

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5

This is what Isaiah, son of Amoz, saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In days to come, the mountain of the LORD's house shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills. All nations shall stream toward it; many peoples shall come and say: "Come, let us climb the LORD's mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths." For from Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and impose terms on many peoples. They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; one nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD!

Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and lust, not in rivalry and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the desires of the flesh.

Jesus said to his disciples: "As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken, and one will be left. Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour of night when the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and not let his house be broken into. So too, you also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."


The Nicene Creed





A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Think of the magnificent Catholic churches that dot the planet and it may be that Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome immediately comes to mind. Whether you have been there and seen it in person or only know of its grandeur from television images, it is clear that men and women throughout the ages have sought ways to glorify God in the majesty of sacred buildings. While our feeble human attempts cannot measure up to the splendor of the Almighty, nonetheless, we continue in our desire to give all the honor and praise to God.

In our nation's capital in Washington, D.C. there is one such remarkable church. It is the **Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception**, the largest Catholic church in the United States and the tenth largest in the world. I encourage you to read more by googling. See for yourself and learn about the Basilica dedicated to the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the patroness of the United States of America.



I have a personal affection for the Basilica. During my years of study for the priesthood, I lived a five-minute walk away and visited there regularly. I was especially drawn to the Chapel of the Blessed Sacrament where I spent many peaceful hours in prayer.

Perhaps it was in that sacred space that my vocation was made certain. The Crypt Chapel of the Basilica is also the place where I was ordained as a Transitional Deacon on January 22, 1977, just one year before my ordination as a priest on January 28, 1978 in Saint Augustine Church in Lawrenceville.

In the more than 100 years since construction began and continued throughout the decades, countless numbers of Catholics and other people of good will have toured as well as prayed and worshiped in the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. Naturally, like any building, the Basilica is aging and showing signs of wear and tear. Thus, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops is asking for a nationwide second collection to help with the cost of improvements that will include lighting and electrical updates, improvements to the heating and air-conditioning, the preservation of precious artwork, and other essentials.

Therefore, on December 6-7—the weekend closest to

the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, which is on December 8TH—a second collection will be taken in every Catholic church in the United States. All donations will find a most worthy purpose in helping to secure the infrastructure of the Basilica and maintain its beauty for many, many years to come. I am confident that you will be generous.



Christ the King Parish's Hope for Haiti Committee continues to work to empower the poor in Haiti and beyond, especially through educational initiatives and grassroots partnerships. Funds contributed by parishioners sponsor Catholic schoolchildren in St. Marc, Haiti (currently 10 children sponsored per year), through the Mortel High Hopes for Haiti Foundation, as well as benefiting other organizations with similar missions supporting Haiti and local Haitians.

The Jubilee Soup Kitchen is Pittsburgh's only 365-day soup kitchen and comprehensive support center. They offer services from daily meals and food pantries to a homeless prevention program, job training, and childcare services.

The Capuchin Mission and Missionaries in Papua New Guinea: From their earliest days, the Capuchins have been in the forefront of the Church's effort to bring the Gospel to the entire world. They serve in local churches, prisons, soup kitchens, shelters for the homeless and in a variety of other ministries.

SOCIAL OUTREACH



CTK's Saint Vincent de Paul Society offers financial assistance (rent, utility payments, furniture, etc.) to neighbors in

Our St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry has seen a significant increase in the number of neighbors needing our services. In September and October, over 115 families per month received food during our two distributions and through deliveries to those who cannot come to the Pantry. Donations of non-perishable food, toiletries, and paper products are accepted year round in the designated collection areas in the entrances of Saint Joseph, Saint Scholastica, and Saint Edward Churches, or at the lower level of Saint Mary Church on Tuesdays from 8:30 to 10:30am. Items for holiday celebrations (stuffing mix, cranberry sauce, baking supplies, etc.) will be especially appreciated over the next few months. Monetary donations can be made in the monthly SVdP envelope or online at ChristtheKingpgh.org/parish-ministry. Our team of amazing volunteers ensures that we are ready to serve and enjoys a wonderful sense of community. New volunteers are always welcome. Christ the King Parish provides a hot meal for the women's shelter at Bethlehem Haven on the first Sunday of each month and the men's shelter at Community House on the fourth Saturday of each month. We are always looking for new volunteers to help by donating a portion of the meal. For details on how you can participate in this ministry, go to Christhekingpgh.org/shelter-meals.

The Aspinwall Homeless Ministry supports numerous homeless individuals and needy families throughout our region and they are always happy to accept donations of non-perishable food. 




