



From the Pastor's Desk


It is not often that we get to celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul on a Sunday. These two great saints didn't always agree, however, it is only through their faith and ministry that the Church is what it is today. Arguably, the two greatest Apostles, share a feast day and represent two sides of our Church: those who have been born into the faith and those who are converted to know Christ later on their journey. We are always called to conversion and reform even if we have walked with Christ from the very beginning.

Next week, I will be going on my annual Canonical retreat. We are required by Canon Law to take a retreat every year. It serves as a reminder that although priests serve God and pray often, we still need time to go away and allow God to work in us so that His will might be better accomplished in His work through us. It is a call to further conversion, we are only human. Like Peter, at one moment we are very in tune with the Holy Spirit and everything is great and in another moment we act as obstacles to the Lord's will because we think we know better. Our Lord knows this about us and gives us numerous opportunities to strengthen our relationship with Him. Please pray for me and know that I will be praying for you!

In a little over a month, Seminarian Kevin will be heading off with our seminarians and some priests for the Diocesan Quo Vadis Adventure Retreat for young men. I highly recommend our young men to take this time to say yes to God for a few days. As we celebrate St. Peter today, I thought the question Peter asked our Lord would be a great question to ask ourselves: "Quo Vadis?" or "where are you going?" Peter asked this well after Jesus' earthly life—he had a vision when he was leaving Rome of Jesus walking towards it. The interaction with Christ made him turn around and go back. Rome would be the site of the martyrdom of both Peter and Paul. Each one of us, are called on a journey, and the Lord wants to walk that journey with us. As followers of Christ, we too must die to ourselves. Saints Peter and Paul were not perfect, far from it, but they knew that the path Jesus laid before them was the path that they had to take. May we have the courage to do the same.
