

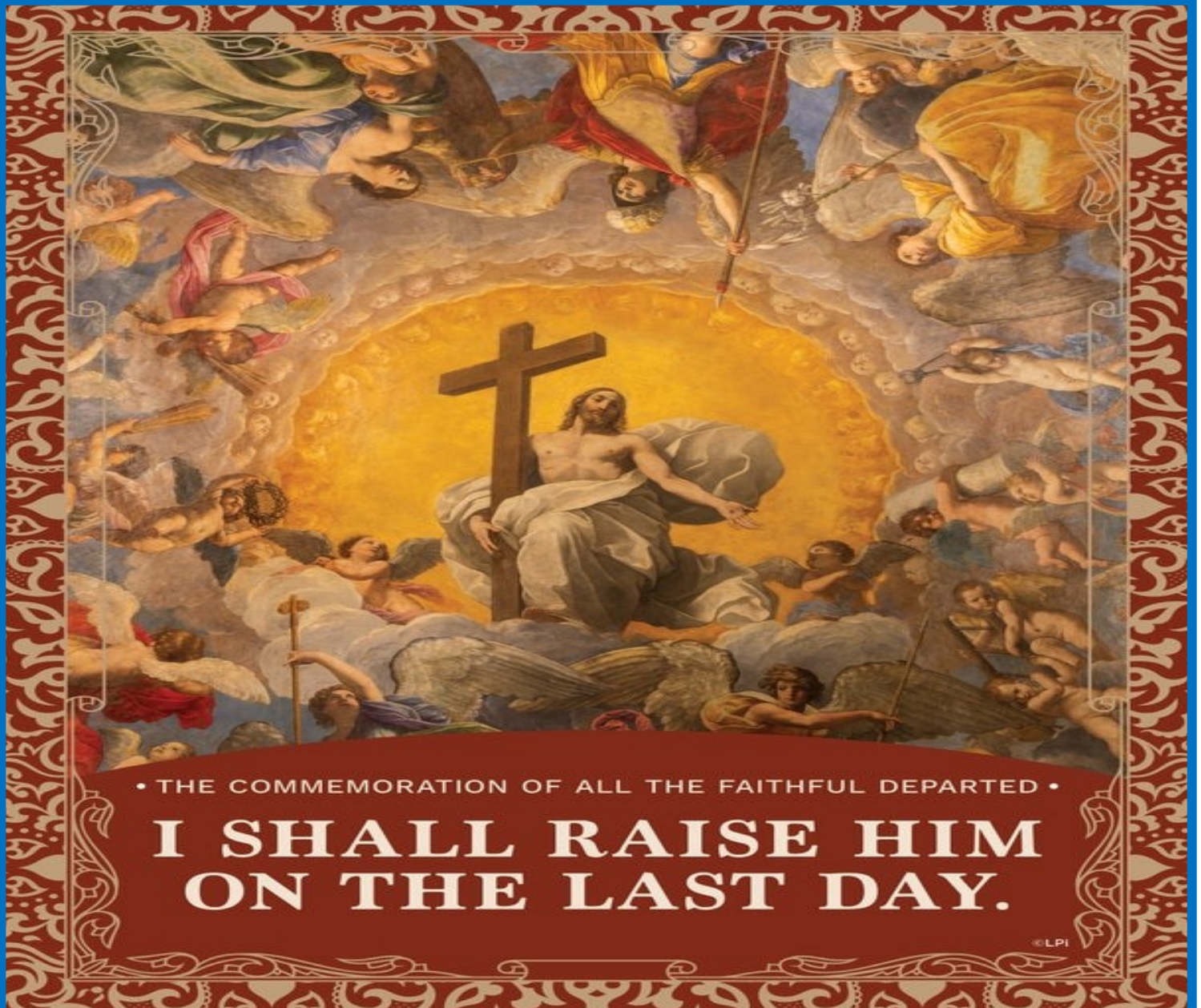

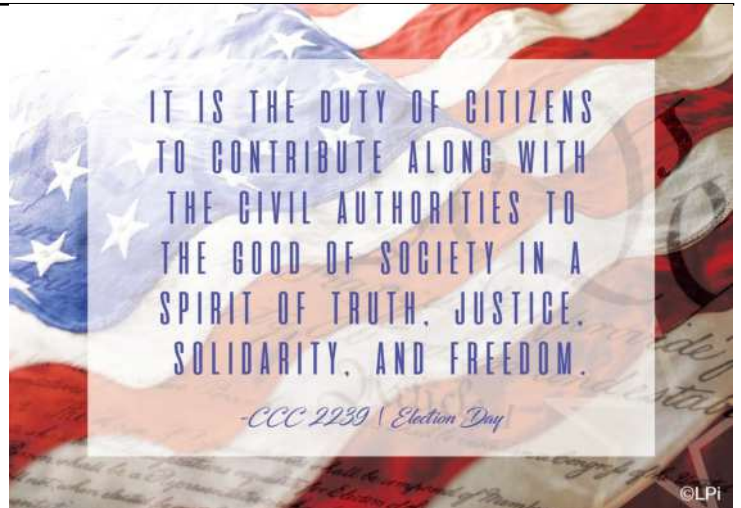
CHRISTMAS CONCERT TICKETS ON SALE!

