Sacraments

Sponsor Letter To be eligible as a sponsor, an individual must:

- Have received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation.
- Be an active Catholic who is registered at St. Cecelia Parish, attends Mass regularly, supports the Church, and leads a life in accordance with the teachings of the Church.
- If married, be in a valid Christian marriage that is recognized by the Church. We are only able to provide letters of eligibility for parishioners who meet all of the above criteria. Original Baptism and/or Confirmation certificates for both God-parents must be presented to the Parish Office. These requirements are universal laws of the Church and do not vary by parish.

First Holy Communion & Confirmation

To enroll your child, please contact Sister Anna (732) 283-2816.

The Order of Christian Initiation (O.C.I.A.)

O.C.I.A. is the process through which Non-Catholics who are interested in becoming members of the Roman Catholic Church and/or Baptized Catholics who wish to complete their Sacraments of Initiation are guided through prayer, instruction, and community support. Classes will begin the second week of September. For more information, please contact: Sister Anna at (732) 283-2816.

Marriage Preparation:

Registered parishioners may begin making wedding arrangements **at least 1 year** in advance of the proposed wedding date. **Please note:** The Church must confirm and approve the wedding date **before** any other wedding plans are finalized. To begin the process, please contact the Parish Office at 732-283-2300 to schedule an appointment with a priest and secure your date.

Wedding Etiquette

Remember, when entering the Church, for your rehearsal or wedding, it is a place of worship and proper reverence is expected at all times. All preparations and rehearsals will be coordinated in advance with the Priest who will be officiating the wedding.

Floral Arrangements:

*May not be placed in front of the altar.

*They may be placed on the sides, in front of the pulpit, or somewhere else in the sanctuary.

*Do not use tape, glue, putty, staples or wire on the pews to attach flowers or ribbons.

Additional Restrictions:

*Throwing rice, rose petals, confetti, bird seed, or any other materials that leave residue is not permitted.

*Pets are not allowed with the exception of service animals.

Ministry to the Sick or Homebound:

If a loved one is in need of a priest for the Sacraments, please contact the Parish Office any time at 732-283-2300. Our priests are always on call to serve those in need. For regular Communion, visits to the sick, elderly, or homebound, please make arrangements in advance through the Parish Office.

If you would like Fr. Deniskingsley or Fr. Ignatius to bless your home, please call the Parish Office to schedule an appointment. This would be a wonderful opportunity for our Priests to meet with parishioners and for families to receive a special blessing!

Beloved and Sent

Today, with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, the Church brings the Christmas season to its close. From the manger of Bethlehem to the waters of the Jordan, we have journeyed with Christ. From the mystery of God-with-us to the revelation of who Jesus truly is, we have celebrated this holy season. Christmas does not simply end; it reaches its fulfillment. The child laid in the manger is now revealed as the beloved Son of the Father, sent into the world for our salvation.

The Gospel (3:13-17) presents a powerful and humble moment. Jesus, who is without sin, steps into the Jordan and asks to be baptized by John. John hesitates, yet Jesus insists, not because he needs repentance, but because he chooses complete solidarity with us. In those waters, heaven is opened, the Spirit descends like a dove, and the Father's voice is heard, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." This mystery is not only a revelation about Jesus; it is a revelation about God's way of acting. God's way of doing things through humility, love, and closeness to his people.

The first reading from the prophet Isaiah (42: 1-4, 6-7) helps us understand this moment more deeply. Isaiah speaks of the servant of the Lord, chosen and upheld by God, one upon whom the Spirit rests, sent to bring justice, hope, and light to the nations. In the Baptism of Jesus, the Church recognizes the fulfillment of this promise. Jesus is the servant who does not break the bruised reed or quench the smoldering wick. He enters the waters gently, not to condemn, but to restore sinners.

The second reading from the Acts of the Apostles (10:34-38) reminds us that God shows no partiality. Peter proclaims that Jesus was anointed by the Holy Spirit and went about doing good, healing all who were oppressed. Baptism, therefore, is not an isolated event in Jesus' life; it is the beginning of his public mission. From the Jordan, he steps into the world to serve, to heal, and to save people.

This single theme, "beloved and sent," is also the heart of what baptism means for us as Catholics. In our own baptism, we were plunged into Christ's life, death, and resurrection. We, too, were named and claimed by God. The same words spoken over Jesus are, in a real and profound way, spoken over each of us. God says to us, "You are my beloved son; you are my beloved daughter." Baptism is not just a ritual from our past; it is our deepest identity.

But baptism does not end with being loved by God. It continues with being sent into the world by him. Just as Jesus emerged from the Jordan and began his mission, so we are sent from the waters of baptism into the world. We are sent to live as children of light, to act with compassion, to seek justice, and to bear witness to Christ in our families, workplaces, and communities. Baptism commissions us to make our lives a reflection of the love we have received.

As we close the Christmas season today, the Church invites us not to pack away the mystery, but to live it. The same Jesus who was born for us at Christmas now stands among us, calling us to remember who we are and who we are as God's own and his people. May this feast renew in us a deep gratitude for our baptism. May we live each day as beloved children of the Father, strengthened by the Spirit, and sent to bring Christ to the world.



RECEIVING THE HOST IN YOUR HAND

- ◆ Extend both hands palms up toward the Priest/Eucharistic Minister, placing one hand directly on top of the other hand.
- ◆ The Priest, Deacon or Eucharistic minister will hold the Host in front of you and say, "The Body of Christ".
- ◆ The correct response is simply "Amen". No other response should be said.
- ◆ The Priest, Deacon or Eucharistic minister will then place the Host on your open palm.
- ◆ **Do not attempt to grab the Host with your fingers.**
- ◆ Once the Host has been placed in your hand, immediately consume the Host as you stand facing toward the altar.

RECEIVING THE HOST IN YOUR MOUTH

- ◆ After the Priest, Deacon or Eucharistic minister holds the Host in front of you and says "The Body of Christ," you respond Amen.
- ◆ Tilt your head backwards, open your mouth, and stick out your tongue.
- ◆ The Priest, Deacon or Eucharistic Minister will then place the Host on your tongue.
- ◆ Once you feel the Host on your tongue, take the Host into your mouth with your tongue.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

- ◆ "Both children and adults can make a spiritual communion. They may come forward with their arms crossed and bow before the Eucharist.

SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In the Catholic Church, you can receive the **Anointing of the Sick** (often called "**Last Rites**") **multiple times**, as it's not limited like some sacraments; you can receive it if you recover and become gravely ill again, or if your condition worsens during the same illness, and it's also for serious surgeries or frailty in old age. The "Last Rites" are actually a combination of sacraments (Anointing, Confession, Viaticum) given when death is near, but the core Anointing sacrament itself can be repeated whenever there's a serious need.

A family may not reserve both intentions at the same Mass as part of their two weekend limit.*
