# **Christopher Homes**

Christopher Homes is the affordable housing program of the Archdiocese of New Orleans providing some 2,500 seniors with decent, affordable housing.

The staff of 150 is dedicated to that ministry and lives out that dedication in service to residents.

dents. The staff's concern for residents was

illustrated clearly throughout the pandemic, said Deacon Dennis Adams, executive director of Christopher Homes since 2005.

The pandemic forced the organization to adjust its operations with the safety of residents the No. 1 priority, Deacon Adams said.

The staff focused on maintaining clean environments while also assisting residents with procuring groceries and medication. Managers worked tirelessly to secure food and meal donations. Staff made daily deliveries of food and packages to relieve residents of the need to leave their apartments and expose themselves to the virus.

"Recognizing that our properties are independent-living and trying to see what could be done to help our residents remain both safe and live successfully, our staff really stepped up," Deacon Adams said. "We have a meal program provided through Second Harvest and Giving Hope, and those meals were delivered to our residents' apartments by our staff, sometimes a couple of times a day, seven days a week.

"Life changed for everybody, and all of a sudden, everything was being ordered online from Amazon. The number of deliveries of packages increased dramatically, so in order to keep our residents safe, our staff delivered those packages to their doors. Amazon and FedEx didn't want to come into the building and left packages at the front door. It may have been food or medicine or

whatever our residents needed. Our staff made it happen."

Managers coordinated with a network of health and government agencies to secure on-site COVID testing at all properties. More recently, they coordinated on-site vaccinations accessible to all residents and staff. About two-thirds of residents are fully vaccinated, Deacon Adams said.

"With 2,500 souls to care for, even with this huge pandemic issue, we ended up with only 75 or 80 cases of COVID," Deacon Adams said. "That all came about because the staff at the sites did so much to protect residents."

Christopher Homes has reinstated visits from family members, transportation and activities on a limited basis. Some of the adjustments made during the pandemic are likely to continue, particularly helping residents use technology more frequently for regular doctors' visits.

"We're looking to see what we can do to increase Wi-Fi services at our properties to improve the ability of residents to stay in their apartments and visit with doctors online," Deacon Adams said. "We're trying to see where it's going to go, but life has changed. We hope and pray we're going to be able to get to normalcy, but it's going to be a new normal."

Christopher Homes has been selected annually as one of NOLA.com's top places to work in the metro New Orleans area.

"We consider this selection a great honor and an acknowledgment of our mission-based organization since the selection criteria to belong to this elite group come from surveys taken of our employees," Deacon Adams said.

As an agency of the Archdiocese of New Orleans, Christopher Homes is committed to its staff and residents and, through collaboration, the needs of its sister agencies.

## 'FOMO' and real estate

FOMO – the "fear of missing out" – is one of many reasons why the residential real estate market bubble is growing so rapidly. Homes are selling quickly, often above asking price. There are even more realtors than properties listed for sale.

While FOMO will always be evident, there are three other reasons why properties are selling so quickly.

► The first is that most buyers will borrow to buy homes and are doing so right now because mortgage rates are still very low. The historically low interest rates give borrowers a low mortgage payment, which can then be locked in for 30 years. It may be hard to believe, but the long-term average mortgage interest rate is a high 8%. Therefore, buyers are understandably rushing to purchase before the inevitable rate increases.

➤ Another issue is the lack of supply. Before the financial crisis in 2008, home-building exceeded normal demand. New home construction was significantly lower than normal demand for almost 10 years after the crisis. This resulted in a serious imbalance between supply and demand that especially rose during COVID shutdowns as interest rates were pushed to historic lows, which created more real estate buyers than sellers.

Builders tend to ramp up new home construction when demand exceeds supply. Because of the COVID challenges, there are a number of reasons why new construction cannot keep up with demand. Workers are in short supply and sometimes unwilling to rejoin the workforce. Due to shipping delays, appliances and other necessary building supplies are more expensive or simply unavailable. And municipalities are not speeding up their permitting and approval processes, which also makes new construction difficult.

➤ Finally, the shutdowns and work from home phenomenon caused many people to decide that they needed to buy new homes to get more space or a better environment for a home office. Interestingly, some are borrowing to renovate open-floor plans to create Zoom-friendly home offices. Others are trying to relocate to areas that give them a good work and home business environment.

#### So what's your plan?

So, what should you do? If you have property to sell, this is the time to go ahead and list it – don't wait to repaint or repair. This is your window of opportunity that won't last. No one knows when the market will change, but circumstances are so unusual that a change is inevitable.

If you are a buyer, the situation is more challenging. The one thing to remember in real estate is that you cannot change the location. It is far better to buy land or a house in your preferred location than to buy what is available in an area you do not like. When our first child was born, we moved to a child-friendly neighborhood. Through the years, we have renovated every room in the house and also added on to our home. The house was far from perfect, but the neighborhood was just what we wanted.

The real estate market can be difficult, but FOMO shouldn't be the only reason you choose to buy or sell.

# **Catholic Journeys**

The business of coordinating pilgrimages to venerated Catholic sites around the globe ground to a halt in 2020, a unmitigated casualty of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The great news is that 16 months of pent-up demand for travel to Catholic sites will lead to an amazing rebound in 2021 and 2022, said Jimmy Hyland, owner of Catholic Journeys.

"Absolutely," Hyland said. But, there's a caveat. Pentup demand is meeting a slowly increasing supply of airline and hotel capacity.

