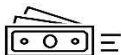

MONEY MATTERS



Cathedraticum . - noun. A sum of money paid by parishes within the diocese to underwrite diocesan wide expenditures.

Since the late 1800's, this calculation has been traditionally known as an assessment proportional to the annual income of a parish.

Currently, each parish in the Diocese is required to remit 11% of its annual collections to the Diocese of Worcester. During our last fiscal year, St. Anthony of Padua's assessment amounted to \$22,193.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

For over 38 million Americans, there is a thin line between eviction and home, between hunger and health, between unemployment and work, between anxiety and stability. This line is the Poverty Line. Nationally, for a family of four, that line is \$25,750 a year.

Since 1969, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has addressed poverty by attacking its causes and funding community projects that promote independence as a means of finding a permanent end to poverty. That's why the CCHD theme is "Help Those on the Margins." This collection is the primary source of funding for CCHD's anti-poverty grants and education programs.

This year, *seventy-five percent of the collection will stay here in our diocese*. Each November I meet with our parish and community groups which receive local grants from the previous year's collection. It is always inspiring to see how these small grants blossom into effective programs to support the dignity of people who find themselves most often on the margins. Given our economy's high inflation rate, the need has increased dramatically in the many food pantries and emergency assistance programs in our parishes and Catholic agencies which receive support from our local CCHD funds.

Please help the efforts of CCHD to break the cycle of poverty. We are "working on the margins" in Central Massachusetts and across America. **Support the CCHD Collection on November 18 & 19 as a response to the Seventh Annual World Day of the Poor that Sunday** as called for by our Holy Father.
