Sacraments

Sponsor Letter To be eligible as a sponsor, an individual must:

- Have received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation.
- Be an active Catholic who is registered at St. Cecelia Parish, attends Mass regularly, supports the Church, and leads a life in accordance with the teachings of the Church.
- If married, be in a valid Christian marriage that is recognized by the Church. We are only able to provide letters of eligibility for parishioners who meet all of the above criteria. Original Baptism and/or Confirmation certificates for both Godparents must be presented to the Parish Office. These requirements are universal laws of the Church and do not vary by parish.

First Holy Communion & Confirmation

The Order of Christian Initiation (O.C.I.A.)

OCIA is the process through which Non-Catholics who are interested in becoming members of the Roman Catholic Church and/or Baptized Catholics who wish to complete their Sacraments of Initiation are guided through prayer, instruction, and community support. Classes will begin the second week of September. For more information, please contact: Sister Anna at (732) 283-2816.

Marriage Preparation:

Registered parishioners may begin making wedding arrangements at least one year in advance of the proposed wedding date. Please note: The Church must confirm and approve the wedding date before any other wedding plans are finalized. To begin the process, please contact the Parish Office at 732-283-2300 to schedule an appointment with a priest and secure your date.

Wedding Etiquette

Remember, when entering the Church, for your rehearsal or wedding, it is a place of worship and proper reverence is expected at all times. All preparations and rehearsals will be coordinated in advance with the Priest who will be officiating the wedding.

Floral Arrangements:

*May not be placed in front of the altar.

*They may be placed on the sides, in front of the pulpit, or somewhere else in the sanctuary.

*Do not use tape, glue, putty, staples or wire on the pews to attach flowers or ribbons.

Additional Restrictions:

*Throwing rice, rose petals, confetti, bird seed, or any other materials that leave residue is not permitted.

*Pets are not allowed with the exception of service animals.

Ministry to the Sick or Homebound:

If a loved one is in need of a priest for the Sacraments, please contact the Parish Office any time at 732-283-2300. Our priests are always on call to serve those in need. For regular Communion, visits to the sick, elderly, or homebound, please make arrangements in advance through the Parish Office.

If you would like Fr. Deniskingsley or Fr. Ignatius to bless your home, please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment. This would be a wonderful opportunity for our Priests to meet with parishioners and for families to receive a special blessing!



Pastor's Weekly Digest



We are God's Living Temple

The Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, celebrated on November 9, is a special day in the life of the Catholic Church. It is not just a celebration of a building, but a celebration of the Church as the People of God. The Lateran Basilica in Rome is the cathedral of the Pope, the Bishop of Rome, and the mother and head of all churches in the world. This means it is the most important church building in the Catholic faith, even more than St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican. When we celebrate this feast, we are really thanking God for the gift of the Church and for the presence of Christ who lives among us.

Theologically, the dedication of a church signifies the sanctification of a space for divine worship, but even more profoundly, it points to the sanctification of the people who form the Church. St. Augustine explains that "What was done in the building of this temple is done in you spiritually. When you hear the word of God, you are hewn; when you believe, you are shaped; when you are baptized, you are built into the Lord's temple." Thus, the dedication of the Lateran Basilica is a celebration of both the visible Church and the invisible, spiritual temple that is the Body of Christ.

The readings for the feast remind us of what the Church truly is. The first reading from the prophet Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12 speaks of water flowing from the temple, bringing life wherever it goes. "Wherever the river flows, every living creature that swarms will live." This image shows that God's grace, like water, gives life to all who receive it. Just as a garden grows when watered, our faith grows when we stay connected to God's living water through his love and the sacraments.

The Responsorial Psalm (Ps. 46:2-3, 5-6, 8-9) says, "The city of God, the Most High, has its dwelling." It reminds us that God is with his people. We do not need to fear, because "God is our refuge and our strength, a very present help in trouble." This is like when a child feels safe knowing their parents are close. God's presence gives peace and courage to His children.

In the second reading, 1 Cor. 3:9-11, 16-17, Saint Paul teaches us that we ourselves are God's temple. He says, "You are God's building... Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" This means every Christian carries God's presence inside. The Holy Spirit lives in us and makes us holy. Just as we keep our homes clean and beautiful, we should also keep our hearts clean from sin. When we are kind, forgiving, and loving, we make our hearts a beautiful temple for God

The Gospel (John 2:13-22) tells how Jesus cleansed the temple in Jerusalem, saying, "Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!" He was angry because people were not treating the temple with respect. Jesus then said, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." He was talking about his own body, which would rise from the dead. This shows that Jesus himself is the true temple, the place where heaven and earth meet.

