REVEREND KRZYSZTOF KACZYNSKI, 1964-2025

On November 5, ICC mourned the loss of our former parochial vicar, Reverend Krzysztof Kaczynski who served here from 2002-2009. We are joined in prayer with his current parishes of St. John Neumann, Califon, and St. Joseph, High Bridge who have lost their pastor, as well as St. Matthew, Edison, St. Edward the Confessor, Milford, and Our Lady of Victories, Baptistown where he also served. Fr. Kris' funeral was this Saturday, November 16, and he was laid to rest in our cemetery mausoleum. Please visit him and say a prayer. We will also be having a Mass of Remembrance in the new year with Msgr. Andy which will be announced once it is finalized. The following is but a small tribute to a priest who meant so much to so many.

It is hard to put into words the depth of my gratitude and love for my dear friend, Father Kris. He was a prayer warrior, a theologian, and my role model. His devotion to our Blessed Mother was steadfast and inspiring. Like Mary, his soul truly magnified the Lord. Father Kris had a gift for finding humor in every circumstance, reminding us that joy and holiness go hand in hand.

What impressed me most about Father was his ability to live life authentically—without pretense, without attachment to material things. He was both intelligent and humble, grounded in truth and simplicity. During his time as a missionary in Africa, he learned the beauty of living with little. He would often share stories of their evacuation drills—times when they practiced leaving with only the bare necessities. That experience shaped his heart. Father Kris became a minimalist by vocation, choosing to hold fast not to possessions, but to people. His greatest treasures were the relationships he nurtured and the time he gave so freely. As he loved to say, "Your presence is my present."

Father Kris lived the Gospel with joy and authenticity. His life echoed the words of Micah: "To act justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God." He taught me that holiness is found in simplicity, and that love—when given freely and without expectation—is the purest reflection of Christ's heart.

They say the people we hold closest are the ones who teach us the most. Father Kris taught me what it truly means to live a faithful, humble, and joy-filled life. His shared experiences, laughter, his wisdom, and his unshakable faith will remain with me always.

As I remember him, I pray that the Lord welcomes him into eternal peace and joy, and that our Blessed Mother wraps him tenderly in her mantle. May we honor his legacy by living as he did—with faith that never falters, love, and hearts always open to God's will. May his spirit continue to guide us, and may his blessings always be upon us. Godspeed, Father. May the angels lead you into paradise! ~Connie Fortunato, Principal

Many of my memories of Fr. Kris revolve around food, Florida, Africa & Polish Christmas cards. He was a quiet, humble priest, whose sheepish smile and quick wit endeared him to everyone he met. He loved fish, pork chops, sharing stories about his time in Africa and spending as much time as possible in Florida, which he referred to as the promised land. On one occasion after celebrating the noon Mass at IC he got in his car and headed south. At 8 AM Monday morning he showed up at our home in Venice with a box of donuts. He drove all night, stopped to have breakfast with us and headed off to Miami on the other coast to stay with other friends. He was a wonderful priest, a good friend, and I will miss receiving his Polish Christmas cards each year.

WE REMEMBER FR. KRIS

Fr. Kris came to Immaculate Conception in June 2002. He arrived by bus from the Newark area and I picked him up at the Clinton Town Bus Stop. Our inaugural Parish Festival was in fullswing. As we were driving up St. Mary's Hill we noticed the tall Ferris wheel and other rides. I turned to him and said, smiling, "Kris, this is all for you! 'Witamy!'" (Polish for "Welcome"). He looked at me said something like, "My goodness!," knowing that I was being humorous. After we took his luggage into the Rectory we chatted for a few minutes. He did not want to rest, but rather walk around the festival grounds parking lot and greet the people. It was his first day at ICC and his first desire was to meet the people, not knowing then who was or wasn't an ICC parishioner. Walking around the parking lot would be an almost daily evening activity for him during the seven years he ministered with me at ICC. In one hand was the Rosary.

