St Elizabeth Anne Seton Society - Consecration Anniversary

Some Facts

- 1. After Elizabeth sailed to Italy with her husband and eldest daughter, her husband died of tuberculosis.
- 2. She was a widow at age 29, penniless and raising 5 children, two of whom died at a young age. While in Italy, Elizabeth visited Catholic Churches.
- 4. She eventually felt called to convert to Catholicism seeing the faith in action through family friends.
- 5. She became Catholic because....she came to believe in the Real Presence ...She had a devotion to our Blessed Mother.
- 6. And she was convinced that the Catholic Church was truly apostolic, linking back to the apostles and to Christ Himself as the founder.
- 7. In March 1805 she entered the Catholic Church.
- 8. She was rejected by many family and friends because of her decision to become Catholic.
- 9. Elizabeth opened a school in Baltimore to support her children.
- 10. Elizabeth's sister-in-law also became Catholic and together they started the first Sisters of Charity community in the U.S. in 1809 in Emittsburg, Maryland.



ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON

Her Life:

Elizabeth Ann Bayley was born in New York City on August 28, 1774 to a prominent Episcopal family, and lost her mother at the age of three. In 1794, at the age of 19, Elizabeth married William Magee Seton, a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. William died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving Elizabeth a young widow. After discovering Catholicism in Italy, where her husband had died, Elizabeth returned to the United States and entered the Catholic Church in 1805 in New York. After a number of difficult years, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph's, the first community for religious women established in the United States, education in the United States.

- 11. The Sisters of Charity was the first first congregation of religious sisters to be founded in the United States.
- 12. Its school was the first free Catholic school in America.
- 13. This humble beginning marked the start of the Catholic parochial school system in the United States.
- 14. The Sisters of Charity focused on education, children and the poor.
- 15. Elizabeth Seton was called Mother Seton.
- 16. Mother Seton established the first Catholic orphanage in the country, Saint Joseph's Asylum in Philadelphia.
- 17. She also established schools in and around Emittsburg, Maryland.
- 18. Her favorite prayer was Psalm 23.
- 19. She died of tuberculosis on January 4, 1821 at the age of 46.
- 20. Elizabeth Ann Seton's remains are entombed in the National Shrine of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton in Emmitsburg, Maryland.

She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, planting the seeds of Catholic education in the United States. Her legacy now includes religious congregations in the United States and Canada, whose members work on the unmet needs of people living in poverty in North America and beyond.

Mother Seton, as she is often called, was canonized on Sunday, September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI. She was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "Saint." Her remains are entombed in Emmitsburg in the Basilica at the National Shrine that bears her name.

Her Relic:

The Relic that was placed in our altar on January 4, 2020 was donated by Tom and Mary Lou Smith, who are parishioners here at St. Anthony of Padua. These faithful parishioners appreciate the prompt and tireless work the different ministries do here, especially the society of St. Elizabeth Seton.

Let us all rejoice in the Lord for the great example He has given to us in the person of St. Elizabeth, and also in our sisters who consecrate themselves to this beautiful ministry as we pray:

You blessed Elizabeth Seton with gifts of grace; As wife and mother, educator and foundress, So that she might spend her life in service to your people.

Through her example and prayers May we learn to express our love for You In love for our fellow men and women.

CALENDAR YEAR vs FISCAL YEAR

A **calendar** year for income and expense recording is 12 consecutive months beginning January 1st and ending December 31st of each year. A **fiscal** year represents 12 consecutive months ending on the last day of any month except December.

St. Anthony of Padua follows the fiscal year reporting like that of the Worcester Diocese - which is September 1 through August 31.

Every summer, the Finance Ministry (along with Father Daniel) reviews all revenue and expense trends for the current fiscal year (ending August 31) and establishes a new budget for the upcoming new fiscal year (beginning September 1).

Following the completion of our fiscal year on August 31, a summary of St Anthony's Revenue, Expenses and Profit and Loss is furnished to the Diocese of Worcester.


