint Mary, and Saint Scholastica. **The November theme for our *Finding God* curriculum** is "Jesus, Our Lord and Savior." At a pivotal moment in the middle of the Gospel according to Mark, Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" In the New Testament, the act of telling someone about Jesus, and the content of what is said, is called *kerygma* ("proclamation" in Greek). The most basic proclamation is "Jesus is Lord" (1 Cor 12:3). What is your *kerygma*? Pope Francis gave guidelines: "[I]t has to express God's saving love which precedes any moral or religious obligation on our part; it should not impose the truth but appeal to freedom; it should be marked by joy, encouragement, liveliness . . ." Are you prepared to answer the question "Who do you say that I am?"

Our *Faith Stories* families are learning about God's covenant with his people. It is important that we understand that God's promise to be faithful to us is not just a historical Old Testament story, but applies to us today. In fact, Jesus, our Lord and Savior, is the ultimate realization of this promise. Our response to him, our *kerygma*, is what allows this covenant to come to fulfillment.

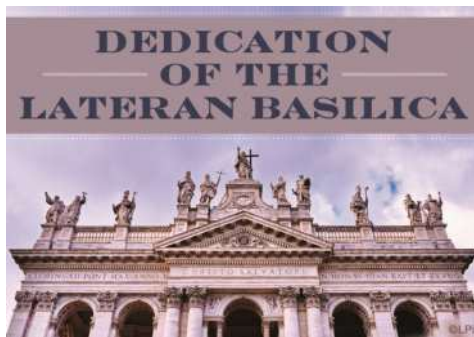

## DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

Most Catholics think of St. Peter's as the pope's main church, but they are wrong. Saint John Lateran is the pope's church, the cathedral of the Diocese of Rome where the Bishop of Rome presides.

The first basilica on the site was built in the fourth century when Constantine donated land he had received from the wealthy Lateran family. That structure and its successors suffered fire, earthquake, and the ravages of war, but the Lateran remained the church where popes

were consecrated. In the 14th century when the papacy returned to Rome from Avignon, the church and the adjoining palace were found to be in ruins.

Pope Innocent X commissioned the present structure in 1646. One of Rome's most imposing churches, the Lateran's towering facade is crowned with 15 colossal statues of Christ, John the Baptist, John the Evangelist, and 12 doctors of the Church. Beneath its high altar rest the remains of the small wooden table on which tradition holds Saint Peter himself celebrated Mass.

Unlike the commemorations of other Roman churches, this anniversary is a feast. The dedication of a church is a feast for all its parishioners. In a sense, St. John Lateran is the parish church of all Catholics, because it is the pope's cathedral. This church is the spiritual home of the people who are the Church.

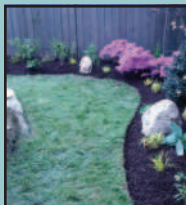

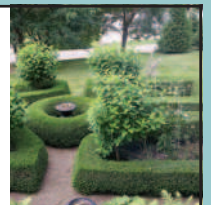
