

BAPTISM & CONFIRMATION SPONSOR

It is a great honor to be selected as a Godparent or Sponsor, but it is not just a title for the Catholic Church.



According to Canon Law: "a person to be baptized is to be given a sponsor who assists an adult in Christian initiation or together with the parents presents an infant for baptism. A Sponsor also helps the baptized person to lead a Christian life in keeping with baptism and to fulfill faithfully the obligations inherent in it."

Certificates of Eligibility for sponsorship for Baptism or Confirmation will be given **only to active** (weekly Mass attendance) **registered** parishioners of ICC. Qualified members should use the QR code.



DON'T BE FOOLED

If you ever get a suspicious email from Fr. Keith or anyone from ICC,

We do not use our personal email addresses and we never solicit funds via email or text. 

> In this novel, the author tells a beautiful and haunting story centered around forty-two year-old



Q: Why do we place ashes on our forehead?

A: Ashes are rich in spiritual symbolism. We recall in the second chapter of Genesis, when the human person is fashioned "out of the dust of the ground" and receives the breath of life (Genesis 2:7). In death, a person returns to the ground from which we came. The ancient Hebrews used ashes as a sign of repentance, reminding themselves that God is God and we are not.

As the minister places ashes on our forehead, we hear either "remember that you are dust and unto dust you shall return" or "turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel." When we receive ashes, we remember our own mortality. We're reminded that we have limited time on this earth and we ought to make the best use of it that we can! We all need to continually rediscover the love of God. The forty days of Lent are the perfect time to assess our own awareness of these realities. ©LPi

2025 LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

Bishop Checchio has approved this year's Lenten Obligations

- 1. The days of both fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday (March 5) and Good Friday (April 18).
- 2. The other Fridays of Lent (Mar. 7, 14, 21, 28; April 4, and 11) are days of abstinence.
- 3. Fasting in the Roman Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal with two smaller meals which together do not equal the size of your full meal. The obligation of fasting applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.
- 4. Abstinence in the Roman Catholic tradition means to abstain from eating meat (beef, chicken, pork, turkey, etc.). The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Stations of the Cross will be prayed every Friday at 7:00 PM in the Church. Friday, March 7th will be led by Fr. Keith and he will be utilizing *The Way of the Cross with text from Scripture by St. Alphonsus Ligouri.*

TENEBRAE TALKS

I went to the groomer for the first time this week. It was a little scary... I never had been before and there were all these other dogs there... would they be my

friends or should I just run away and be safe? I didn't want to go in the front door despite the nice lady. Why couldn't I just keep the way I smelled? It really only affected me, right? Boy, was I wrong. It was wonderful to get all nice and clean and to get my nails trimmed. I feel so much better now, I don't know what I was afraid of... I still will play outside and get dirty, but it feels so good to be clean and shiny. I hear Fr. Jose and Fr. Keith talking about humans being worried about Confession, maybe that is kind of the same thing... well, take it from me, no matter how dirty or smelly you are, don't worry, just go, you will be glad you did... Be a good boy!

From the Pastor's Desk

Many of you know that I love Star Wars and one of my favorite lines comes from the original movie. As Han Solo is complaining about getting caught by the empire, he calls Obi-Wan Kenobi an old fool. And Obi-Wan simply retorts: "Who is the more foolish? The fool or the one who follows him?" This week in Luke's Gospel, Jesus asks if a blind person can guide a blind person. He is not talking about permanent blindness, but something that is temporary and can be fixed, but can cause a great deal of distress as we have not really learned how to live with this condition. As we begin Lent this week, our eyes focus on the sin that Jesus would ultimately die for - our sin. Whether we were led astray by some fool (but who really is the more foolish?) or are stumbling around because of our sinfulness; the answer seems to be to take the opportunity, compose yourself and practice prayer, fasting and almsgiving to get to our goal of heaven and lead others there as well.

It is a time to get back to the simpler things, strip away the stuff that accumulates in our life to lead us away from God and take on new tasks that build a stronger relationship with Him. During Lent this year, I am going to have a Prie Dieux (kneeler) out in front of the altar to focus praver on the Tabernacle and Cross. I hope it will stand as a reminder during the Lenten Season as an invitation to come closer to our Lord and focus solely on Him. Outside of Mass feel free to come in at any time and reflect. Some individuals have also asked to utilize it for receiving our Lord in the Eucharist and I invite those people who would like to, to do so. Simply kneel and myself or a Eucharistic Minister will go to the kneeler to allow you to receive. Please know this is a work in progress, just like all of us are, so what works in my mind may not be practical. Hopefully in growing closer to God this Lent, we can heal whatever may blind us and be less foolish in the future when it comes to sin.