Therefore, the Lateran Basilica is a sign of all these truths. It stands for the unity of the whole Church. As St. Augustine said, "The temple of God is holy, and that temple you are." He explained that when we come together in love, we form a living temple where God dwells. The building itself is made of stone, but the real Church is made of people, including men, women, and children who believe in Jesus.

The Church Fathers often spoke about the meaning of church buildings. St. John Chrysostom said, "The church is not walls and roof, but faith and life." This means that a church building is holy because holy people gather there to pray. Pope Benedict XVI also said, "The feast of the dedication of the Lateran Basilica reminds us that the material temple is a sign of the living Church, which is the Christian community."

From the Tradition of the Church, we know that the Lateran Basilica was built by Emperor Constantine in the fourth century after Christianity was made legal. It was the first church building where Christians could worship freely. Its full name is the Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist at the Lateran. The Church celebrates this feast not only to honor the building but also to remind all Catholics that the Church is one family under one Shepherd, the Pope.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 756) teaches that the Church is "the dwelling place of God among men." The Lateran Basilica, as the mother church, is a visible sign of that truth. The Magisterium, or teaching authority of the Church, tells us that every church building is a "house of prayer," but the true temple is each baptized believer who lives in grace. While the Lateran Basilica stands in Rome, its significance extends to every local church. Its dedication is celebrated throughout the world because it represents the unity of all Catholic communities under the Pope, the successor of St. Peter. The universal observance of this feast expresses the truth that the Church, though diverse in languages and cultures, remains one in faith and communion.

In practical terms, the feast invites Catholics to reflect on three dimensions of ecclesial life. First is the Church as building. Every consecrated church building, like the Lateran, is a sacred space where heaven touches earth. Catholics are called to treat these places with reverence, recognizing them as houses of prayer. Second is Church as community. Unity and charity among believers are the true foundations of the Church. Acts of service, forgiveness, and fellowship are ways of strengthening this spiritual temple. Third is the Church as person. Each believer, as a temple of the Holy Spirit, must strive for purity of heart. Moral integrity and faithfulness to the Gospel ensure that the divine presence continues to dwell within us.

In our daily lives, we can live this feast in simple ways. For example, when we take care of our parish church by cleaning, decorating, or helping at Mass, we show respect for God's house. When we pray together as a family, we make our home a little church. And when we forgive someone or help a friend, we are building God's temple inside our hearts. In essence, regular confession, prayer, and acts of charity are like renewing the foundation of that temple. Neglect, on the other hand, leads to decay. The Feast of the Lateran Basilica thus serves as an annual "spiritual renovation," calling the faithful to recommit themselves to holiness. Think of a time when you helped someone who was sad or lonely. In that moment, you were being God's temple by bringing his love to another person. Just like water from the temple in Ezekiel's vision gave life to everything it touched, our kindness can bring life to those around us.

In the end, this feast is not only about remembering a church in Rome but also about renewing our faith. It invites us to ask: "Is my heart a place where God feels at home?" The Lateran Basilica stands as a sign that Christ wants to live in each of us. As Pope Francis once said, "Each of us can become a small temple of the Lord through love, prayer, and forgiveness." The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica reminds us that the Church is alive wherever love and faith are present. We are the living stones, and together we form the house of God.

So, when we celebrate this feast, we thank God for his Church on earth and for making his home in us. Let us care for our hearts as holy places, respect our churches as God's dwelling, and bring his presence wherever we go. In doing so, we make the words of Scripture come alive, "The waters of the river gladden the city of God, the holy dwelling of the Most High" (Ps. 46:5). As St. Leo the Great proclaimed, "The temple of God, which is the Church of Christ, is built of living stones. It grows as new members are added, and it is not finished until the end of time." The Lateran Basilica reminds us that the Church is both ancient and ever new, rooted in apostolic tradition yet continually renewed by the Spirit. May we always remember that we are God's living temple, and through our lives, may his love flow like a river to all the world.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO



El pasaje del Evangelio nos presenta otra imagen de la hermosura y santidad del templo: "Jesús purifica el templo, y lo hace con el látigo en la mano. Se pone a expulsar las actitudes paganas, en este caso, de los mercaderes que vendían y habían transformado el templo en pequeños negocios. Jesús purifica el templo reprendiendo: 'Está escrito: mi casa será casa de oración, no de otra cosa'. El templo es un lugar sagrado. Y nosotros debemos entrar allí, en la sacralidad que nos lleva a la adoración. No hay otra cosa. Hay dos templos: el templo material, lugar de adoración y el templo espiritual dentro de mí donde mora el adoración, y el templo espiritual dentro de mí, donde mora el Espíritu Santo" (Papa Francisco).




