Jesus is really present in the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist

In our faith we're to believe that during the consecration of the bread and wine is to become the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. For 70% of Catholics, they believe that when they receive communion the host and wine are the **symbolic representation** of Jesus's body and blood.

So, what happens prior to when Father takes the host which is made of wheat flour and water. The main protein in wheat flour is Gluten. However during the Consecration the host is transformed into the Body of our Lord Jesus Christ. This is what we've been taught and is one the critical elements of our faith.

How can we help the 70% that either don't know or believe this is the actual body and blood of our Lord?

Jesus taught us and provided many miracles in His lifetime. His teachings continue as well as miracles to help us better understand our faith and more strongly reaffirm it.

Using a number of Eucharistic Miracles, we can scientifically prove that the host that was made of wheat is transformed into the body and blood of our Lord.

There are many Eucharistic Miracles here is just one.



In a church in Buenos Aires on the evening of August 18, 1996, a woman approached Fr. Alejandro Pezet as he was finishing the distributing of Holy Communion to tell him that she had found a "discarded host" on a candleholder at the back of the Church. Fr. Pezet went over and put the host reverently into a container of water and placed it in the tabernacle—a practice which would have allowed the host to

dissolve, and then the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink found in the sacristy). However, eight days later, when he opened the tabernacle, Fr. Pezet was shocked to see that the host had turned into a bloody substance.

He told Cardinal Bergoglio, who asked that the host be photographed. For *several years*, the host was kept secretly in the tabernacle. Finally, when the host had still not shown any signs of decomposition, the Cardinal decided to have it analyzed.

A sample was sent to New York and the team of scientists was *not given any information* about the substance.



One of the scientists was Dr. Frederic Zugiba, who testified that the substance was real flesh and blood and that:

“The analyzed material is **a fragment of the heart muscle (myocardium) found in the wall of the left ventricle close to the valves.**

This muscle is responsible for the contraction of the heart. It should be borne in mind that the left cardiac ventricle **pumps blood to all parts of the body.**

The heart muscle is in an inflammatory condition and contains a large number of white blood cells. This indicates that **the heart was alive at the time the sample was taken.**

The proteins found in the heart tissue and the blood are specific in nature and function and are clearly different from the Gluten protein which is in the original making of the host.

The blood type was AB positive which is the universal blood type which all other blood types can receive.

It is my contention that the heart was alive, since white blood cells die outside a living organism. They require a living organism to sustain them. Thus, their presence indicates that the heart was alive when the sample was taken. What is more, these white blood cells had penetrated the tissue, which further indicates that **the heart had been under severe stress, as if the owner had been beaten severely about the chest.”**

Examples of other Eucharistic miracles go back to 750 AD and when this sample was analyzed in 1970 the scientific results were exactly the same findings as we have just heard.

By the way, one of the tests performed on the Shroud of Turin showed that the blood type was AB positive.
