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Scientists Create 82 Human Beings and Kill Them for Dubious Research

Researchers with Oregon Health & Science University (OHSU) this week

announced progress in research involving the creation of new human embryos from human skin cells. Framed as a way to treat infertility, the research provokes **profound ethical concerns**.

On Tuesday, September 30, Oregon Health & Science University announced that researchers "accomplished a unique proof of concept to treat infertility by turning skin cells into eggs capable of producing early human embryos."

The published research resulted in the creation of 82 oocytes that were then fertilized with sperm using IVF.

California Allows Anonymous Abortion Pill Prescription

California doctors may now prescribe the chemical abortion pill mifepristone anonymously, allowing pharmacists to fill the dangerous drug with neither the doctor nor the patient listed, according to a bill (AB 260) signed into law September 26th by California Governor Gavin Newsom (D).

AB 260 amended California law to ensure that abortion drugs were not subjected to the same labeling requirements as any other drugs dispensed by a pharmacist.

Marijuana may lead to fertility issues, harm unborn children

According to a study published in Nature Communications, women who consume

cannabis may suffer adverse fertility issues.

"THC exposure seems to impact critical transcripts involved in key oocyte maturation processes, fertilization, early embryo development and implantation," the report found.

THC, also known as tetrahydrocannabinol, is the psychoactive component of cannabis, or marijuana. The study recalled that the concentration of THC in marijuana has increased from around 3% in the 1980s to nearly 30% in the 2020s, making it far more potent, and dangerous, than in past decades.

FDA approves new version of abortion pill, prompting backlash from pro-life leaders

The Trump administration is under fire from pro-life advocates after the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) quietly approved a new generic version of the abortion drug mifepristone on Tuesday, Sept. 30. The drug is manufactured by Evita Solutions LLC, a company that openly declares its mission is to "normalize abortion" and make it "accessible to all."

The FDA "only approved a second generic mifepristone tablet because federal law requires approval when an application proves the generic is identical to the brand-name drug," Health Secretary Robert F. Kennedy, Jr. wrote in a statement Oct. 2.

EPA Investigating if Abortion Pills are Polluting America's Drinking Water

The Environmental Protection Agency has launched an internal review to determine if traces of abortion pills like mifepristone are contaminating America's wastewater and drinking water.

The EPA itself acknowledged last September that up to 10% of contaminants may survive two stages of wastewater treatment, a vulnerability that pro-life researchers say allows mifepristone residues to linger. Sanitation officials have documented fully formed pre-born babies in treatment facilities across South Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma and Mississippi, underscoring what advocates call a systemic disregard for human remains.

This practice violates the Clean Water Act, which defines pollutants to include "biological materials" and "medical waste" such as "human blood and blood products; pathological wastes" and "body parts," as well as the National Environmental Policy Act, which mandates environmental impact statements for actions with "reasonably foreseeable significant effect on the quality of the human environment."

Pregnancy centers sue California AG for right to provide abortion pill reversal information

According to a press release from Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF), the nonprofit legal organization representing the National Institute of Family and Life Advocates and SCV Pregnancy Center, the pro-life groups sued Democratic Attorney General Rob Bonta after he targeted other pregnancy centers for promoting progesterone therapy. Concerned that they might be censored next, NIFLA and SCV asked the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit to stop Bonta from banning women from making informed decisions.

Planned Parenthood Could Owe \$1.8 Billion in Massive Medicaid Fraud Case

A whistleblower lawsuit against Planned Parenthood under the federal False Claims Act could force the nation's largest abortion business to repay as much as \$1.8 billion in fraudulent Medicaid claims.

The lawsuit, filed in 2021 by an anonymous whistleblower identified only as "Doe," accuses Planned Parenthood of continuing to bill Medicaid for services in Texas and Louisiana even after those states revoked the abortion organization's eligibility in 2015. The revocations followed undercover videos released by pro-life activist David Daleiden that showed Planned Parenthood altering abortion procedures to harvest and sell aborted baby parts.

"As the courts debated Planned Parenthood's eligibility, the group continued to make Medicaid reimbursement claims despite the uncertain status until 2020, when the U.S. 5th Circuit Court of Appeals ruled in favor of the states," the lawsuit alleges.

UNICEF spent hundreds of millions of dollars pushing sexually explicit content to children

A Center for Family and Human Rights (C-FAM) report published August 22 revealed that the far-left United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) has pumped hundreds of millions of dollars into sexually explicit and pro-LGBT programs, brochures, and content for underage children.

Despite its purported mission to protect vulnerable children, UNICEF has funded dozens of Comprehensive Sexual Education (CSE) programs and sexually explicit websites for mostly underage children that encourage them to "explore their sexuality," as well as promote masturbation, homosexuality, and gender ideology. In recent years, UNICEF has come under fire for downplaying the effects of pornography on children.

OPERATION STORK SPEED

Baby formula is expensive, with standard types costing families \$70 to \$200 per month and specialty formulas even more. The

overall yearly cost can exceed \$1,500 — a huge burden for growing families in the U.S. That's why the FDA recently announced a new initiative, Operation Stork Speed, aimed at expanding safe and affordable formula options.

Operation Stork Speed includes several key steps: the agency will begin the first full nutrient review of formula composition since 1998, issue a Request for Information to update standards, and increase testing for contaminants such as heavy metals, an issue that has raised alarm among pediatric health experts in recent years.

GENOCIDE IN NIGERIA

Two American missionaries, Judd Saul of Iowa and Mike Arnold of Texas — both filmmakers turned human rights advocates — are raising alarm over what they describe as a systematic, government-enabled genocide of Christians in Nigeria.

"They separate Christian and Muslim men and women first. They kill the Christian men and tell the Muslim men that they must either join them or die, and they kill all the ones who don't join them and sell the women into sex slavery."

"The primary driving force of the killing of Christians in Nigeria is the Fulani tribe," Saul said.

He cited field reports, satellite imagery and survivor testimonies as confirmation that the militant groups, "often operating under political protection and mislabeled as herders, are responsible for the most widespread systematic and sustained attacks on Christian farming communities."