"If people do want to go, they're going to need to decide early," Hyland said. "Even for some trips to the Holy Land in the summer of 2022, it's difficult to get additional space. That's because everyone got moved from

'20 to '21 and some even to '22, so availability is not the same.

"Also, a lot of aircraft were taken out of circulation and many pilots were furloughed. The light switch seems to have come on for travelers, but it's difficult to turn on the supply switch. It may take a while for capacity to catch up with demand."

Hyland used the painful, no-travel year to concentrate on rebuilding his own technology infrastructure.

He developed a new website - www.catholicjourneys. com - along with a new booking system that allows travelers to book directly. The system also accepts online payments, and Hyland is easily available now through email or chat functions on the website.

"You don't know what's going to happen until you march down that path," said Hyland. "The year enabled me to do things I wasn't previously able to do. And now, things are ramping up. Our first group leaves for Medjugorje on May 17. I was the last traveler home before we shut down, and I'll be the first one back out!"

There are no blanket protocols for resuming international travel, Hyland said.

"Right now there are only three places open for American travelers, and those are Guadalupe in Mexico, Greece and Medjugorje, and you only need a negative COVID test result," Hyland said.

"The Holy Land's official opening day is May 23. We had a group scheduled for that day, but we decided

because there's no sense in going to the Holy Land if many of the shrines are still closed."

#### Travel protocols vary

Hyland said travel to Western Europe is beginning to reopen, but the protocols are still unclear. No one knows if the European Union will act jointly to set up those protocols or if they will be established on a country-bycountry basis.

Vaccinations, for example, are required before entering France.

Hyland said German health officials were wise to push back the once-every-10-years Oberammergau Passion Play to 2022. There are a few spots left on the Clarion Herald's pilgrimage

to postpone it until July | (the hometown of Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos) and the shrines of Italy, set for June 15-28, 2022.

That trip will be led by four archdiocesan priests: Fathers Matthew Johnston, Ken Smith. Chris Zavackis and David Ducote.

Hyland said getting fully vaccinated is a personal decision, but for international travel, it can't hurt.

"I would recommend the vaccine if someone doesn't have another reason not to have it," he said. "What's required for international travel has been very fluid. The Holy Land requires it. but Medjugorje doesn't. If you want to access the world, the vaccination is the best way to go."

# **Notre Dame Health System**



Since Jan. 1, when he assumed the reins of Notre Dame Health System, Deacon Jeff Tully has navigated the numerous challenges brought on by the pandemic.

Notre Dame Health System is the agency of the Archdiocese of New Orleans that provides senior independent and assisted living apartments, skilled nursing, home health, home care and hospice services.

Now that the rate of vaccination of staff and residents has increased and the incidence of COVID-19 cases has declined, there is cautious optimism, especially about allowing family members to visit their older loved ones residing in the three archdiocesan facilities - Chateau de Notre Dame Apartments and Nursing Home in New Orleans, Wynhoven Health Care Center in Marrero and Our Lady of Wisdom Healthcare Center in Algiers.

#### Critical need for staffing

The biggest ongoing challenge, Deacon Tully said, is finding enough staff members for each facility, in part because of the economic reality that skilled nurses and other medical support personnel are in such high demand.

"My biggest challenge is that we need staff," said Deacon Tully, a former hospital administrator. "We need people. So we're going to have a whole new salary structure. We have to do that."

As an example, Deacon Tully said, LPNs (licensed professional nurses) and CNAs (certified

supply, meaning his facilities | Tully said. have had to contract with agencies to provide the care at a much higher cost. Sometimes the premiums include nearly double the normal salary.

"The needs are skyrocketing, and agencies are paying premiums for people to travel around the country for 13 weeks," Deacon Tully said. "All of our peers in health care are struggling with staffing. Staffing is a major issue in health care right now."

The archdiocese owns three nursing homes - Chateau de Notre Dame, Wynhoven and Our Lady of Wisdom - and there is room available at each facility because some families, since the start of the pandemic, are caring for their loved ones at home.

"People are keeping their parents and grandparents home and taking care of them because a lot of people lost their jobs and can't afford to

The irony is that contrary to the bad news coming out of New York and New Jersey at the start of the pandemic - where COVID deaths were extremely high – the nursing homes in the archdiocese have been incredibly safe for seniors.

#### Fantastic safety record

"Nursing homes, to be honest with you, are some of the safest places around because of the attention to detail," Deacon Tully said. "Ninety-four percent of our residents have received both vaccines, so it's a safe place. And, now, we are letting people come in to visit. We can get back to the normal of what it was pre-pandemic. You can come visit mom; you can come stay with mom. As the mandates are starting to ease off, you can start spending more time with mom. For a year, we couldn't do that."

Deacon Tully said Notre Dame Health's Catholic orientation shines through its stated mission logo: "Caring, Compassionate, Christlike."

"We have to be caring, we have to be compassionate and we have to be Christlike in everything we do," Deacon Tully said. "We ask ourselves whether every new process or policy or procedure is in line with that.

Besides nursing jobs, Deacon Tully said there are openings for van drivers, housekeepers, dietary personnel and staff members in payroll, internet services and human resources.

When the COVID-19 pandemic hit the U.S. last spring, almost all Catholic churches felt the effects of lockdowns and quarantines.

Many churches resorted to livestreaming Masses on their websites and social media platforms using iPhones and tablets as transmission devices. Fortunately for viewers in New Orleans, WLAE had set up video infrastructure many years ago to not only broadcast the daily Mass from St. Louis Cathedral on television but also livestream the Mass on the website, TheDailyMass. com, and on Facebook.
