




The Nicene Creed








This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever. It also encourages us to celebrate and live out our faith in public.

When we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and remind ourselves that Jesus is the Lord of the Church and of the entire universe.

Christ the King Parish's Hope for Haiti Committee continues to work to empower the poor in Haiti and beyond, especially through educational initiatives and grassroots partnerships. Funds contributed by parishioners sponsor Catholic schoolchildren in St. Marc, Haiti (currently 10 children sponsored per year), through the Mortel High Hopes for Haiti Foundation, as well as benefiting other organizations with similar missions supporting Haiti and local Haitians.

The Jubilee Soup Kitchen is Pittsburgh's only 365-day soup kitchen and comprehensive support center. They offer services from daily meals and food pantries to a homeless prevention program, job training, and childcare services.

The Capuchin Mission and Missionaries in Papua New Guinea: From their earliest days, the Capuchins have been in the forefront of the Church's effort to bring the Gospel to the entire world. They serve in local churches, prisons, soup kitchens, shelters for the homeless and in a variety of other ministries.

Our St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry has seen a significant increase in the number of neighbors needing our services. In September and October, over 115 families per month received food during our two distributions and through deliveries to those who cannot come to the Pantry. Donations of non-perishable food, toiletries, and paper products are accepted year round in the designated collection areas in the entrances of Saint Joseph, Saint Scholastica, and Saint Edward Churches or at the lower level of Saint Mary Church on Tuesdays from 8:30 to 10:30am. Items for holiday celebrations (stuffing mix, cranberry sauce, baking supplies, etc.) will be especially appreciated over the next few months. Monetary donations can be made in the monthly SVdP envelope or online at ChristtheKingpgh.org/parish-ministry. Our team of amazing volunteers ensures that we are ready to serve and enjoys a wonderful sense of community. New volunteers are always welcome. Christ the King Parish provides a hot meal for the women's shelter at Bethlehem Haven on the first Sunday of each month and the men's shelter at Community House on the fourth Saturday of each month. We are always looking for new volunteers to help by donating a portion of the meal. For details on how you can participate in this ministry, go to ChristtheKingpgh.org/shelter-meals.

The Aspinwall Homeless Ministry supports numerous homeless individuals and needy families throughout our region and they are always happy to accept donations of non-perishable food. They are particularly in need of cookies, canned vegetables, pudding cups, large bags of chips and other snacks, macaroni and cheese, Ritz crackers, Spam, canned red or black beans, tuna and chicken (foil packets or cans with pull tabs), and powdered or shelf-stable milk. 


