### **SACRAMENTS**

**SPONSOR LETTERS:** Church law mandates that a sponsor for Baptism & Confirmation must be an active Confirmed Catholic. An active Catholic is a parishioner who is registered, attends Mass weekly, contributes to the support of the Church, is in a valid Catholic Marriage, & publicly leads a life compatible with Church teaching.

**We can only write letters of eligibility for parishioners who meet these criteria.**

### **BAPTISM:**

Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month at 12:30pm. **Baptism Classes are held the 3rd Wednesday of every month. All documents for Baptisms & Baptism classes for both Parents & Godparents must be received by the parish office no later than 2 weeks prior to the date of Baptism.** Please contact the Parish Office at (732) 283-2300 for all information and to make arrangements.

**Qualifications for Godparents & Confirmation Sponsors** - Must be at least 14 years of age, and have received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, & Confirmation. Must be an active Catholic who is registered in a Catholic Parish, attends Mass, supports the Church, and leads a life compatible with the teachings of the Church. We cannot write letters of eligibility if you do not meet all of these criteria. **Original Baptism and/or Confirmation certificates of both Godparents need to be brought in to the Parish Office.** These requirements are universal law of the church and are not differed by parish.

### **O.C.I.A.:**

The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which non-Catholics who are interested in becoming members of the Roman Catholic Church, and/or Catholics who wish to complete their initiation sacraments. For more information please call Sister Anna at (732)283-2816

### **MARRIAGE:**

Registered parishioners can make arrangements at least one year in advance of the proposed wedding date. The church must confirm the wedding date prior to making other wedding plans. Please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment with a priest in order to secure a date.

### **MINISTRY TO THE SICK OR HOMEBOUND:**

If any of your loved ones are in need of a priest and need the sacraments, please call the Parish Office any time. The priests are always on call! Regular communion calls to the sick, aged or homebound should be arranged in advance.

### Wedding Etiquette

Remember when entering the Church, for your rehearsal or wedding, it is a place of worship and proper reverence is expected at all times. All preparations and rehearsals will be carried out with the Priest who will officiate the wedding before the event.

**Floral Arrangements** cannot be placed in front of the altar. But may be placed on the sides, in front of the pulpit or somewhere else in the sanctuary. Tape, glue, putty, staples or wires may not be used on church pews to place flowers or ribbons.

**Other restrictions:** Rice, rose petals, confetti, bird seed or anything else that has residue are not allowed. Also, no pets are allowed with the exception of service animals.

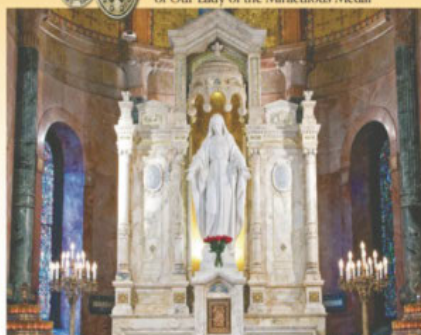

### The BASILICA SHRINE of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal



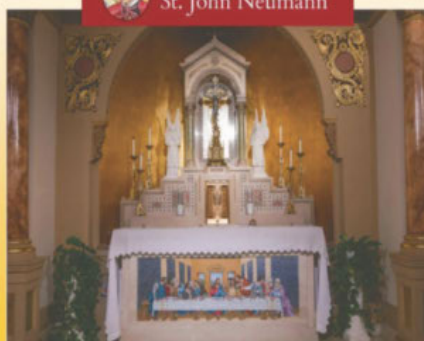
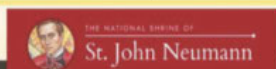

### *The Trinity: God's Love, Shared and Alive*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There was once a village nestled between three hills. In this village lived three brothers who had inherited a beautiful old house from their parents. The house was special; it had one lamp at the center, which lit up the entire place. But there was a problem. Over time, each brother started living on a different floor of the house, and each one wanted the lamp all to himself. The eldest said, "I am the oldest, I should have the lamp." The middle one argued, "I do most of the work in the house, I deserve it." The youngest said, "But I am the one who keeps us joyful, I need it too!" So, they began taking turns with the lamp. But when it was upstairs, the downstairs was in darkness. When it was in the basement, the upstairs was dim. They argued and grew apart. One day, a wise woman from the town visited and saw their trouble. She said, "Why not place the lamp back in the center, where it was meant to be? When the lamp is in the middle, it shines on everyone." So, they did. The light returned to the whole house, and so did peace among the brothers.

