Monday, August 15, 2022: The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary:

- NOT OBLIGATORY THIS YEAR because it falls on a Monday

- Thursday, Dec. 8: 5:30 pm @ Esmond; 7:00 pm @ Maddock

Sunday, December 25, 2022: CHRISTMAS

- Saturday, Dec. 24: 4:00 pm @ Fessenden
6:00 pm @ Esmond
8:00 pm @ Maddock
- Sunday, Dec. 25: 9:00 am @ Fessenden

Sunday, January 1, 2023: Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God

- Saturday, Dec. 31: 5:00 pm @ Fessenden
- Sunday, Jan. 1: 8:30 a.m. @ Esmond, 10:45 a.m. @ Maddock

*If the Saturday Vigil Mass is the last day of the month and the Sunday is the first day of a new month, then the Saturday Vigil Mass applies to the new month since it fulfills the Sunday obligation. For example, Saturday, April 30th is the last day of the month and Sunday is May 1st, therefore the schedule for that Saturday Vigil would fall under the May times, and not the April times.
