

2025 LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

Bishop Checchio has approved this year's Lenten Obligations

- 1. The days of both fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday (March 5) and Good Friday (April 18).
- 2. The other Fridays of Lent (Mar. 7, 14, 21, 28; April 4, and 11) are days of abstinence.
- 3. Fasting in the Roman Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal with two smaller meals which together do not equal the size of your full meal. The obligation of fasting applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.
- 4. Abstinence in the Roman Catholic tradition means to abstain from eating meat (beef, chicken, pork, turkey, etc.). The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14.

Course mandated by the Catholic Dioceses of New Jersey for their volunteers including all groups meeting on Catholic properties or sponsored by Catholic institutions. This course meets requirements for 3 hours professional development credit.

To view a list of all diocesan PGC classes and preregister please log onto www.virtus.org, then select Registration/ View a list of Sessions/ Metuchen, NJ Diocese, then Immaculate Conception Annandale so that adequate materials and set up can be arranged. For persons required by the Catholic Church to take the course computer registration is mandated.

These programs are open to anyone interested in learning about child abuse and most particularly, child sexual abuse, in the United States. The primary purpose is to arm_volunteers with the knowledge necessary to keep children safe, to identify persons and practices that represent a threat to children, to understand legal obligations and pitfalls and to change caring adults' behavior in ways that will make it more difficult for predators of children to succeed. Additionally, the new fifth edition/2022 version, discusses internet/cyber issues impacting our youth with advice to parents on how to protect their children.

The Protecting God's Children program is restricted to adults who are defined as persons over 18 who have graduated from high school; however, some classes have a special teen leader section available upon advance discussion with the instructor.

Attendees are asked to arrive on time and remain the entire class to receive credentials for attendance. No children are permitted present.

Although teaching "Catholic" policies the program material is both universal and <u>ecumenical</u>; <u>aimed</u> at all who honor a duty to God, family and community. The trainer for ICC is Nora Burke Klippstein (Pah.trained@gmail.com).

The <u>www.virtus.org</u> website is a valuable resource for anyone interested in keeping all children from age 0 to 18 safe. Check it out for a course preview.



They are really confusing... they were talking the other day about Catholic *dogmas* and I thought I might be able to meet some of them, but apparently that wasn't what I thought it was supposed to be either. I can't believe that I am almost 9 months old! I have really enjoyed my time here at Immaculate Conception, the people are wonderful, the kids are energetic, the deer and geese help me run and keep in shape and oh my goodness... the smells are out of this world... I am really looking forward to next weekend's pancake breakfast and the fish fry. I hope to see you around campus; until then be a good boy.

From the Pastor's Desk

I love the first reading this week from 1 Samuel. David was anointed and chosen by God to take over as king from Saul who had lost God's favor during his kingship and Saul is now pursuing David and wants to kill him. Our reading finds David and his men able to catch Saul sleeping, yet although it is within David's power, he does not kill him. He recognizes that, despite his differences with Saul and his desire to kill David, David knows that Saul still was anointed by God to be king. He recognizes the goodness of God's chosen one and decides to let him go. How many of us would do the same thing? The Lord said at David's anointing that he possessed a heart like his and he proves it here. Jesus speaks in Luke's Gospel: "love your enemies and do good to those who hate you." In a world that has become more polarized, this is unheard of, it truly is counter-cultural to think in this way, especially today. All of us are anointed at our Baptism and Confirmation, we are all chosen by God and yet, all of us are still sinners as well. To hold that person's sin against them while looking past our own and those who think like us accomplishes nothing, even sinners do the same. We are called to forgive those who trespass against us. "For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you." It takes the Grace of God to be able to look beyond our own desires and pride in these situations. Yet our Lord challenges us nonetheless. Take this last week and a half before we get into the Lenten Season to contemplate what you are going to be giving up or taking on during our journey into the Wilderness. All of us our sinners and all have work to do, but let today's Gospel instructing us to love our enemies really sink in; the world in general can use more dialogue, understanding and love. Our goal shouldn't be annihilation of our enemies, but helping each other see where each can grow and thrive.


