Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This past Friday, our nation celebrated its 249th Anniversary. On that first Independence Day, July 4th,1776, the Second Continental formally adopted the Declaration of Independence, declaring the Thirteen American Colonies independent from Great Britain. The American Revolutionary War was fought from 1765 until 1783. General George Washington was the commander of the Continental Army and successfully executed the war against the British. The Treaty of Paris was signed in 1783 officially ending the War. The Treaty recognized the United States' independence and sovereignty. The Treaty of Paris brought the end of British colonial rule and established the world's first federal republic based on the consent of the governed.

Next year, America will celebrate its 250th, it's "Semiquincentennial " Anniversary. During this year there will be many opportunities to honor the founding of our country and to reflect upon the gifts of liberty and freedom. As citizens of the American Republic, I hope the anniversary will help to heal the divisions in our society.

Since most Americans have little knowledge of our history this might be an excellent opportunity to remedy that situation. The historian, Rick Atkinson, is presently writing a three volume series on the American Revolution. The First book entitled, "The British Are Coming: The War for America, Lexington to Princeton, 1773 -1777", is an excellent introduction to the beginnings of the revolution. The second volume, "The Fate of the Day: The War for America, Fort Ticonderoga to Charleston, 1777 -1780". This volume details General Washington's struggles, diplomatic efforts in France, and pivotal battles from Brandywine to Charleston. The third volume in the Trilogy will be published next year to coincide with the 250th Anniversary of America.

The Anniversary of our founding is an excellent opportunity to read about our history and to visit some of the historical sites right here in New Jersey.


Celebrate Life - A Morning for Grandparents & Seniors (55+)

I wonder what would happen if I took a decade of the rosary and said one Hail Mary, ten Glory Be's and ended with the Our Father?
