


LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10

On that day, a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom. The spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him: a spirit of wisdom and of understanding, a spirit of counsel and of strength, a spirit of knowledge and of fear of the LORD, and his delight shall be the fear of the LORD. Not by appearance shall he judge, nor by hearsay shall he decide, but he shall judge the poor with justice, and decide aright for the land's afflicted. He shall strike the ruthless with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall slay the wicked. Justice shall be the band around his waist, and faithfulness a belt upon his hips. Then the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the young lion shall browse together, with a little child to guide them. The cow and the bear shall be neighbors, together their young shall rest; the lion shall eat hay like the ox. The baby shall play by the cobra's den, and the child lay his hand on the adder's lair. There shall be no harm or ruin on all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be filled with knowledge of the LORD, as water covers the sea. On that day, the root of Jesse, set up as a signal for the nations, the Gentiles shall seek out, for his dwelling shall be glorious.

Second Reading: Romans 15:4-9

Brothers and sisters: Whatever was written previously was written for our instruction, that by endurance and by the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to think in harmony with one another, in keeping with Christ Jesus, that with one accord you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Welcome one another, then, as Christ welcomed you, for the glory of God. For I say that Christ became a minister of the circumcised to show God's truthfulness, to confirm the promises to the patriarchs, but so that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written: *Therefore, I will praise you among the Gentiles and sing praises to your name.*

Gospel: Matthew 3:1-12

John the Baptist appeared, preaching in the desert of Judea and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" It was of him that the prophet Isaiah had spoken when he said: A voice of one crying out in the desert, Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. John wore clothing made of camel's hair and had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. At that time Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins.

When he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you, God can raise up children to Abraham from these stones. Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees. Therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire. I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand. He will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.





Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception



Construction on this beautiful shrine church in Washington, D.C., dedicated to the honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, began in 1920. With a Crypt Church and the Upper Church that houses multiple altars and sacred images to honor the Blessed Mother, and other specific saints, this House of God

needs continual attention and improvement. Therefore, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has asked for a second collection this weekend of December 6-7 to help with the needed attention to the infrastructure. The generosity of your gift and that of Catholics throughout the United States will assure that the Basilica retains its beauty to the glory of God.

NEWS and ANNOUNCEMENTS

A Final Update on the Former Saint Francis of Assisi Church, Rectory and Property

- In October of 2018 it became part of the Lower Allegheny Valley grouping of parishes.
- In July of 2021 Father Mike Decewicz retired from active ministry and moved into the rectory, using the church and social hall for the work of the Addiction Recovery Ministry.
- Upon the death of Father Mike Decewicz on November 10, 2023, A.R.M. moved back to Sharpsburg to use the facilities of the John Paul I Pastoral Center.
- On May 18, 2024, a petition from the pastor and members of the Finance Council of Christ the King Parish was presented to Bishop David A. Zubik requesting his permission to close the church and relegate it to profane but not sordid use.
- Bishop Zubik issued a formal decree on July 6, 2024, stating that Saint Francis of Assisi Church would officially close on August 15, 2024.
- On November 15, 2024, a Market for Sale request was submitted to the Diocese of Pittsburgh for permission to sell with an asking price of \$950,000. The 1.74 acre site that includes the church, rectory and garage were assessed by Valbridge Property Advisors at \$885,000.
- In January of 2025, a potential buyer contacted Mr. Chuck Goetz who serves the Diocese of Pittsburgh as the Director of Property, Planning and Maintenance. An offer was made of \$900,000. The Pastor and Finance Council accepted.
- After a slow and tedious process, the formal closing of the sale was on November 21, 2025. At that time \$892,080.00 (minus the payment of county, township, and school taxes) was deposited into the savings account of Christ the King Parish.
- On Monday, November 24, 2025, the pastor relinquished the keys to the new owner, Mr. Geoff Alexander. His intent is to raze the buildings and use the property to build a small strip shopping area.


Your Giving Tree Donations Support . . . through our Haiti outreach, Christ the King parishioners have supported ten students per year in several Catholic schools in St. Marc, Haiti, for several years. These include a preschool, a primary school (Ecole Les Bons Samaritains), and a secondary school (College James M. Stine). The schools are administered through the Mortel High Hopes for Haiti Foundation (https://highhopesforhaiti.org/). entering the preschool are selected from impoverished neighborhoods in St. Marc. Primary school pupils are drawn exclusively from the preschool. In addition to an education and daily meals, children in the primary grades receive semi -annual dental and annual eye care. Academically qualified individuals may continue on to the high school, serving grades 7-13. Through the dedication of students, staff and parents these schools have managed to remain open during the chaos and uncertainty of the present situation in Haiti. Thank you for your generosity!

Creation Care Corner

As Catholics we are called to be good stewards of God' creation. Here are a few ideas for a 'greener' Christmas:

- Buy cards and gift wrap made from recycled paper (note "post consumer content").
- Avoid cards with metallic or plastic coatings
- Decorate with LED light strings and turn them on only when people are present to enjoy them.
- When you're not enjoying a fire in your fireplace, close the flue and block the hearth to prevent heat loss.
- Buy a locally grown tree. See if your municipality has a tree chipping/reuse system.

The second candle on the Advent wreath represents Peace. Often called the "Bethlehem Candle," the second Advent candle reminds us of Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem before Mary gave birth to Jesus. It celebrates the song of the angels: "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace

to those on whom his favor rests." Jesus, the light of peace, shines forth from Bethlehem for all the world.

SOCIAL OUTREACH



CTK's Saint Vincent de Paul Society offers financial assistance (rent, utility payments, furniture, etc.) to neighbors in

need. Volunteers are always welcome to help us complete financial assessments. Contact 412-254-4446 or svdp@ChristtheKingpgh.org for further information.

Our St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry has seen a significant increase in the number of neighbors needing our services. In September and October, over 115 families per month received food during our two distributions and through deliveries to those who cannot come to the Pantry. Donations of non-perishable food, toiletries, and paper products are accepted year round in the designated collection areas in the entrances of Saint Joseph, Saint Scholastica, and Saint Edward Churches, or at the lower level of Saint Mary Church on Tuesdays from 8:30 to 10:30am. We need to restock our shelves after Thanksgiving! Items for holiday celebrations will be especially appreciated. Monetary donations can be made in the monthly SVdP envelope or online at ChristtheKingpgh.org/parish-ministry. Our team of amazing volunteers ensures that we are ready to serve and enjoys a wonderful sense of community. New volunteers are always welcome. You can also call 412-781-2866 for further information on the Pantry.

Christ the King Parish provides a hot meal for the women's shelter at Bethlehem Haven on the first Sunday of each month and the men's shelter at Community House on the fourth Saturday of each month. We are always looking for new volunteers to help by donating a portion of the meal. For details on how you can participate in this ministry, go to Christhekingpgh.org/shelter-meals.

The Aspinwall Homeless Ministry supports numerous homeless individuals and needy families throughout our region and they are always happy to accept donations of non-perishable food. They are particularly in need of cookies, canned vegetables, pudding cups, large bags of chips and other snacks, macaroni and cheese, Ritz crackers, Spam, canned red or black beans, tuna and chicken (foil packets or cans with pull tabs), and powdered or shelf-stable milk. Please leave donations in plastic bags in the gray bin at the Saint Scholastica Church entrance. Donations of Giant Eagle gift cards are also welcome. They can be brought to the Saint Scholastica Church office.

We are also collecting new items for all ages for our Christmas gift program. We are in particular need of toy cars and trucks and women's sweatshirts, especially size large. These can be left in the Saint Scholastica social hall.

ADDICTION RECOVERY MINISTRY




