

BAPTISM & CONFIRMATION SPONSOR

It is a great honor to be selected as a Godparent or Sponsor, but it is not just a title for the Catholic Church. According to Canon Law: "a person to be baptized is to be given a sponsor who assists an adult in Christian initiation or together with the parents presents an infant for baptism. A Sponsor

also helps the baptized person to lead a Christian life in keeping with baptism and to fulfill faithfully the obligations inherent in it."

Certificates of Eligibility for sponsorship for Baptism or Confirmation will be given **only to active** (weekly Mass attendance) **registered** parishioners of ICC. Qualified members should use the QR code.

an effect on our beliefs. Lent is a time in which we focus on prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Focusing on the Tabernacle, the Crown of Thorns, the Desert or the Corporal and Spiritual works of Mercy, will remind us of the journey we are undertaking this Lent. It should remind us as we are fed by the Eucharist, we are called to go beyond the walls of the Church to practice those works of mercy as Christ did. We also pray the Confiteor as a community - listing the different kinds of sin we seek forgiveness for, we use the Apostle's Creed and the Eucharistic Prayers for Reconciliation to both simplify our thoughts and get to the core of our beliefs as Christians. We hope this makes your Lent more powerful.

As a deacon. I traveled to Rwanda with Catholic Relief Services as part of their Global Fellows Program. A great deal of our time was spent discussing the Rwandan Genocide and the attempted recovery of civility after it. At a number of memorials there was a banner that read: "If you knew me, and you really

knew yourself, you wouldn't have killed me." Almsgiving during Lent is an invitation to meet the other, to listen to their story, share yours and grow in our humanity. Rice Bowl helps the mission of CRS & fosters this kind of dialogue; please consider participating.

TENEBRAE TALKS



The other day someone asked me what I am giving up for Lent... I don't want to give up anything... well, maybe that leash thingy. I need my ball, and that ball, and that ball, but then I

saw a commercial for dogs who don't even have owners! I brought my ball to Fr. Keith & dropped it in his lap... I want to give that ball to those dogs who have less than me; you all gave me these great things, and I am thankful for that, but please don't get mad; I gave them away. Be a good boy!

From the Pastor's Desk

I have seen a variety of deserts in my life, Egypt, New Mexico, Nevada, some beautiful, others frightening. It's hard to imagine spending 40 days in the desert like Jesus let alone the 40 years that the Israelites traveled through the Wilderness to get to the Promised Land, yet here we are, limiting the amount we carry so we may survive this journey and get to the true Promised Land of Heaven.

In Luke's Gospel, after Jesus is Baptized but before he begins his public ministry, he goes out into the desert to be tempted by Satan. Satan continuously offers Him things of the world - food; power and fame as well as the riches that go with it; and then safety. If it is not a direct temptation by Satan, then he encourages Jesus to use His power to get the things a human being would desire. How is Satan trying to tempt you in using your time for things that would probably ultimately bring you farther from God? Those things sound good, right? Why should we suffer in this world? Doesn't God want us to be happy? There is a difference between being happy and being joyful. We are called to unite our suffering to Christ, who also suffered in loving each one of us. The second temptation is all about that - Christ would be the ruler of the Earth, but without the suffering - yet without it He loses His purpose, which isn't to be a great man who is followed but to open the doors of paradise for us through His sacrifice.

Christ doesn't promise a world without suffering for us; He promises to walk through it with us. I often think about the Stations of the Cross and how Christ is humiliated, needs help, and falls three times. He knows the difficulties that occur in our lives but He encourages us to keep going, to get up every time we fall down; to accept help when it is offered to us and to not seek the things of the world since those are not the things that endure. This Lent, go with Jesus into the desert, walk the road to Calvary with Him and don't give into temptation. You will be one step closer to Heaven when these 40 days are done, and what more can you hope for?