We enjoyed numerous conversations. Many were theological in nature. He held a doctorate degree in sacred theology, so I was no match for him! (He never "showed off.") Conversations were also light-hearted, and sometimes self-effacing. When entering the Rectory through the side door and he saw me sitting in the parlor, he usually announced: "It's me" or "I am here." When I would depart on my annual 10-day Caribbean cruise, I reminded him to take good care of the parish. His usual reply, "I am here." His culinary tastes were not complicated. Therefore, he ate my uncomplicated cooking. He enjoyed my beef pot roast and barbecued pork spare ribs. On rare occasion, he sipped one glass of wine. It was always Kendall Jackson Chardonnay.

When Fr. Kris began his first pastorate a short time after he left ICC, his "thank you" comments after Communion included the concelebrating clergy. When introducing me he said, paraphrasing, "This is Fr. Andy Szaroleta from Immaculate Conception. We lived in the same house for seven whole years! And, look, we are still friends!!" Fr. Kris and I remained friends until his untimely passing. We did not communicate with regularity via telephone, email, or text. But we always remembered each other on personal dates, that is on our birthday, priesthood anniversary and feast day. As Fr. Kris' soul approaches the Pearly Gates, I imagine him calling out to St. Peter, "It's me." "I am here."

I was blessed to work with Fr. Kris in both the parish and the school. He was the most grounded priest I knew. He always surprised us with his amazing understanding of theology and his willingness to share and explain, opening the scriptures for us. He was the priest that started the Divine Mercy prayer service that we continue today. What a blessing!

Fr. Kris loved to joke. He recently told me that the social group for bereaved members at St Joe's was better than the sharing group we have at ICC. After chuckling, he agreed with me that both are important. One of my most fond memories was when I was an administrator at ICS and some of my grandchildren were students. I said I was lucky to see them every day and he shared that his grandmother made his lunch every day. I thought he was talking about at home but it turned out that she was the lunch lady at his school.

My husband Tom, also had a great affection for Fr. Kris. Even though he had not been at our parish for quite a few years, I was so touched when he came to concelebrate Tom's funeral. Fr. Kris will indeed be missed by so many of us who he ministered to. We were blessed to know him and we surely loved him! May he rest in peace!







From the Pastor's Desk

In these last days of Ordinary Time along with the first days of Advent, we hear the Scriptures take a bit of a darker tone often dealing with end times. This can be disconcerting for many, however, it is a part of our life. All things of this world eventually come to an end, often much sooner than we would like. I spoke about this during my homilies this week remembering Fr. Kris, how he would often say to me when I saw him at a gathering of priests or spoke with him on the phone: "Please come." This open invitation to be a part of his life is something that I (and many of us, I believe) often take for granted. We tell others that we are far too busy or that now is just not the right time. It might even become just a convenient excuse that we use without thinking or checking our schedule. If these readings or the regrets of letting those invitations go unanswered cause us to be uneasy, perhaps it is God's way of reminding us of the importance to just say yes to others and to Him.

Especially during this preparation time for the upcoming holiday season, our Lord asks us to "please come," just like the shepherds and the wise men were called to come. Yet, they were called to see not a great theologian to speak the answers of life, but simply to stand in the presence of a baby. Not all conversations with a priest need to be about the great questions of life, much of our ministry is simply meeting people where they are. Some of my favorite conversations with Fr. Kris were about hockey and how New Jersey was playing, hope they can keep this start up and win another Cup for him this year.

Whether it is to Eucharistic Adoration, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3PM, being a missionary, living a Christian lifestyle of service to the less fortunate, loving your family or simply sharing a cup of coffee and a smile with an old friend, our Lord continues to say "Please come." Come as you are, as He made you, with the hope that time with Him is never wasted and will only lead to a desire to know and love Him more. We only have a limited amount of time, but that should not make us anxious. We should be encouraged to make the most of each and every day. Made in God's image, each of us is called to be a missionary disciple bringing Christ to others; this is why we come and go. Pax et bonum,