The story of the three brothers is a simple reflection of what we celebrate today: the Most Holy Trinity-Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Three persons, yet one God, living not in competition or isolation, but in perfect unity, love, and sharing. The Trinity is a mystery that we cannot fully understand. Scripture reveals it, and our lives depend on it. The first Person of the Trinity is God the Father, who created the world in love. In Genesis 1:1, the scripture reveals, "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." We are children of God who have God not a distant power but a loving father. The second Person of the Trinity is Jesus Christ, the Son, who shows us the Father and gives his life for us. Through the Son, we see how deep God's love is, not just powerful, but personal and sacrificial. In John 3:1, the scripture reveals, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." The third Person is the Holy Spirit, who comes to dwell within us. The Holy Spirit is not a vague force. He is God in us, helping us to pray, forgive, and grow. He convicts of sin, comforts, and enables our understanding of God's Word. When we feel peace after confession, courage in hardship, or joy in doing good, that is the Holy Spirit at work. As Jesus declares in today's Gospel, "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth" (John 16:13).

Further, Jesus tells his disciples that the Spirit will glorify him, and he will only speak what he hears from the Father. This is not confusion. This is harmony, each Person of the Trinity working with and through the other. Just like the brothers in our beginning story needed to stop pulling the lamp toward themselves and put it back in the center, we are reminded to put God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit at the center of our lives. When we try to live selfishly, pulling everything toward our own comfort or control, we lose the light of peace. But when we live in the image of the Trinity, sharing, listening, loving, our homes, our parish, our world, and our hearts are filled with light.

Three persons, yet one God, living not in competition or isolation, but in perfect unity, love, and sharing. How can we live the Trinity in our daily lives? In the family, parents can be like the Father, strong and loving. Children can be like the Son, obedient and joyful. Let the Holy Spirit guide our words so that peace reigns. Let our homes reflect the unity of the Trinity, not division. In the parish, we are many people with many roles; some sing, some clean, some teach, some pray, some guide. But we are one parish family. Let us avoid gossip, avoid jealousy, avoid competition, avoid working against each other, and work together in unity. In our world, we can be a sign of God's love, especially to the lonely, the forgotten, the poor. That is Trinitarian living. In ourselves, we are made in God's image. The Trinity is our identity. Let us make time for prayer (connection with the Father), service (walking with the Son), and inspiration (listening to the Holy Spirit).

Pope Francis writes, "The Trinity is not some abstract idea, but the real face of God, who is love... A family of three Persons who love each other so much that they are truly one." We can realize that the Trinity is not just a mystery to be studied, but a relationship to be lived. Like the lamp in the story above, when we let God shine at the center of our lives, we stop walking in darkness. Our families, our Church, our society, and our hearts are filled with divine light. God brings us into his divine life. Pope Benedict XVI reminds us that the Trinity is not far away from us. He writes, "The Christian God is not loneliness, but perfect communion... We are created in the image of this God of communion." This means we are not meant to live isolated lives. The Father created us, the Son redeemed us, and the Holy Spirit dwells in us; that is how close God is! When we forgive one another and support each other, we reflect God himself, because God is communion. When we serve in the church or receive the Sacraments, let us not think that we are just "doing church things." We are actually being drawn into the very life of God—a life of joy, love, and peace. St. John Paul II also notes that the Trinity is the key to understanding who we are as people. According to him, "Man cannot live without love. He remains a being that is incomprehensible for himself, if love is not revealed to him." Dear friends, we are made in the image of the Trinity, which means we are made for love. We are not just to receive it, but to give it freely. That is why selfishness, pride, and hatred make us feel so empty. And that is why mercy, generosity, and friendship bring us peace. May the grace of the Father, the love of the Son, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with us always. Amen.