ALL SOULS' DAY NOVENA

It may seem strange to pray for someone who is already dead and who, according to our earthly reckoning of time, has already undergone judgment. But God is not subject to the constrictions of time as we understand them. Our prayers for the dead are, like our prayers for the living, an expression of charity and the unity that exists between all members of the Body of Christ. Prayer for the dead is a practice which not only predates Catholicism but predates Jesus Christ, as we see in the Second Book of Maccabees (2 Maccabees 12:42-45).

"By virtue of the 'communion of saints,' the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers, especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf," says the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1055).

The most common Catholic prayer for the dead is as follows: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace." ©LPi

The Trustees and the Finance Council met this week, and our annual report will be issued shortly. Thank you all for your support of our parish and school!

From the Pastor's Desk

On November 1st, we had a Mass of Farewell for Bishop Checchio at the Cathedral and there have been a number of other events to thank the Bishop for his 9 years of service to our Diocese. He will have a Mass of Welcome in the Archdiocese of New Orleans on November 18 and many people have asked me: "when will we know who our new Bishop will be?" or "What happens now?" Most likely, we will not know about the new Bishop for a few months (although we could know before this article is even printed or it could be longer), that is up to Rome, but Bishop Checchio at the Convocation said his best guess was in the Spring.



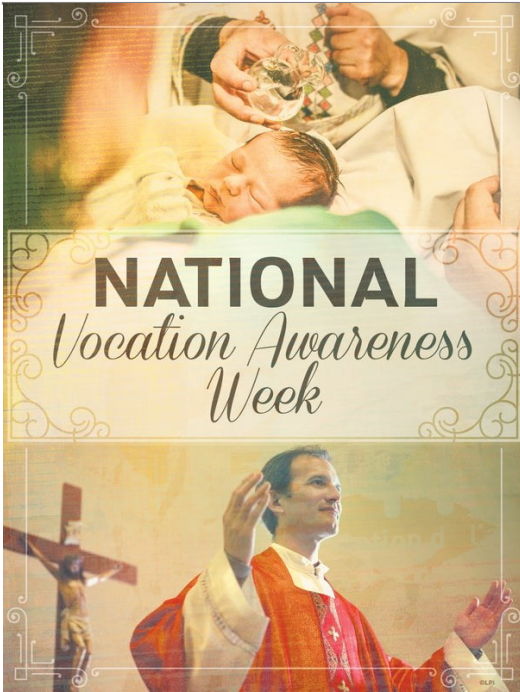
Once the Bishop takes possession of his new position in New Orleans (Nov 18) -

our Diocese is vacant and the Holy Father, through our Apostolic Nuncio, has indicated that the College of Consultors should vote for a priest to serve as administrator of the diocese until the Holy Father chooses a new bishop. The College of Consultors is an appointed advisory council of priests from the Presbyteral Council (our diocese has 12) that Canon Law stipulates every diocese must have; they are elected to five year terms. These priests were seated in the sanctuary at the Bishop's Mass of Farewell. The College has eight (8) days to hold the election. This process is very similar to what happens in a Conclave. The priest must be at least 35 years old, but does not need to be from the College of Consultors or even the Diocese of Metuchen. Canon 428 states "when the see is vacant, no innovation is to be made." The day to day operations of the Diocese will continue.

This is an interesting moment within our young diocese as it is only the second time the College has been asked to name an administrator (For the historians: Msgr. John Szymanski was named the administrator of the diocese from July to December 1986). As we pray for the Bishop as he takes on this new role in New Orleans, I ask that you also pray for the College of Consultors and our diocese during this time of transition.

NATIONAL VOCATIONS AWARENESS WEEK



This week is National Vocations Awareness week, please pray for those who might be called to the Diocesan Priesthood or Religious Life as well as our Seminarians, Priests, Religious and those preparing or discerning a vocation to Marriage or the Diaconate. Many individuals may not see themselves as priests because they feel they are unworthy and can use encouragement from others to see the seeds God has planted in them. The Diocese has started the *Called By Name* program for you to recommend young men who you see the potential of a vocation in, so that we might pray for them and help them to discern where God might be calling them. Especially this week think and pray about who God might be calling in your own life.... It might even be you! There is no obligation, and being nominated here does not guarantee that a man will be accepted into formation to become a priest nor does it constitute proof that a man has a vocation to the Priesthood; it is just a tool for us to pray and assist young men to answer that call that each should consider at some point in their life. Our Vocation is not "What is God calling me to do?" it is focused on "how is God calling me to love?" and God calls each of us to love in a unique way.

DEACON MICHAEL CONTINUING TO FOLLOW GOD'S CALL TO GROW

We are happy to announce that Deacon Michael has been accepted to the Mepkin Abbey Institute for Contemplative Leadership. Founded by the Trappist monks of Mepkin Abbey, South Carolina, the Institute calls forth and deepens the skills for contemplative leaders with the goal of forming local contemplative communities. These communities will provide a spiritual forum for those seeking a deeper relationship with God and who desire a more contemplative way of life. The program includes several trips to Mepkin Abbey, a beautiful 3000 acre property in Moncks Corner, South Carolina, as well as monthly Zoom meetings with Institute members. Please keep Deacon Michael in your prayers as he begins this new chapter of his vocation journey.
